INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders with information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting relating to, inter alia, (i) the Share Issue Mandate, (ii) the Repurchase Proposal and (iii) the re-election of retiring Directors to enable the Shareholders to make informed decisions as to whether to vote for or against the resolutions.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

An ordinary resolution relating to the Share Issue Mandate will be proposed which, subject to the said resolution being passed at the Annual General Meeting, empowers the Directors to allot, issue and deal with new Shares of not exceeding 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing of the resolution during the period up to (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company, or (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the applicable laws or the Bye-laws of the Company to be held, or (iii) the date of revocation or variation of the said resolution by passing an ordinary resolution in general meeting prior to the next annual general meeting, whichever is the earliest. As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were in issue an aggregate of 699,872,798 Shares. Assuming that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the Annual General Meeting, no more than 139,974,559 Shares may be allotted and issued by the Company if the Share Issue Mandate is exercised in full.

At the Annual General Meeting, an ordinary resolution will be proposed to grant to the Directors a general mandate to repurchase the Shares on the Stock Exchange representing up to a maximum of 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the resolution.

An explanatory statement in connection with the Repurchase Proposal is set out in Appendix I to this circular. The explanatory statement contains all the information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the relevant resolution.

Subject to the passing of the proposed ordinary resolutions regarding the Share Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Proposal, a separate resolution will also be proposed to grant a general mandate to the Directors to include the aggregate nominal amount of Shares which may from time to time be purchased by the Company pursuant to the Repurchase Proposal to the Share Issue Mandate.

RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

Pursuant to bye-law 87 of the Company's Bye-laws, Mr. Lam Wai Chun, Dr. Tang Tin Sek and Professor Zhu Yuhe shall retire by rotation at the Annual General Meeting and, all being eligible, offer themselves for re-election. The biographical details of the aforesaid retiring Directors who stand for re-election at the Annual General Meeting are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Notice of the Annual General Meeting is set out on pages 12 to 16 of this circular.

A form of proxy is enclosed with this circular for use at the Annual General Meeting. Whether or not you intend to attend the Annual General Meeting, you are requested to complete and return the enclosed form of proxy to the office of the Company's Hong Kong branch share registrar, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong

Kong, in accordance with the instructions printed thereon not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the Annual General Meeting (or any adjournment thereof). Completion of a form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting at the Annual General Meeting (or any adjournment thereof) in person if you so wish.

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting must be taken by poll.

RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

RECOMMENDATION

The Directors are of the opinion that (i) the Share Issue Mandate, (ii) the Repurchase Proposal and (iii) the re-election of retiring Directors are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Directors recommend you to vote in favour of all the relevant resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

THE REPURCHASE PROPOSAL

At the Annual General Meeting, an ordinary resolution will be proposed for Shareholders' approval whereby the Directors will be given a general and unconditional mandate to exercise all powers of the Company to repurchase its issued Shares subject to the criteria as set out in this appendix.

While it is not possible to anticipate in advance any specific circumstances in which the Directors might consider it appropriate to repurchase Shares, the Directors believe that the grant of a general mandate to repurchase Shares would provide the Company additional flexibility that would be beneficial to the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. The repurchases may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements of the Company at the material time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share. Shareholders can be assured that the Directors would only make such purchases in circumstances where they consider them to be in the best interests of the Company. On the basis of the consolidated financial position of the Company as at 30th April, 2010 (being the date on which the latest published audited financial statements of the Company have been made up) and in particular the working capital or gearing position of the Company at that time and the number of Shares now in issue, the Directors consider that there may be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company in the event that the proposed repurchase mandate was to be exercised in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, no purchase would be made in circumstances that would have a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company, nor if on the date on which the purchase is to be effected, there are reasonable grounds for believing that the Company is, or after the purchase would be, unable to pay its liabilities as they become due.

