China Power Announced Gross Generation and Total Net Generation for the First Quarter of 2009

China Power International Development Limited (the "Company", stock code: 2380) announced today its gross generation and total net generation for the first quarter ended 31 March 2009.

According to its preliminary statistics, the consolidated gross generation of the power plants of the Company (excluding the power plant of its associated company) amounted to 8,593,368 MWh for the first quarter ended 31 March 2009, representing a year-on-year increase of 0.66% while its consolidated net generation totalled to 8,011,887 MWh, representing a year-on-year increase of 0.48%.

The change in the gross generation for the first quarter of 2009 was mainly attributable to (1) the commence of operation of unit No.1, 2 of Dabieshan Power Plant. (2) weak power demand, and arranging more plan repair of generating units.

The respective net generation figures of the power plants of the Company and its associated company for the first quarter ended 31 March 2009 are as follows:

The shares of the Company have been listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited since 15 October 2004. The Company is the flagship company of China Power Investment Corporation (one of the five national power generation groups in China) and its principal business is to develop, construct, manage and operate power plants in China. The Company has 100% or controlling interest in its six large-capacity coal-fired power plants under commercial operation and 50% equity interest in the associated company, Changshu Power Plant. Meanwhile, the Company also owns a 21.92% stake in Shanghai Electric Power Co., Ltd, which is listed on the Shanghai Stock Exchange. Currently, China Power has an attributable installed capacity of approximately 9,037.4 MW.

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
