Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjournment thereof (as the case may be) if you so wish.

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PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES FOR THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

In view of the ongoing COVID-19 epidemic and recent requirements for prevention and control of its spread (as per guidelines issued by the Hong Kong government at <https://www.coronavirus.gov.hk/eng/index.html>), the Company will implement necessary preventive measures at the AGM to protect attending Shareholders, proxy and other attendees from the risk of infection, including:

- (i) Compulsory body temperature check will be conducted on every Shareholder, proxy and other attendees at the entrance of the AGM venue. Any person with a body temperature of over 37.2 degrees Celsius may be denied entry into the AGM venue or be required to leave the AGM venue.
- (ii) Attendees are required to prepare his/her own surgical face masks and wear the same inside the AGM venue at all times, and to maintain a safe distance between seats.
- (iii) No corporate gifts will be distributed and no refreshments will be served.

To the extent permitted under law, the Company reserves the right to deny entry into the AGM venue or require any person to leave the AGM venue in order to ensure the safety of the attendees at the AGM.

In the interest of all attendees' health and safety, the Company wishes to advise all Shareholders that physical attendance in person at the AGM is not necessary for the purpose of exercising voting rights. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with the information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to, among others, (i) the re-election of retiring Directors; (ii) the Issue Mandate; (iii) the Buy-back Mandate; (iv) the Extension Mandate and (v) the refreshment of Scheme Mandate Limit. The AGM Notice is set out from pages 20 to 24 of this circular.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Article 110 of the Articles provides, among others, that the Directors shall have power from time to time and at any time to appoint any qualified person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the Board. Any Director so appointed shall hold office only until the next following general meeting of the Company (in the case of filling a casual vacancy) or until the next following annual general meeting of the Company (in the case of an addition to the Board), and shall then be eligible for re-election.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Article 120 of the Articles provides that subject to the manner of retirement by rotation of Directors as from time to time prescribed under the Listing Rules, at each annual general meeting of the Company, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three, then the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office such that each Director (including those appointed for a specific term) will be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years at the annual general meeting. A Director retiring at an annual general meeting shall retain office until the close or adjournment of the relevant annual general meeting.

Pursuant to Article 110 of the Articles, Mr. Cheng Lut Tim and Mr. Lam Yau Fung, Curt shall retire by rotation and being eligible, offer themselves for re-election as Directors at the AGM.

Pursuant to Article 120 of the Articles, Mr. Chong Kok Leong and Mr. Choy Hiu Fai, Eric shall retire by rotation and, each being eligible, offer themselves for re-election as Directors at the AGM.

Particulars of the retiring Directors are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND BUY-BACK SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 15 June 2020, the Shareholders passed the ordinary resolutions on granting the existing general mandates to the Directors to allot, issue and deal with Shares and to buy-back Shares. Such mandates will expire at the conclusion of the AGM. At the AGM, ordinary resolutions will be proposed to grant the Issue Mandate, the Buy-back Mandate and the Extension Mandate.

The Issue Mandate

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed to the Shareholders to consider and, if thought fit, approve the Issue Mandate which will enable the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to allot, issue and otherwise deal with new shares of the Company not exceeding 20% of the total number of Shares in issue at the date of passing of such resolution.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue comprised 523,330,908 Shares. Assuming that there is no change in the issued number of Shares during the period from the Latest Practicable Date to the date of passing the resolution approving the Issue Mandate, the maximum number of Shares which may be issued pursuant to the Issue Mandate will be 104,666,181 Shares.

The Buy-back Mandate

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed for the Shareholders to consider and, if thought fit, approve the Buy-back Mandate which will enable the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to buy-back Shares up to 10% of the aggregate number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing of such resolution. The Company's authority is restricted to buy-back Shares in the market in accordance with the Listing Rules.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue comprised of 523,330,908 Shares. Assuming that there is no change in the issued number of Shares during the period from the Latest Practicable Date to the date of passing the resolution approving the Buy-back Mandate, the maximum number of Shares which may be bought back pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate will be 52,333,090 Shares.

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, an explanatory statement containing all the information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to approve the Buy-back Mandate is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

Both of the Issue Mandate and the Buy-back Mandate will expire at the earliest of:

- (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; or
- (b) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles or any applicable law of Hong Kong to be held; or
- (c) when revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in a general meeting prior to the next annual general meeting of the Company.

The Board considers that the grant of the Issue Mandate and Buy-back Mandate shall increase the flexibility in the Company's affairs and are in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole, and that the same shall continue to be adopted by the Company.