SOURCE OF FUNDS

Repurchase must be funded out of funds legally available for the purpose. Any repurchases will be made out of funds of the Company legally permitted in accordance with its Memorandum of Association and Bye-laws and the laws of Bermuda to be utilized for this purpose, including profits available for distribution and sums standing to the credit of the shares premium account of the Company, the proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for the purpose of the repurchase or out of capital, if the Company is able, immediately following such payment, to pay its debts as they fall due in the ordinary course of business.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were in issue an aggregate of 699,872,798 Shares. Assuming that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the Annual General Meeting, not more than 69,987,279 Shares may be repurchased on the Stock Exchange.

DIRECTORS AND CONNECTED PERSONS

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge and belief, having made all reasonable enquiries, any of the associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) of any of the Directors have any present intention, in the event that the Repurchase Proposal is approved by the Shareholders, to sell Shares to the Company.

No persons who are connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company nor have they undertaken not to sell any of the Shares held by them to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Proposal is approved by the Shareholders.

UNDERTAKING TO THE STOCK EXCHANGE

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the power of the Company to make purchases pursuant to the Repurchase Proposal in accordance with the Listing Rules, all applicable laws of Bermuda, and the Memorandum of Association and Bye-laws of the Company.

HONG KONG CODE ON TAKEOVERS AND MERGERS

If, as a result of a share repurchase, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting capital of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeovers Code and, if such increase results in a change in control, may in certain circumstances give rise to an obligation to make a general offer for Shares under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, according to the register kept by the Company pursuant to section 336 of the SFO, (i) Mr. Lam Wai Chun ("Mr. Lam") and his spouse, Ms. Law Ching Yee, are deemed to be interested in 472,250,848 Shares, representing approximately 67.48% of the issued share capital of the Company, of which 29,955,188 Shares are beneficially owned by Mr. Lam and 442,295,660 Shares are ultimately held by his family trust through Ka Yan China Development (Holding) Company Limited, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Ka Yan China Investments Limited, for the purpose of the SFO; and (ii) each of Ka Yan China Investments Limited, the ultimate holding company of the Company, and HSBC International Trustee Limited, the trustee of Mr. Lam's family trust, is deemed to be interested in 442,295,660 Shares, representing approximately 63.20% of the issued share capital of the Company. The interest in 442,295,660 Shares held by Ka Yan China Development (Holding) Company Limited and the deemed interest in 442,295,660 Shares held by Ka Yan China Investments Limited and HSBC International Trustee Limited were in respect of the same interest and duplicate each other.

In the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares which is proposed to be granted pursuant to the Repurchase Proposal, assuming the present shareholdings remain the same, the interests of Mr. Lam and Ms. Law Ching Yee together with his family trust in the Company through Ka Yan China Development (Holding) Company Limited would be increased to approximately 74.97% of the issued share capital of the Company. The Directors consider that such increase would not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. The Directors will not repurchase the Shares on the Stock Exchange if the repurchase would result in the number of the Shares which are in the hands of the public falling below 25%.

APPENDIX II PARTICULARS OF RETIRING DIRECTORS FOR RE-ELECTION

The following is the information required to be disclosed under the Listing Rules on the retiring Directors standing for re-election at the Annual General Meeting:

Mr. LAM Wai Chun, aged 51, was appointed as an executive Director with effect from 29th September, 1999, and has been the Chairman of the Company since 4th October 1999. Due to the re-allocation of respective duties of the executive directors of the Company, Mr. Lam was also appointed as the Managing Director of the Company with effect from 29th September, 2009 and has carried out the responsibilities of the CEO since then. Mr. Lam founded the Group in 1979 and has over 39 years of experience in the coils manufacturing industry. Mr. Lam is also a director of a number of other subsidiaries of the Company, including Coils Electronic Co., Limited, CEC-Coils Singapore Pte Ltd., Coils Electronic (Zhong Shan) Co., Ltd., Xiamen Coils Electronic Co., Ltd. and 南京國仲磁性材料製品有限公司 (Nanjing Guo Zhong Magnetic Material Co., Ltd.).

