PROPOSALS FOR RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS, GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SECURITIES, AMENDMENTS TO THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to (i) the re-election of Directors; and (ii) the grant of general mandates to the Directors for the issue and the repurchase of the Company's securities up to 20% and 10% respectively of the aggregate nominal amount of the Company's issued share capital as at the date of passing of such resolutions, and the extension of the general mandate to the Directors to issue Shares to include the aggregate nominal amount of such securities repurchased under the repurchase mandate; and (iii) the proposed amendments to the Articles of Association.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Board consisted of nine Directors, namely Mr. Wu Qin, Mr. Wu Zhihong, Mr. Huang Chao, Mr. Xie Yunfeng, Ms. Sun Xinglai, Mr. Liu Zhiyong, Mr. Qu Jiguang, Mr. Leung Chong Shun and Mr. Chow Kwok Wai.

Pursuant to Article 86(3) of the Articles of Association, the Directors shall have the power from time to time and at any time to appoint any person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy on the Board or as an addition to the existing Board. Any Director so appointed by the Board shall hold office only until the next following annual general meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re-election.

Accordingly, all the existing Directors, being Directors appointed by the Board, will hold office only until the AGM and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the AGM.

Article 88 of the Articles of Association provides that no person other than a Director retiring at the meeting shall, unless recommended by the Directors for election, be eligible for election as a Director at any general meeting unless a written notice signed by a Shareholder (other than the person to be proposed) duly qualified to attend and vote at the meeting for which such notice is given of his intention to propose such person for election and also a written notice signed by the person to be proposed of his willingness to be elected shall have lodged at the head office or at the registration office of the Company provided that the minimum length of the period, during which such notice(s) are given, shall be at least seven days and that (if the notices are submitted after the dispatch of the notice of the general meeting appointed for such election) the period for lodgment of such notice(s) shall commence on the day after the dispatch of the notice of the general meeting appointed for such election and end no later than seven days prior to the date of such general meeting.

Accordingly, if a Shareholder wishes to nominate a person to stand for election as a Director at the AGM, notice of his intention to propose such person for election as a Director and the notice executed by the nominee of his willingness to be elected must be validly served at the Hong Kong branch share registrar and transfer office of the Company, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, at Shops 1712-16, 17th Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong on or before 10 April 2006.

Biographical details of the retiring Directors are set out in Appendix I to this circular. If a valid notice from a Shareholder to propose a person to stand for election as a Director at the AGM is received after the printing of this circular, the Company will issue a supplementary circular to inform Shareholders of the details of the additional candidate proposed.

None of the retiring Directors is entitled to receive any bonus for the year of 2005.

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SECURITIES

On 16 October 2005, resolutions in writing were passed by the Shareholders to approve, inter alia, the grant of (i) a general unconditional mandate authorising the Directors to allot, issue and deal with Shares with an aggregate nominal value not exceeding the sum of 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue immediately following the completion of the Share Offer and the Capitalisation Issue (excluding any Shares which may be issued upon the exercise of the Over-allotment Option or options which may be granted under the Share Option Scheme) ("Existing Issue Mandate"); and (ii) a general unconditional mandate authorising the Directors to repurchase Shares not exceeding 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue immediately following the Share Offer and the Capitalisation Issue (excluding any Shares which may be issued upon the exercise of the Over-allotment Option or options which may be granted under the Share Option Scheme) ("Existing Repurchase Mandate").

New general mandates to allot, issue and deal with the Shares up to a maximum of 20% and to repurchase Shares up to a maximum of 10% ("Repurchase Mandate") respectively of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolutions as set out in Resolutions 6A and 6B respectively of the AGM Notice will be proposed at the AGM. Resolution authorising the extension of the general mandate to the Directors to issue Shares to include the aggregate nominal amount of such securities (if any) repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate (up to a maximum of 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the resolution) as set out in Resolution 6C of the AGM Notice will be proposed at the AGM.

With reference to the proposed new general mandates, the Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plans to issue or repurchase any new Shares pursuant to the relevant mandates as at the date of this circular.

AMENDMENT TO THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

one-tenth of the total sum paid up on all shares conferring that right; or (v) by any Director or Directors who, individually or collectively, hold proxies in respect of Shares representing 5% or more of the total voting rights at such meeting as required by the Listing Rules.

Mr. Chow has worked in Price Waterhouse, which is now known as PriceWaterhouseCoopers and accumulated valuable audit experience. Mr. Chow received his Bachelor's degree in Social Sciences from the University of Hong Kong in 1990. He is a Fellow Member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants and a Fellow CPA of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Mr. Chow has over 10 years of experience in accounting financial management and corporate finance.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Chow had no interest in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO nor had he any relationship with any Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date. This Appendix contains the particulars that are required by the Listing Rules to be included in an explanatory statement to enable the Shareholders to make an informed view on whether to vote for or against the resolution to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the proposed Repurchase Mandate.

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company was HK\$29,050,000 with 290,500,000 Shares in issue. Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the proposed mandate to repurchase its own securities and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the AGM, the Company will be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 29,050,000 Shares, representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution, during the period ending on the earlier of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by law or the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by a resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

REASONS FOR REPURCHASES OF THE COMPANY

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole for the Directors to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase its securities in the market. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value of the Company and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Any repurchase of securities of the Company made pursuant to the proposed Repurchase Mandate would be made out of funds which are legally available for the purpose in accordance with the memorandum and articles of association of the Company, the Listing Rules and applicable Cayman Islands laws. Under the Cayman Islands law, repurchases by the Company may only be made out of profits of the Company or out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of shares made for the purpose of the repurchase or, subject to the statutory test of solvency, out of capital. The premium, if any, payable on the repurchase, shall be provided for out of profits of the Company or from sums standing to the credit of the share premium account of the Company or, subject to the statutory test of solvency, out of capital.

The Directors have no present intention to repurchase any Shares and they would only exercise the power to repurchase in circumstances where they consider that the repurchase would be in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders and in circumstances where they consider that the Shares can be repurchased on terms favourable to the Company. The Directors anticipate that if the general mandate to repurchase securities were to be exercised in full at

the currently prevailing market value, it may have a material adverse impact on the working capital and gearing level of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2005). The Directors do not propose to exercise the mandate to repurchase securities to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.
