ASX ANNOUNCEMENT

LCT complies with ASIC infringement notice

18 December 2015 – Sydney, Australia & Auckland, New Zealand – Living Cell Technologies Limited has complied with an infringement notice from Australian Securities & Investments Commission related to an alleged contravention of its disclosure obligations under ASX listing rules in connection with the NTCELL[®] Clinical Study in Parkinson's Meets Endpoints announcement made on 15 June 2015.

The company planned to release the announcement to ASX on 15 June, after trade in the company's ADRs had ceased on OTCQX on 12 June so as not to pre-empt trade on ASX and prior to the release of the results to the Congress of Parkinson's Disease Movement Disorders in California. ASIC considered that the information should have been released earlier.

The board considers it in the best interests of the company's shareholders not to contest the issuing of the infringement notice, to pay the penalty of \$33,000 and focus on completing the planned Phase IIb clinical trial of NTCELL in Parkinson's disease and then applying for provisional consent to treat and charge patients.

The issuing of an infringement notice, and subsequent satisfaction of it, is not an admission of liability, nor does it represent a finding that the Corporations Act has been breached.

Living Cell Technologies Limited (LCT) is an Australasian biotechnology company improving the wellbeing of people with serious diseases worldwide by discovering, developing and commercialising regenerative treatments which restore function using naturally occurring cells.

LCT's lead product NTCELL[®] is an alginate coated capsule containing clusters of neonatal porcine choroid plexus cells. After transplantation NTCELL functions as a biological factory producing factors to promote new central nervous system growth and repair disease induced nerve degeneration.

The Phase I/IIa NTCELL clinical trial in New Zealand for the treatment of Parkinson's disease met the primary endpoint of safety and showed encouraging clinical efficacy improvements. Results from this trial will be used to design a larger Phase IIb trial to evaluate its potential as a disease-modifying treatment for patients with Parkinson's disease. It has the potential to be used in a number of other central nervous system indications such as Huntington's, Alzheimer's and motor neurone diseases.

LCT's proprietary encapsulation technology, IMMUPEL[™], allows cell therapies to be used without the need for co-treatment with drugs that suppress the immune system.

LCT holds a 50% interest in Diatranz Otsuka Limited which is developing a cell therapy for type 1 diabetes.

LCT is listed on the Australian (ASX: LCT) and US (OTCQX: LVCLY) stock exchanges. The company is incorporated in Australia, with its operations based in New Zealand.