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Lam has a total interest in 472,250,848 Shares (representing approximately 67.48% of the issued share capital of the Company), which comprised (i) a personal interest in 29,955,188 Shares and (ii) a trust interest in 442,295,660 Shares (for being a founder of his family trust), and is deemed to have an interest in 14,000,000 non-voting deferred shares of Coils Electronic Co., Limited, an associate corporation (as defined under the SFO) of the Company, within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO and holds shares in certain subsidiaries of the Group as trustee for their holding companies. Mr. Lam's trust interest in 442,295,660 Shares (representing approximately 63.20% of the issued share capital of the Company) was ultimately held by his family trust through Ka Yan China Development (Holding) Company Limited, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Ka Yan China Investments Limited. Each of Ka Yan China Investments Limited, the ultimate holding company of the Company, and HSBC International Trustee Limited, the trustee of Mr. Lam's family trust, is deemed to be interested in 442,295,660 Shares, representing approximately 63.20% of the issued share capital of the Company. The interest in 442,295,660 Shares held by Ka Yan China Development (Holding) Company Limited and the deemed interest in 442,295,660 Shares held by Ka Yan China Investments Limited and HSBC International Trustee Limited were in respect of the same interest and duplicate each other. Mr. Lam is the sole director of Ka Yan China Development (Holding) Company Limited, and his spouse, Ms. Law Ching Yee, was deemed a substantial shareholder due to Mr. Lam's interests in the Company for the purpose of SFO. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Lam is not related to any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company and did not hold any directorship in any other listed public companies in the three years preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

Mr. Lam entered into a service agreement with the Company on 27th September, 1999 for an initial period of three years commencing on 1st October, 1999 and continue thereafter until terminated by either party giving to the other not less than six months' notice in writing terminating on or after the expiry of the initial term of three years. Under the service agreement, Mr. Lam is entitled to an annual remuneration of HK\$1,001,000, reimbursement of insurance premium and an annual management bonus. The annual management bonus equivalent to 2% of the audited consolidated profit of the Group attributable to shareholders (after taxation but before extraordinary items and before such management bonus) (the "Net Profit") if the Net Profit for the relevant financial year exceeds HK\$50,000,000 and 4% of the Net Profit if the Net Profit for the relevant year exceeds HK\$70,000,000. Since then, no management bonus has been paid to Mr. Lam. Further, on 1st August, 2009, Mr. Lam entered into a service contract with Coils Electronic (Zhong Shan) Co., Ltd. ("Zhongshan Coils"), an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company, regarding his engagement as the managing director of Zhongshan Coils. Under the service

contract, Mr. Lam is entitled to receive a monthly salary of RMB20,000. The service contract could be terminated upon the occurrence of any of the termination events as specified in the service contract. The total remuneration of Mr. Lam under the aforesaid agreements was determined by the Remuneration Committee of the Company by reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Company, the Company's remuneration policy and the market benchmark.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Lam confirmed that there is no other matter relating to his re-election that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders nor any information to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules.

Dr. TANG Tin Sek, aged 51, was appointed as an executive Director with effect from 29th September, 1999, and has been re-designated as a non-executive Director and an independent non-executive Director with effect from 1st January, 2000 and 3rd June, 2003 respectively. He is also the chairman of the Audit Committee and a member of the Remuneration Committee of the Company. Dr. Tang is a Certified Public Accountant practicing in Hong Kong and a partner of Terence Tang & Partners. He has over 29 years' experience in corporate finance, business advisory, financial management and auditing. Dr. Tang is also a member of The Chinese Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia and The Chartered Association of Certified Accountants in the United Kingdom. He obtained a Bachelor of Science degree from The University of Hong Kong in 1980, a Master of Business Administration degree from The University of Sydney, Australia in 1990 and a Doctor of Accountancy degree from The Hong Kong Polytechnic University in 2004.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Dr. Tang is personally interested in 4,098,000 Shares (representing approximately 0.59% of the issued share capital of the Company) within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Dr. Tang is not related to any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company. Dr. Tang is also an independent non-executive director of Sinofert Holdings Limited, a company listed on the Stock Exchange. He was also an independent non-executive director of Huscoke Resources Holdings Limited (formerly known as Frankie Dominion International Limited) (from 1st July 2004 to 16th April 2008), Interchina Holdings Company Limited (from 26th August 2006 to 1st April 2009), New Smart Energy Group Limited (from December 1999 to 10th June 2009) and Wai Chun Group Holdings Limited (formerly known as Plus Holdings Limited) (from 20th August 2008 to 28th September 2009), all of which are companies listed on the Stock Exchange.

