INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to, among other things, (i) the re-election of Directors; and (ii) the granting to the Directors of general mandates for the issue and repurchase of securities of the Company up to 20% and 10% respectively of the aggregate nominal amount of the Company's securities as at the date of the passing of such resolutions.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Board consists of seven (7) Directors, namely Messrs. Arthur George Dew, Lee Seng Hui, Li Chi Kong, Mark Wong Tai Chun, Steven Samuel Zoellner, Alan Stephen Jones and David Craig Bartlett.

Pursuant to Article 105(A) of the Articles, at each annual general meeting, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three (3), the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office such that each Director (including those appointed for a specific term) will be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three (3) years at the annual general meeting, provided always that any Director appointed pursuant to Article 96 of the Articles shall not be taken into account in determining the Directors who are to retire by rotation at such meeting. The Directors to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election but as between persons who became Directors on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree between themselves) be determined by lot. The retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election. Pursuant to Article 96 of the Articles, the Board shall have power from time to time and at any time to appoint any person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the Board. Any Director so appointed shall hold office only until the next following general meeting of the Company (in the case of filling a casual vacancy) or until the next following annual general meeting of the Company (in the case of an addition to the Board), and shall then be eligible for re-election.

Pursuant to Article 105(A) of the Articles, Messrs. Arthur George Dew, Lee Seng Hui and Mark Wong Tai Chun shall retire from office by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the AGM.

Article 109 of the Articles provides that no person, other than a retiring Director, shall, unless recommended by the Board for election, be eligible for election to the office of Director at any general meeting, unless notice in writing of the intention to propose that person for election as a Director and notice in writing by that person of his willingness to be elected shall have been given to the Company during the period commencing no earlier than the day after the despatch of the notice of the general meeting appointed for such election and ending no later than seven (7) days prior to the date of such general meeting.

Accordingly, if a Shareholder wishes to nominate a person to stand for election as a Director at the AGM, notice in writing of his intention to propose such person for election as a Director and the notice in writing executed by the nominee of his willingness to be elected must be validly served at the registered office of the Company at 22nd Floor, Allied Kajima Building, 138 Gloucester Road, Wanchai, Hong Kong on or before 30th May, 2013.

Pursuant to Rule 13.74 of the Listing Rules, a listed issuer shall disclose the details required under Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules of any directors proposed to be re-elected or proposed new director in the notice or accompanying circular to its shareholders of the relevant general meeting, if such re-election or appointment is subject to shareholders' approval at that relevant general meeting.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Brief biographical details of the retiring Directors who are proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix I to this circular. If a valid notice from a Shareholder to propose a person to stand for election as a Director at the AGM is received after the printing of this circular, the Company will issue a supplementary circular to inform the Shareholders of the details of the additional candidate proposed.

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SECURITIES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 31st May, 2012, ordinary resolutions were passed for the granting of general mandates to the Directors (i) to allot, issue or otherwise deal with additional securities of the Company up to 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at that date (“Existing Issue Mandate”), being 1,360,871,544 Shares; and (ii) to repurchase Shares and outstanding Warrants up to 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue and 10% of the outstanding Warrants as at that date (“Existing Repurchase Mandate”), being 680,435,772 Shares and 139,059,475 units of outstanding Warrants.

The Existing Issue Mandate and the Existing Repurchase Mandate will expire upon the conclusion of the AGM. The Directors consider that the Existing Issue Mandate and the Existing Repurchase Mandate increase the flexibility in dealing of the Company’s affairs and are in the interests of both the Company and the Shareholders as a whole, and that the same shall continue to be adopted by the Company.

