PROPOSALS FOR RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS AND

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SECURITIES

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to (i) the re-election of Directors; and (ii) the granting to the Directors of general mandates for the issue and repurchase of securities of the Company up to 20% and 10% respectively of the aggregate nominal amount of the Company's issued share capital and Warrants as at the date of the passing of such resolutions.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

The Board currently consists of eight Directors, namely Messrs. Arthur George Dew, Patrick Lee Seng Wei, Li Chi Kong, Henry Lai Hin Wing, Steven Lee Siu Chung, Alan Stephen Jones, John Douglas Mackie and Steven Samuel Zoellner.

Pursuant to Article 105(A) of the Articles, at each annual general meeting of the Company, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three, the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office such that each Director (including those appointed for a specific term) will be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years at the annual general meeting, provided always that any Director appointed pursuant to Article 96 of the Articles shall not be taken into account in determining the Directors who are to retire by rotation at such meeting. The Directors to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election but as between persons who became Directors on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree between themselves) be determined by lot. The retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election. Pursuant to Article 96 of the Articles, the Board shall have power from time to time and at any time to appoint any person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the Board. Any Director so appointed shall hold office only until the next following general meeting of the Company (in the case of filling a casual vacancy) or until the next following annual general meeting of the Company (in the case of an addition to the Board), and shall then be eligible for re-election.

Pursuant to Article 105(A) of the Articles, Messrs. Li Chi Kong, Henry Lai Hin Wing and Steven Lee Siu Chung shall retire by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the AGM. In addition, pursuant to Article 96 of the Articles, Mr. Arthur George Dew, being Director appointed by the Board after the Company's last annual general meeting held on 26th May, 2006, will hold office only until the next following general meeting or until the next AGM and, being eligible, offer himself for re-appointment as Director. All the retiring Directors are eligible for re-election.

Article 109 of the Articles provides that no person other than a retiring Director, shall, unless recommended by the Board for election, be eligible for election to the office of Director at any general meeting, unless notice in writing of the intention to propose that person for election as a Director and notice in writing by that person of his willingness to be elected shall have been given to the Company during the period commencing no earlier than the day after the despatch of the notice of the general meeting appointed for such election and ending no later than seven days prior to the date of such general meeting.

Accordingly, if a Shareholder wishes to nominate a person to stand for election as a Director at the AGM, notice in writing of his intention to propose such person for election as a Director and the notice in writing executed by the nominee of his willingness to be elected must be validly served at the registered office of the Company at 22nd Floor, Allied Kajima Building, 138 Gloucester Road, Wanchai, Hong Kong on or before 6th June, 2007.

Brief biographical details of the retiring Directors are set out in Appendix I to this circular. If a valid notice from a Shareholder to propose a person to stand for election as a Director at the AGM is received after the printing of this circular, the Company will issue a supplementary circular to inform Shareholders of the details of the additional candidate proposed.

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SECURITIES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 26th May, 2006, ordinary resolutions were passed for the granting of general mandates to the Directors (i) to allot, issue and deal with additional securities of the Company up to 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue at that date ("Existing Issue Mandate") and (ii) to repurchase Shares up to 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at that date ("Existing Repurchase Mandate").

The Existing Issue Mandate and the Existing Repurchase Mandate will expire upon the conclusion of the AGM. The Directors consider that the Existing Issue Mandate and the Existing Repurchase Mandate increase the flexibility in the Company's affairs and are in the interests of the Shareholders, and that the same shall continue to be adopted by the Company.

New general mandates to allot, issue and deal with additional securities of the Company up to 20% of the issued share capital of the Company and to repurchase Shares up to 10% of the issued share capital of the Company and 10% of the Warrants as at the date of the passing of the resolutions ("Securities Repurchase Mandate") as set out in Resolutions 6(A) and 6(B) respectively of the notice will be proposed at the AGM. Resolution authorising the extension of the general mandate to the Directors to issue securities to include the aggregate nominal amount of such securities repurchased (if any) under the Securities Repurchase Mandate is to be proposed as Resolution 6(C) at the AGM.

With reference to the proposed new general mandates, the Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plans to issue any new securities or repurchase any securities of the Company pursuant to the relevant mandates.

An explanatory statement containing the particulars required by the Listing Rules to enable the Shareholders to make an informed view on whether to vote for or against Resolution 6(B) to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the proposed Securities Repurchase Mandate are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

Mr. Li Chi Kong, aged 53, was appointed Financial Controller and Executive Director of the Company in August 1997 and October 1999 respectively. He is a member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Scotland and a fellow of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants. He has broad experience in the finance and accounting field, having worked in two major audit firms and as group financial controller for several sizeable listed companies in Hong Kong. He is also an executive director of Tian An China Investments Company Limited ("TAC"), an executive director and the vice-president of Shanghai Allied Cement Limited ("SAC") and the group financial controller of Allied Group, a substantial shareholder of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Allied Group, TAC and SAC are companies listed on the Stock Exchange. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Li did not hold any other directorship in listed public companies during the past three years.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Lai did not have any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company nor had he any interests in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practicable Date. Mr. Lai is not aware of any other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Pursuant to paragraphs (h) to (v) of Rules 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules, there is no other information in relation to Mr. Lai to be disclosed.

