(1) PROPOSED GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES (2) PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS AND (3) NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders with information in respect of the Share Issue Mandate, the Share Repurchase Mandate, the proposed re-election of the retiring Directors and to seek your approval of the resolutions relating to these matters at the AGM.

2. SHARE ISSUE MANDATE

At the AGM, the Ordinary Resolution no. 5(A) will be proposed for the Shareholders to consider and, if thought fit, approve the grant of a general mandate to the Directors to exercise the power of the Company to allot, issue and deal with Shares during the period as set out in the Ordinary Resolution no. 5(A) up to 20% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the Ordinary Resolution no. 5(A). In addition, Ordinary Resolution no. 5(C) will also be proposed for the Shareholders to consider and, if thought fit, approve the extension of the Share Issue Mandate by adding to the aggregate number of Shares which may be allotted or agreed conditionally or unconditionally to be allotted by the Directors pursuant to the Share Issue Mandate the number of Shares purchased under the Share Repurchase Mandate, if granted.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 2,096,068,000 fully paid up Shares. Assuming that there is no change in the issued share capital of the Company between the period from the Latest Practicable Date and the date of passing the resolution approving the Share Issue Mandate, the maximum number of Shares which may be issued pursuant to the Share Issue Mandate on the date of passing the resolution approving the Share Issue Mandate will be 419,213,600 Shares.

Details of the Share Issue Mandate and the extension of the Share Issue Mandate are set out in the Ordinary Resolutions nos. 5(A) and 5(C) as referred to in the AGM Notice.

These mandates will expire upon the earliest of:

- (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company;
- (b) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles, or any other applicable laws to be held; and
- (c) the date on which the authority given under the Ordinary Resolutions nos. 5(A) and 5(C) respectively is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders.

3. SHARES REPURCHASE MANDATE

At the AGM, the Ordinary Resolution no. 5(B) will be proposed for the Shareholders to consider and, if thought fit, approve the grant of a general mandate to the Directors to exercise the power of the Company to repurchase Shares during the period as set out in the Ordinary Resolution no. 5(B) up to 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the Ordinary Resolution no. 5(B). The Shares which may be repurchased pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate is up to 10% of the issued share capital of the Company on the date of passing the resolution approving the Share Repurchase Mandate.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 2,096,068,000 fully paid up Shares. Assuming that there is no change in the issued share capital of the Company between the period from the Latest Practicable Date and the date of passing the resolution approving the Share Repurchase Mandate, the maximum number of

Shares which may be repurchased pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate on the date of passing the resolution approving the Share Repurchase Mandate will be 209,606,800 Shares.

An explanatory statement as required under Rule 10.06 of the Listing Rules, giving certain information regarding the Share Repurchase Mandate, is set out in Appendix I to this circular. The Share Repurchase Mandate will expire upon the earliest of:

- (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company;
- (b) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles, or any other applicable laws to be held; and
- (c) the date on which the authority given under the Ordinary Resolution no. 5(B) is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders.

4. **RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS**

Article 86(2) of the Articles provides that the Company may by ordinary resolution elect any person to be a Director either to fill a casual vacancy on the Board, or as an addition to the existing Board.

Pursuant to Article 86(3) of the Articles, the Directors shall have the power from time to time and at any time to appoint any person as a Director either to fill in casual vacancy on the Board or as an addition to the existing Board. Any director so appointed by the Board shall hold office only until the next following annual general meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re-election.

Pursuant to Article 87 of the Articles, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three, the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation at every annual general meeting of the Company provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement at least once every three years and shall then be eligible for re-election.

Any Director appointed pursuant to Article 86(2) or Article 86(3) of the Articles shall not be taken into account in determining which particular Directors or the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation.

In accordance with Article 87 of the Articles, the following Directors, namely, Mr. TING Man Yi, Mr. TING Hung Yi, and Dr. CHENG Chi Pang will retire at the AGM and, being eligible, would offer themselves for re-election. Details of such retiring Directors are set forth in Appendix II to this circular.

5. AGM

Set out in Appendix III to this circular is the AGM Notice convening the AGM at which, among other things, resolutions will be proposed to approve the Share Issue Mandate, the Share Repurchase Mandate, the extension of the Share Issue Mandate, and the re-election of retiring Directors.

6. PROXY ARRANGEMENT

A form of proxy for the AGM is enclosed with this circular. To be valid, the form of proxy must be completed in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and deposited, together with the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of such power of attorney or authority, at the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event not later than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the AGM or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjournment thereof should you so wish.

7. VOTING BY WAY OF A POLL

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll. Accordingly, pursuant to Article 66 of the Articles, the Chairman shall exercise his power to demand a poll for all the proposed resolutions of the Company at the AGM.

