1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders with information in respect of the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM for (i) the re-election of retiring Directors; (ii) the granting to the Directors of the general mandates to issue and buy back Shares; and (iii) the extension of the general mandate to issue Shares.

2. RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

As at the date of this circular, the Directors include:

Non-executive Directors:	Mr. WANG Binghua (<i>Chairman</i>) Mr. GUAN Qihong
Independent non-executive Directors:	Mr. KWONG Che Keung, Gordon Mr. LI Fang Mr. YAU Ka Chi
Executive Directors:	Mr. YU Bing (<i>President</i>) Mr. WANG Zichao

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Pursuant to article 81 of the Articles, the Board has the power from time to time at any time to appoint any person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the existing Board. Any Director so appointed by the Board shall hold office only until the next general meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re-election (but shall not be taken into account in determining which particular Directors or the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation at such meeting). Accordingly, Mr. YAU Ka Chi, who was appointed as Director on 12 December 2016, shall retire from his office.

Pursuant to article 82 of the Articles, at each annual general meeting, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not three or a multiple of three, then the number nearest to but not greater than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation provided that notwithstanding anything therein, each Director shall be subject to retirement by rotation at least once in every three years. Accordingly, Mr. YU Bing and Mr. GUAN Qihong shall retire from their office.

The above-mentioned Directors, being eligible, shall offer themselves for re-election at the AGM. Pursuant to Rule 13.74 of the Listing Rules, the details of the retiring Directors are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

3. GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND TO BUY BACK SHARES

Ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the AGM to approve the granting of general mandates to the Directors:

- (a) to allot, issue or deal with Shares of an aggregate number not exceeding 20% of the number of Shares in issue on the date of passing of the relevant resolution (subject to adjustment in the case of any conversion of any or all of the Shares into a larger or smaller number of Shares in accordance with section 170(2)(e) of the Companies Ordinance after the passing of the relevant resolution) (the “Issuance Mandate”);
- (b) to buy back Shares on the Stock Exchange of an aggregate number not exceeding 10% of the number of Shares in issue on the date of passing of the relevant resolution (subject to adjustment in the case of any conversion of any or all of the Shares into a larger or smaller number of Shares in accordance with section 170(2)(e) of the Companies Ordinance after the passing of the relevant resolution) (the “Buy-back Mandate”);
- (c) to extend the Issuance Mandate by the number of Shares bought back by the Company pursuant to and in accordance with the Buy-back Mandate.

The Issuance Mandate and the Buy-back Mandate will continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company held after the AGM or any earlier date as referred to in ordinary resolutions nos. 8A and 8B set out in the notice of AGM.

The purpose of the proposed Issue Mandate is to give the Board strategic flexibility to issue and allot Shares to meet any capital raising need that may arise from time to time for growth of the Company's business where the Board believes it is in the best interests of Shareholders to do so. With reference to the proposed Buy-back Mandate, the Directors wish to state that they have no present plan to buy back any Shares.

In accordance with the requirements of the Listing Rules, the Company is required to send to the Shareholders an explanatory statement containing all the information reasonably necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the granting of the Buy-back Mandate. The explanatory statement as required by the Listing Rules in connection with the Buy-back Mandate is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

4. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND PROXY ARRANGEMENT

The notice of the AGM is set out on pages 14 to 18 of this circular. Additional information regarding the business to be considered at the AGM is set out on pages 7 to 13 of this circular.

Shareholders whose names appeared on the register of members on 6 June 2017 (the date of the AGM) are eligible to attend, speak and vote at the AGM.

A form of proxy for use at the AGM is enclosed with this circular or can be downloaded from the website of the Stock Exchange at www.hkexnews.hk and on the Company's website at www.chinapower.hk.

To be valid, the form of proxy, together with the power of attorney or other authority, if any, under which it is signed, or a notarially certified copy of that power or authority must be deposited at the share registrar of the Company, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the meeting or any adjourned meeting thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude any member of the Company from attending the meeting or any adjournment thereof and voting in person if such member so wishes and in such event, the form of proxy will be deemed to be revoked.

5. VOTING BY WAY OF POLL

Under Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, vote(s) of Shareholders at general meeting(s) must be taken by poll except where the chairman, in good faith, decides to allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on a show of hands. As such, the chairman of the AGM shall pursuant to article 61 of the Articles demand each of the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM be put to the vote by way of a poll.

6. RECOMMENDATION

The Board considers that the re-election of the retiring Directors, the granting of the Issuance Mandate, the granting of the Buy-back Mandate and the extension of the Issuance Mandate are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Board recommends the Shareholders to vote in favour of all the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

Experience

YU Bing, born in 1967, is an executive Director, the president of the Company, the chairman of the Executive Committee and the Risk Management Committee. Mr. YU is a senior engineer and has a bachelor degree in thermal power engineering from Xi'an Jiaotong University and an executive master of business administration degree from Tsinghua University. Mr. YU is currently a director and general manager of CPI Holding ("Mr. YU's other positions). He previously served as the general manager of Yaomeng Power Plant, the general manager of CP Maintenance Engineering, the deputy general manager of CPI Northeast China Power Company Limited and the deputy general manager of Shandong Nuclear Power Company Limited. Save as disclosed above, Mr. YU has not held any directorship in other listed public companies in the past three years.

Length of Service

Mr. YU has been appointed for a term of three years. Subject to the Shareholders' approval at the forthcoming AGM, Mr. YU will continue to serve on the Board until the expiry of his appointed term and he shall retire from office by rotation in accordance with the Articles.