Save as disclosed herein, Dr. Tang did not hold any directorships in other listed public companies in the three years immediately prior to the Latest Practicable Date.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Dr. Tang is not appointed for a specific term but is subject to retirement by rotation in accordance with the Company's Bye-laws. There is no subsisting service contract between the Company and him. Upon re-election, the Company and Dr. Tang will enter into an appointment letter with specific term of appointment commencing from 1st October, 2010 and expiring on 30th September, 2012. Dr. Tang currently receives a director's fee and an additional remuneration for acting as chairman of the Audit Committee of HK\$420,000 per annum and HK\$78,000 per annum respectively, the rates of which were approved by the Shareholders at the annual general meeting of the Company held on 29th September, 2009. The aforesaid director's fee and additional remuneration of Dr. Tang were recommended by the Remuneration Committee of the Company and determined by the Board with reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Company, the Company's remuneration policy and the market benchmark.

Dr. Tang was employed by Allied Group Limited, the shares of which are listed on the Stock Exchange, as its group accounting manager during the period from 4th December, 1989 to 13th April, 1991. His main duty was the supervision of the accounts department which was responsible for keeping books and records and preparation of financial accounts and management information. In 1992, the then financial secretary of the Government of Hong Kong appointed an independent inspector to conduct investigations into certain affairs of a number of companies including Allied Group Limited, Allied Properties (H.K.) Limited and Allied Industries International Limited (together, the "Allied Group"). The investigations covered transactions carried out by the Allied Group from 1990 to 1992. A report on the findings of the inspector was submitted to the then financial secretary of the Government of Hong Kong and an abridged version of the report was published in September, 1993. Subsequent to the publication of the report, the Listing Committee of the Stock Exchange conducted investigations and hearings into the conduct of a number of individuals in senior management positions within the Allied Group concerning a number of transactions referred to and matters arising from the report. The Listing Committee concluded that these transactions were in breach of the Listing Rules contained in Chapters 13 and 14 of the Listing Rules then in force and such individuals were censured. However, Dr. Tang has never been contacted or been under investigation by the authorities mentioned above in respect of such matters.

Save as disclosed above, Dr. Tang confirmed that there is no other matter relating to his re-election that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders nor any information to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules.

Professor ZHU Yuhe, aged 72, was appointed as an independent non-executive Director with effect from 1st April, 2007, and is a member of the Remuneration Committee of the Company. Professor Zhu is a professor of School of Humanities and Social Sciences in Tsinghua University ("Tsinghua") in charge of some advanced courses relating to China's conditions and China's political economics. He is the Vice Chairman of 中國老教授協會 (China Senior Professor Association) and Vice Chairman of 國杰老教授科學技術諮詢開發研究院 (Guojie Senior Professor Science and Technology Development Academy). Professor Zhu graduated from Tsinghua in electrical engineering in 1960 and was subsequently sent to Renmin University of China for further studies on modern history of China by Tsinghua. Professor Zhu has 45 years' extensive teaching experience in history, philosophy and political economics at Tsinghua and also held offices in Tsinghua, including the Director of Department of History, the Vice Dean of School of Humanities and Social Sciences and the teaching adviser of the President of Tsinghua during various periods.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Professor Zhu does not have any interests in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Professor Zhu is not related to any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company and did not hold any directorship in any other listed public companies in the three years preceding the Latest Practicable Date.