Mr. Steven Lee Siu Chung, aged 59, was appointed a Non-Executive Director of the Company in September 2004. He is an associate member of the Chartered Institute of Bankers, London, U.K. He has over thirty-three years of working experience at senior management level in the banking and financial industry in Hong Kong and overseas. Mr. Lee is an employee of AG Capital Limited ("AG Capital") which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Allied Group, a substantial shareholder of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Previously, he was a non-executive director of SAC, a company listed on the Stock Exchange. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Lee did not hold any other directorship in listed public companies during the past three years.

A service contract has been entered into between the Company and Mr. Lee pursuant to which his term of appointment shall continue until 31st December, 2007, subject to retirement and re-election at the annual general meetings of the Company in accordance with the Articles or any other applicable laws from time to time whereby he shall vacate his office. As abovementioned, Mr. Lee is an employee of AG Capital, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Allied Group which charges management services fee to the Company according to a specified percentage of his remuneration in AG Capital and such percentage is determined by reference to the percentage of time devoted by him on the affairs of the Company. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Lee did not have any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company nor had he any interests in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practicable Date. Mr. Lee is not aware of any other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Pursuant to paragraphs (h) to (v) of Rules 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules, there is no other information in relation to Mr. Lee to be disclosed.

Mr. Arthur George Dew, aged 65, was appointed the Chairman and a Non-Executive Director of the Company in January 2007. He graduated from the Law School of the University of Sydney, Australia, and was admitted as a solicitor and later as a barrister of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, Australia. He is currently a non-practising barrister. He has a broad range of corporate and business experience and has served as a director, and in some instances chairman of the board of directors, of a number of public companies listed in Australia, Hong Kong and elsewhere. He is a non-executive director and the chairman of Allied Group and also an executive director and the chairman of Quality HealthCare Asia Limited ("QHA"). Previously, he was a non-executive director and the chairman of Sun Hung Kai & Co. Limited ("SHK"). Allied Group, QHA and SHK are companies listed on the Stock Exchange. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Dew did not hold any other directorship in listed public companies during the past three years.

A service contract has been entered into between the Company and Mr. Dew pursuant to which his term of appointment shall continue until 31st December, 2007, subject to retirement and re-election at the annual general meetings of the Company in accordance with the Articles or any other applicable laws from time to time whereby he shall vacate his office. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Dew did not have any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company nor had he any interests in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practicable Date. Mr. Dew is not aware of any other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Pursuant to paragraphs (h) to (v) of Rules 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules, there is no other information in relation to Mr. Dew to be disclosed.

This Appendix contains the particulars that are required by the Listing Rules to be included in an explanatory statement to enable the Shareholders to make an informed view on whether to vote for or against the resolution to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the proposed Securities Repurchase Mandate.

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company was HK\$1,074,600,030 divided into 537,300,015 Shares and the total number of outstanding Warrants was 107,282,226 carrying the rights to subscribe up to HK\$1,072,822,260 for 107,282,226 Shares at the initial subscription price of HK\$10.00 per Share (subject to adjustments).

Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the proposed mandate to repurchase its securities and on the basis that no further Shares are issued (whether generally or pursuant to the exercise of subscription rights attaching to the Warrants) or repurchased before the AGM, the Company will be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 53,730,001 Shares and a maximum of 10,728,222 Warrants during the period ending on the earlier of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by law or the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by a resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole for the Directors to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase its securities on the Stock Exchange. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets value of the Company and/or earnings per share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

The Directors have no present intention to repurchase any securities of the Company and they would only exercise the power to repurchase in circumstances where they consider that the repurchase would be in the best interests of the Company and in circumstances where they consider that the securities can be repurchased on the terms favourable to the Company. On the basis of the consolidated financial position of the Company as at 31st December, 2006, being the date to which the latest published audited financial statements of the Company were made up, the Directors consider that if the general mandate to repurchase securities were to be exercised in full at the currently prevailing market value, it may have a material adverse impact on the working capital position and gearing level of the Company. The Directors do not propose to exercise the mandate to repurchase securities to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the

working capital requirements of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the latest published audited financial statements or the gearing level which, in the opinion of the Directors, are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases to be made pursuant to the proposed mandate to repurchase securities would be financed out of funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Company's memorandum of association and the Articles and the applicable laws of Hong Kong and the Listing Rules. Such funds include, but are not limited to, profits available for distribution.

EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE AND REPURCHASE CODE

Upon the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Securities Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code and Rule 6 of the Repurchase Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and, depending on the level of increase of the Shareholders' interests, may become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date and save as disclosed below, the Directors are not aware of any other person who is, directly or indirectly, interested in 10% or more of the nominal value of any class of share capital carrying rights to vote in all circumstances at general meetings of the Company.

Although such increase of interest will not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code, the amount of Shares held by the public will be reduced to less than 25% of the total issued share capital of the Company. The Directors have no present intention to repurchase Shares to such extent which will result in the amount of Shares held by the public being reduced to less than 25% if the Securities Repurchase Mandate is approved at the AGM.

PRICE OF THE SHARES AND WARRANTS