Other than in his capacity as an executive Director, the president of the Company and Mr. YU's other positions, Mr. YU does not have any relationship with any directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Mr. GUAN Qihong, a non-executive Director

Experience

GUAN Qihong, born in 1962, is a non-executive Director. Mr. GUAN is a senior economist and a senior auditor and has a bachelor of engineering degree from Huazhong Institute of Technology, a master degree in economics from Zhongnan University of Economics and a doctoral degree in economics from Xiamen University. Mr. GUAN is currently the chief capital market officer of the Strategic Planning Department of SPIC, a director of the CPI Financial and a director of the CPI Holding (“Mr. GUAN’s other positions). He previously served as the commissioner of Asset Assessment Centre of National Asset Management Bureau, the deputy secretary-general of China Appraisal Society, the assistant to the head of Finance and Property Ownership Management Department of the State Power Corporation of China, the chief economist of State Grid Shenzhen Energy Development Group Co., Ltd and the supervisor of the Capital Market and Equity Department of the CPI Group. Save as disclosed above, Mr. GUAN has not held any directorship in other listed public companies in the past three years.

Length of Service

Mr. GUAN has been appointed for a term of three years. Subject to the Shareholders’ approval at the forthcoming AGM, Mr. GUAN will continue to serve on the Board until the expiry of his appointed term and he shall retire from office by rotation in accordance with the Articles.

Relationships

Other than in his capacity as a non-executive Director and Mr. GUAN’s other positions, Mr. GUAN does not have any relationship with any directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Interests in Shares

So far as the Directors are aware as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. GUAN is beneficially interested in 400,000 underlying Shares (within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO), representing approximately 0.0054% of the total number of Shares in issue, being the subject of share options granted to him pursuant to the Share Option Scheme.

Director’s emoluments

Mr. GUAN does not have a service contract with any member of the Group. He did not receive any emoluments for the financial year ended 31 December 2016. His emoluments for the financial year ending 31 December 2017 will be determined by the Board with reference to his experience, performance and duties as well as the prevailing market conditions.

He had worked for Ernst & Young in its Hong Kong, Toronto and Beijing offices with primary focus in providing professional services in accounting and audit, initial public offering, and corporate restructuring before retiring in September 2015. During his professional career with Ernst & Young, Mr. YAU had been appointed as the professional practice director of Greater China, the assurance leader for China North Region, the oil & gas industry leader of Greater China and the assurance leader of the Energy & Resources Markets Segment of Greater China. Save as disclosed above, Mr. YAU has not held any directorship in other listed public companies in the past three years.

Length of Service

Mr. YAU has been appointed for a term of three years. Subject to the Shareholders' approval at the forthcoming AGM, Mr. YAU will continue to serve on the Board until the expiry of his appointed term and he shall retire from office by rotation in accordance with the Articles.

Relationships

Other than in his capacity as an independent non-executive Director and Mr. YAU's other positions, Mr. YAU does not have any relationship with any directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Interests in Shares

So far as the Directors are aware as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. YAU does not have any interest in the Shares (within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO).

APPENDIX I DETAILS OF THE DIRECTORS PROPOSED FOR RE-ELECTION

Director's emoluments

Mr. YAU does not have a service contract with any member of the Group. His emoluments for the financial year ended 31 December 2016 (calculated from the date of his appointment effective 12 December 2016) amounted to RMB7,000 which was determined based on his performance, qualifications and competence displayed. His emoluments for the financial year ending 31 December 2017 will be determined by the Board with reference to his experience, performance and duties as well as the prevailing market conditions.

In the opinion of the Directors, other than the aforesaid matters, there is no information which is discloseable nor any of the aforesaid Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM is/was involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under Rules 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules, and there is no any other matters need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

APPENDIX II EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE BUY-BACK MANDATE

This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement required to be sent to Shareholders under the Listing Rules to be given to the Shareholders in connection with the proposed Buy-back Mandate to be granted to the Board.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue was 7,355,164,741.

Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution in respect of the granting of the Buy-back Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or bought back prior to the AGM, the Company will be allowed under the Buy-back Mandate to buy back a maximum of 735,516,474 Shares (representing 10% of the Shares in issue as at the date of granting of the Buy-back Mandate).

2. REASON FOR BUY-BACKS

The Board believes that the Buy-back Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders. Such buy-back may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Board believes that such buy-back will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

The Directors have no present intention to buy-back any Shares.

3. FUNDING OF BUY-BACKS

In buying back the Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with Articles, the laws of Hong Kong and the Listing Rules. Buy-backs pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate will be made out of funds of the Company legally permitted to be utilized in this connection, including funds otherwise available for dividend or distribution or the proceeds of a fresh issue of shares made for such purpose.

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the audited financial statements contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2016 in the event that the Buy-back Mandate is exercised in full at any time during the proposed buy-back period. However, the Board does not propose to exercise the Buy-back Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or its gearing levels which, in the opinion of the Board, are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

5. UNDERTAKING

The Board has undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the powers of the Company to make buy-backs pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate and in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Hong Kong.

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge, having made all reasonable enquiries, their respective close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company or its subsidiaries under the Buy-back Mandate if such resolution is approved by the Shareholders.

No other connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company or its subsidiaries, nor have undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Buy-back Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

6. TAKEOVERS CODE

If on the exercise of the power to buy back Shares pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and thereby become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, CPDL and CPI Holding held 4,090,138,546 Shares representing approximately 55.61% of the total number of Shares in issue. On the basis that no Shares are issued or bought back prior to the date of the AGM, in the event that the Board exercises in full the power to buy back Shares in accordance with the terms of the relevant ordinary resolution to be proposed at the AGM, the interests of CPDL and CPI Holding in the Shares would be increased to approximately 61.79% of the total number of Shares in issue. Such increase would not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. The Board is not aware of any consequences which may arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any buy-backs made under the Buy-back Mandate.

7. SHARE BUY-BACK MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company has not bought back any Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) during the six months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.