New general mandates to allot, issue or otherwise deal with additional securities of the Company up to 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing the resolution as set out in Resolution No. 5(A) of the notice of AGM will be proposed at the AGM. Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the proposed mandate to issue securities of the Company and on the basis that no further securities of the Company are issued or repurchased before the AGM, the Company will be allowed under such mandate to issue a maximum of 1,360,631,821 Shares, representing 20% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date. In addition, a new general mandate to repurchase Shares up to 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue and 10% of the outstanding Warrants as at the date of passing the resolution (“Securities Repurchase Mandate”) as set out in Resolution No. 5(B) of the notice of AGM will also be proposed at the AGM. A resolution authorising the extension of the general mandate to the Directors to issue securities of the Company to include the aggregate nominal amount of such securities of the Company repurchased (if any) under the Securities Repurchase Mandate is to be proposed as Resolution No. 5(C) of the notice of AGM at the AGM.

With reference to the proposed new general mandates, the Directors, as at the date hereof, wish to state that they have no immediate plans to issue any new securities of the Company pursuant to the relevant mandates.

An explanatory statement containing the particulars required by the Listing Rules to enable the Shareholders to make an informed view on whether to vote for or against Resolution No. 5(B) to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the proposed Securities Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

AGM

The notice of AGM to be held at Plaza 4, Lower Lobby, Novotel Century Hong Kong, 238 Jaffe Road, Wanchai, Hong Kong on Friday, 7th June, 2013 at 9:30 a.m. is set out on pages 14 to 18 of this circular. A copy of the 2012 Annual Report is despatched to the Shareholders together with this circular. Ordinary resolutions in respect of, inter alia, the re-election of Directors and the general mandates to issue and repurchase securities of the Company will be proposed at the AGM.

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll except where the chairman, in good faith, decides to allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands. The resolutions to be proposed at the AGM do not relate purely to a procedural or administrative matter. Accordingly, all resolutions set out in the notice of AGM will be put to vote by way of poll at the AGM. An announcement on the results of the vote by poll will be made by the Company after the AGM in the manner prescribed under Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

A form of proxy for the AGM is enclosed with this circular. Whether or not you are able to attend the AGM, you are requested to complete the accompanying form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and return the same to the Company's share registrar, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the AGM or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude the Shareholders from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjournment thereof if they so wish.

RECOMMENDATION

The Directors consider that the proposed ordinary resolutions for approval of the re-election of the retiring Directors, the grant of general mandates to issue and repurchase securities of the Company, and to add the aggregate nominal amount of securities of the Company that may be repurchased to the aggregate nominal amount of the securities of the Company that may be allotted pursuant to the general mandate to issue securities of the Company are each in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole, and accordingly, recommend all Shareholders to vote in favour of the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

The biographical details of the Directors proposed to be re-elected at the forthcoming AGM are set out as follows:

Mr. Arthur George Dew, aged 71, was appointed the Chairman and a Non-Executive Director of the Company in January 2007. Mr. Dew graduated from the Law School of the University of Sydney, Australia, and was admitted as a solicitor and later as a barrister of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, Australia. He is currently a non-practising barrister. He has a broad range of corporate and business experience and has served as a director, and in some instances chairman of the board of directors, of a number of public companies listed in Australia, Hong Kong and elsewhere. He is also the chairman and a non-executive director of each of AGL and Allied Overseas Limited (“AOL”), a non-executive director of SHK Hong Kong Industries Limited (“SHK HK IND”), a director and non-executive chairman of Tanami Gold NL (“Tanami Gold”) and a non-executive director of Eurogold Limited (“Eurogold”). Tanami Gold and Eurogold are companies listed on the Australian Securities Exchange. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Dew did not hold any other directorship in listed public companies in Hong Kong or overseas during the past three years. Mr. Dew was previously a non-executive director in approximately 1980 of an Australian agricultural company known as New England Agricultural Corp. Ltd. which company entered into a scheme of arrangement (the “Scheme”) with its creditors and shareholders in approximately 1980 at a time when Mr. Dew was a non-executive director. Insofar as Mr. Dew can recollect, the approximate value involved in the Scheme was approximately AUD\$2 million and the Scheme was completed in approximately 1981.