General Extension Mandate to Issue Shares

An ordinary resolution will be proposed at the AGM to extend the Issue Mandate by the addition to the total number of Shares which may be allotted or agreed conditionally or unconditionally to be allotted by the Directors pursuant to such general mandate representing the total number of Shares that bought back by the Company pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate, provided that such extended amount shall not exceed 10% of the total number of issued Shares at the date of passing of that resolution.

REFRESHMENT OF SCHEME MANDATE LIMIT

The Board proposes to seek the approval of the Shareholders to refresh the Scheme Mandate Limit. Under the existing limit of the Share Option Scheme, the Directors were authorized to grant options to subscribe for up to 230,650,281 Shares, representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the annual general meeting of the Company held on 25 May 2018. Apart from the Share Option Scheme, the Company has no other share option scheme in force.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

During the period from 25 May 2018 to the Latest Practicable Date, the Scheme Mandate Limit has been refreshed once. As disclosed in the circular and the announcement of the Company dated 15 May 2020 and 15 June 2020 respectively, an ordinary resolution was passed by the Shareholders at the annual general meeting of the Company, held on 15 June 2020 (“2020 AGM”) in which the maximum number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all share options that may be granted under the refreshed Scheme Mandate Limit was 372,498,811 Shares, being 10% of the Shares in issue as at 15 June 2020. Subsequently the Share Consolidation took place and the Scheme Mandate Limit was reduced to 37,249,881 Shares.

Note: On 19 June 2020, 116,203,500 share options were granted to Directors and Employees at an exercise price of HK\$0.066 per Share under the Scheme Mandate Limit with an exercisable period from 1 January 2021 to 31 December 2025. As set out in the Company’s announcements dated 24 August 2020 and 14 December 2020, the exercise prices and the total number of share options outstanding were adjusted accordingly as a result of the Share Consolidation and completion of rights issue transaction on 14 December 2020. With effect from 14 December 2020, the exercise price of share options outstanding was adjusted to HK\$0.656 per Share and the total number of share options outstanding was adjusted to 11,683,849, of which 560,908 share options were lapsed. The remaining 11,122,941 share options remain outstanding as at the Latest Practicable Date.

Since the adoption of the Share Option Scheme and up to the Latest Practicable Date, there are 11,122,941 share options granted but yet exercised were outstanding, representing approximately 2.13% of the total number of Shares in issue.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company had an aggregate of 523,330,908 Shares in issue and the remaining Scheme Mandate Limit of 26,126,940 Shares represents only approximately 4.99% of the issued share capital of the Company.

Since the date of refreshment of Scheme Mandate Limit at the 2020 AGM, the Company had increased its total number of issued Shares pursuant to the completion of rights issue transaction on 14 December 2020, a refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit would increase the total number of Options that the Directors may grant under the existing Share Option Scheme.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

The purpose of the Share Option Scheme is to enable the Company to grant options to selected Eligible Participants as incentives or rewards for their contribution to the Group and/or to enable the Group to recruit and retain high calibre employees and attract human resources that are valuable to the Group and any Invested Entity. The Board believed that the inclusion of employee, non-executive director and shareholder of Invested Entity and holder of any securities issued or proposed to be issued by Invested Entity; and any other person (including any consultant, adviser, distributor, contractor, supplier, agent, customer, business partner, joint venture business partner, promoter or service provider of any member of the Group) is appropriate given that the success of the Group requires the co-operation and contribution from persons who play a role in the business of the Group. All of the above mentioned eligible participants are stakeholders of the Group whose quality of performance, service, product or advice (where appropriate) might directly or indirectly affect the operation and performance of the Group. The Eligible Participants will be determined, in the Board's sole discretion, with reference to their potential and/or actual contribution to the business and benefits of the Group.

The Board considers that it is in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole to grant the refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit so as to provide the Company with greater flexibility in granting share options to Eligible Participants of the Company under the Share Option Scheme as an incentive to recognize their past contributions and to encourage the Eligible Participants to achieve long term performance targets set by the Group and at the same time allows the Eligible Participants to enjoy the results of the Company attained through their efforts and contribution.

Pursuant to the Share Option Scheme and in compliance with Chapter 17 of the Listing Rules, the Company may refresh the Scheme Mandate Limit by ordinary resolution of the Shareholders at a general meeting provided that the maximum number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all share options to be granted under the Share Option Scheme and any other share option schemes of the Company shall not exceed 10% of the Shares in issue as at the date of passing the relevant resolution at the general meeting. Any share options previously granted under the Share Option Scheme or any other share option schemes of the Company (including those outstanding, cancelled, lapsed or exercised in accordance with the terms of the Share Option Scheme or any other share option schemes of the Company) shall not be counted for the purpose of calculating the Scheme Mandate Limit as refreshed.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, pursuant to the Listing Rules, the maximum number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all outstanding share options granted and yet to be exercised under the Share Option Scheme and any other share option scheme(s) of the Company must not in aggregate exceed 30% of the total number of the Shares in issue from time to time. No share option shall be granted under any share option scheme(s) of the Company if this will result in the 30% limit being exceeded.

On the basis of 523,330,908 Shares being in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming that no Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the AGM, the maximum number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all share options that may be granted under the refreshed Scheme Mandate Limit is 52,333,090 Shares, representing 10% of the Company's issued share capital as at the Latest Practicable Date. The total number of Shares which may fall to be allotted and issued pursuant to the exercise of share options that may be granted under the refreshed Scheme Mandate Limit together with all outstanding share options granted and yet to be exercised as at the Latest Practicable Date, being a total of 63,456,031 Shares, representing 12.13% of the issued share capital of the Company, do not exceed the 30% limit as at the Latest Practicable Date. As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company has no present plans to grant any share options if the 10% Scheme Mandate Limit is refreshed.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Conditions of the Refreshment of Scheme Mandate Limit

The refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit is conditional upon:

- (a) the Shareholders passing an ordinary resolution to approve the refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit at the AGM; and
- (b) the Listing Committee of the Stock Exchange granting the approval of the listing of, and permission to deal in, the Shares to be issued pursuant to the exercise of any options that may be granted under the Share Option Scheme under the refreshed Scheme Mandate Limit not exceeding 10% of the number of Shares in issue as at the date of approval by the Shareholders.

Application will be made to the Stock Exchange for the listing of, and permission to deal in, the Shares that may be issued pursuant to the exercise of the share options that may be granted under the refreshed Scheme Mandate Limit.

AGM

The AGM Notice is set out from pages 20 to 24 of this circular. A form of proxy for use at the AGM is enclosed with this circular.

At the AGM, ordinary resolutions will be proposed to approve, among others, the re-election of retiring Directors, the grant of the Issue Mandate, Buy-back Mandate and Extension Mandate.

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, the proposed ordinary resolutions as set out in the AGM Notice will be taken by way of poll at the AGM. The results of the poll will be posted on the websites of the Stock Exchange and the Company by way of an announcement.

Whether or not you are able to attend the AGM, you are requested to complete and return the enclosed form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon to the Company's share registrar Tricor Tengis Limited at Level 54, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong as soon as possible, and in any event not later than 48 hours (i.e. 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday, 2 June 2021) before the time appointed for holding the AGM or any adjournment thereof (as the case may be). Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjournment thereof (as the case may be) should you so wish.

RECOMMENDATION

The Board considers that the proposed ordinary resolutions as set out in the AGM Notice are in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole and therefore recommends the Shareholders to vote in favour of the re-election of retiring Directors, the grant of the Issue Mandate, Buy-back Mandate and Extension Mandate to be proposed at the AGM.

APPENDIX I PARTICULARS OF DIRECTORS PROPOSED TO BE RE-ELECTED

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the biographical details of the Directors who will retire and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the AGM pursuant to the Articles and the Listing Rules, are as follows:

Mr. CHENG Lut Tim (“Mr. Cheng”), aged 65, was appointed as an executive director of the Company on 19 December 2020. Mr. Cheng obtained a bachelor’s degree in international relations. He is the executive director of China Finance Fund. He was the assistant researcher, vice president of Bank of China Trust Company, vice president of Shenzhen Travel Service Co., Ltd., and a director of Shanghai Yongsheng Co. Ltd.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance (Chapter 571 of the Laws of Hong Kong) (the “SFO”), Mr. Cheng was interested, or deemed to be interested in, 38,000,000 shares of the Company (the “Shares”). Save as disclosed herein, Mr. Cheng was not interested nor deemed to be interested in any Shares or underlying Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Save for disclosed above, Mr. Cheng has not previously held any position with the Group, has not been a director in any other listed public companies in the last three years, does not have any relationships with any directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company (as defined in the Listing Rules).

Mr. Cheng has entered into a service contract with the Company for a term of one year from 19 December 2020 to 18 December 2021, subject to the retirement by rotation at the annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the Articles. Mr. Cheng is entitled to a director’s fee of HK\$336,000 per annum, which was determined by the Board with reference to his prior experience and his duties, experience and responsibilities in the Company as well as the market conditions.

Save for disclosed above, Mr. Cheng confirmed that he is not aware of any information in relation to his re-election as a Director (if appropriate) to be disclosed pursuant to Rules 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules.

Save for disclosed above, the Board is not aware of any other matters relating to Mr. Cheng’s re-election that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.