A service contract which forms the basis of emoluments has been entered into between the Company and Mr. Dew pursuant to which his term of appointment shall continue until 31st December, 2014, subject to retirement and re-election at the annual general meetings of the Company in accordance with the Articles or any other applicable laws from time to time whereby he shall vacate his office. Mr. Dew is also an employee of AGL, which charges management services fee to the Company pursuant to an agreement (the “Sharing of Management Services Agreement”) entered into between AGL and the Company and according to a specified percentage of his remuneration in AGL and such percentage is determined by reference to the percentage of time devoted by him on the affairs of the Company. The remuneration of Mr. Dew was determined with reference to the prevailing market conditions and the terms of the Company’s remuneration policy. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Dew did not have any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company nor had he any interests in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practicable Date. Mr. Dew is not aware of any other matter that needs to be brought to the attention of the holders of the securities of the Company.

Pursuant to paragraphs (h) to (v) of Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules, there is no other information in relation to Mr. Dew to be disclosed.

Mr. Lee Seng Hui, aged 44, was appointed the Chief Executive and an Executive Director of the Company in June 2010. He is also director of a subsidiary of the Company. Mr. Lee graduated from the Law School of the University of Sydney with Honours. Previously, he worked with Baker & McKenzie and N M Rothschild & Sons (Hong Kong) Limited. Mr. Lee is the chief executive and an executive director of AGL and the chairman

and a non-executive director of Tian An China Investments Company Limited. He is also a non-executive director of each of APAC Resources Limited, Mount Gibson Iron Limited (“Mount Gibson”) and Tanami Gold. Mount Gibson and Tanami Gold are companies listed on the Australian Securities Exchange. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Lee did not hold any other directorship in listed public companies in Hong Kong or overseas during the past three years.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Lee together with Ms. Lee Su Hwei and Mr. Lee Seng Huang are the trustees of Lee and Lee Trust, being a discretionary trust. They together owned approximately 65.02% interests in the issued share capital of AGL. AGL owns approximately 74.98% interests in the issued share capital of the Company. Mr. Lee is a brother of Ms. Lee Su Hwei, a non-executive director of AGL.

There is no service contract entered into between Mr. Lee and the Company but he will be subject to retirement and re-election at the annual general meetings of the Company in accordance with the Articles or any other applicable laws from time to time whereby he shall vacate his office. Mr. Lee is an employee of AGL which charges management services fee to the Company pursuant to the Sharing of Management Services Agreement entered into between AGL and the Company and according to a specified percentage of his remuneration in AGL and such percentage is determined by reference to the percentage of time devoted by him on the affairs of the Company. The remuneration of Mr. Lee was determined with reference to the prevailing market conditions and the terms of the Company’s remuneration policy. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Lee did not have any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date. Mr. Lee is not aware of any other matter that needs to be brought to the attention of the holders of the securities of the Company.

Pursuant to paragraphs (h) to (v) of Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules, there is no other information in relation to Mr. Lee to be disclosed.

Mr. Mark Wong Tai Chun, aged 48, was appointed an Executive Director of the Company in June 2010. He is also director of certain subsidiaries of the Company. Mr. Wong has a Master’s Degree in Business Administration and is a fellow of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants, The Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators and The Hong Kong Institute of Chartered Secretaries. Mr. Wong was the financial controller of other listed companies in Hong Kong. He is an executive director and the chief executive officer of AOL. He is also an executive director of SHK HK IND and the director of investment of AGL. Mr. Wong is an alternate director to Mr. Arthur George Dew in each of Tanami Gold and Eurogold. Tanami Gold and Eurogold are companies listed on the Australian Securities Exchange. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Wong did not hold any other directorship in listed public companies in Hong Kong or overseas during the past three years.

There is no service contract entered into between Mr. Wong and the Company but he will be subject to retirement and re-election at the annual general meetings of the Company in accordance with the Articles or any other applicable laws from time to time whereby he shall vacate his office. Mr. Wong is an employee of AGL which charges management services fee to the Company pursuant to the Sharing of Management Services Agreement entered into between AGL and the Company and according to a specified percentage of his remuneration

in AGL and such percentage is determined by reference to the percentage of time devoted by him on the affairs of the Company. The remuneration of Mr. Wong was determined with reference to the prevailing market conditions and the terms of the Company's remuneration policy. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Wong did not have any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company. Mr. Wong held 119,203 shares and 23,840 underlying shares of AOL within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practicable Date. Mr. Wong is not aware of any other matter that needs to be brought to the attention of the holders of the securities of the Company.

Pursuant to paragraphs (h) to (v) of Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules, there is no other information in relation to Mr. Wong to be disclosed.

This Appendix contains the particulars that are required by the Listing Rules to be included in an explanatory statement to enable the Shareholders to make an informed view on whether to vote for or against the resolution to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the proposed Securities Repurchase Mandate.

SHARE CAPITAL AND WARRANTS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company was HK\$1,360,631,821.40 divided into 6,803,159,107 Shares and the total number of outstanding Warrants was 1,390,589,367 units carrying the rights to subscribe up to HK\$2,781,178,734.00 for 1,390,589,367 Shares at an initial subscription price of HK\$2.00 per Share in cash (subject to adjustments).

Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the proposed mandate to repurchase securities of the Company and on the basis that no further securities of the Company are issued (whether generally or pursuant to the exercise of subscription rights attaching to the Warrants) or repurchased before the AGM, the Company will be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 680,315,910 Shares and a maximum of 139,058,936 units of Warrants during the period ending on the earlier of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by law or the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by a resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole for the Directors to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase securities of the Company on the Stock Exchange. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per share and/or earnings per share of the Company and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

The Directors would exercise the power to repurchase in circumstances where they consider that the repurchase would be in the best interests of the Company and in circumstances where they consider that the securities of the Company can be repurchased on the terms favourable to the Company. On the basis of the consolidated financial position of the Company as at 31st December, 2012, being the date to which the latest published audited financial statements of the Company were made up, if the general mandate to repurchase securities of the Company was to be exercised in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period, it may have an adverse impact on the working capital and gearing level of the Company.

The Directors do not propose to exercise the mandate to repurchase securities of the Company to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the latest published audited financial statements of the Company or the gearing level which, in the opinion of the Directors, are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases to be made pursuant to the proposed mandate to repurchase securities of the Company would be financed out of funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Company's Memorandum of Association and Articles and the applicable laws of Hong Kong and the Listing Rules. Such funds include, but are not limited to, profits available for distribution.

EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE AND REPURCHASE CODE

Upon the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Securities Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interests in the voting rights of the Company increases, and such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code and Rule 6 of the Repurchase Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and, depending on the level of increase of the Shareholders' interests, may become obliged to make a mandatory general offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Lee and Lee Trust and parties acting in concert with it (including AGL) are beneficially interested in an aggregate of 5,101,211,521 Shares, representing approximately 74.98% of the issued share capital of the Company, and 1,006,006,209 units of Warrants.

Based on such interests in the Shares and in the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares under the Securities Repurchase Mandate and assuming that no further Shares are issued (whether pursuant to exercise of the Warrants or otherwise) or repurchased prior to the AGM, the interests of Lee and Lee Trust together with the parties acting in concert with it (including AGL) will be increased to approximately 83.31% of the total issued share capital of the Company. To the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors, such increase in the interests of Lee and Lee Trust together with parties acting in concert with it (including AGL) will not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory general offer under Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code, and the amount of Shares held by the public will be reduced to less than 25% of the total issued share capital of the Company. The Directors have no present intention to repurchase Shares to the extent that it will result in the amount of Shares held by the public being reduced to less than 25% of the total issued share capital of the Company if the Securities Repurchase Mandate is approved at the AGM.