8. **RECOMMENDATION**

The Directors believe that the grant of the Share Issue Mandate and the Share Repurchase Mandate, the extension of the Share Issue Mandate, and the re-election of the retiring Directors are all in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders. Accordingly, the Directors recommend all Shareholders to vote in favour of the relevant resolutions at the AGM.

This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide all the information in relation to the Share Repurchase Mandate for your consideration.

1. LISTING RULES RELATING TO THE REPURCHASES OF SHARES

The Listing Rules permit companies with a primary listing on the main board of the Stock Exchange to purchase their securities subject to certain restrictions.

2. SHAREHOLDERS' APPROVAL

All proposed repurchases of securities on the Stock Exchange by a company with its primary listing on the Stock Exchange must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution, either by way of a general mandate or by a specific approval for a particular transaction.

3. THE REPURCHASE PROPOSAL

The resolution set out as Ordinary Resolution No. 5(B) relates to the granting of a general and unconditional mandate to the Directors to repurchase on the Stock Exchange or any other stock exchange on which the Shares of the Company may be listed and recognized by The Securities and Futures Commission of Hong Kong, Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the passing of the resolution.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were 2,096,068,000 Shares in issue. Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the Share Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the AGM, the Company will be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 209,606,800 Shares during the period ending on the earliest of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by any applicable laws or the Articles to be held; or the date on which such authority is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

4. **REASONS FOR REPURCHASES**

Although the Directors have no present intention of repurchasing the Shares, they believe that it is in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders for the Directors to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase Shares of the Company on the market. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets value of the Company and/or its earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

5. FUNDING OF REPURCHASE

In repurchasing shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Memorandum of Association and the Articles and the applicable laws and regulations of the Cayman Islands.

It is presently proposed that any purchase of the Shares would be made out of profits of the Company or the proceeds of a fresh issue made for the purchase or out of capital provided that on the day immediately following the date of repurchase the Company is able to pay its debts as they fall due in the ordinary course of business.

As compared with the financial position of the Company as at 31 December 2010 (being the date of its latest audited accounts), the Directors consider that there is no material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company if the Share Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Share Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital or the gearing level of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in its most recent published audited accounts) which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

7. GENERAL INFORMATION AND UNDERTAKINGS

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), has any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company or any of its subsidiaries, if the Share Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

9. TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code.

Accordingly, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of the Shareholders' interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Longerview Investments Limited, being the substantial Shareholder (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company, together with its associates, was beneficially interested in 1,490,000,000 Shares representing approximately 71.09% of the issued share capital of the Company. In the event that the Directors exercise the Share Repurchase Mandate in full in accordance with the terms of the Ordinary Resolution no. 5(B) to be proposed at the AGM, the interests of Longerview Investments Limited, together with its associates, in the Company would be increased to approximately 78.98% of the issued share capital, which will not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code but will reduce the amount of Shares held by the public to below 25% of the total issued share capital of the Company.

The Directors have no intention to exercise the Share Repurchase Mandate to the extent that the purchase would result in the amount of Shares being held by the public to fall below 25% of the total issued share capital of the Company nor to the extent that would result in an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. Save as the above, the Directors are not aware of any consequences which would arise under the Takeovers Code as a consequence of any repurchases pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate.

Executive Director

Experience

Mr. TING Man Yi, aged 54, is the Chairman of the Group and an executive Director. Mr. TING started the business of the Group in December 1992 and has considerable experience in the silk fabric and silk garment manufacturing and trading business. Prior to establishing the initial company of the Group, Mr. TING worked for Hangzhou Silk Industrial Company (杭州市絲綢工業公司) from 1981 to 1986. Mr. TING is currently responsible for the overall strategic planning of the Group, especially in overseeing the expansive manufacturing industrial complex in Hangzhou, as well as the planning and implementation of major new investments and projects of the Group.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. TING did not hold any directorship in the last three years in public companies, the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas.

Length of Service

The renewed term of service of Mr. TING is 3 years commencing from 18 November 2008. The term of office of Mr. TING shall continue after the expiration of the initial term until at least 6 months' prior written notice or payment of 6 months' salary in lieu of such notice by either Mr. TING or the Company to terminate the same.

Relationships

Mr. TING is the elder brother of Mr. TING Hung Yi and Mr. DING Jianer, both executive Directors, and the younger brother of Ms. DING Yinger, the general manager (finance) of the Group in China. Mr. TING holds the entire issued share capital in Firmsuccess Limited which holds 41.5% of the issued share capital of Longerview Investments Limited. Longerview Investments Limited holds 71.09% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. TING has no relationship with any directors, senior management or substantial shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) or controlling shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Interests in Shares

So far as the Directors are aware as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. TING, through Firmsuccess Limited and Longerview Investments Limited, was interested in 1,490,000,000 Shares and is the ultimate controlling shareholder (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Directors' emoluments

Under the renewed service contract entered into between Mr. TING and the Company on 18 November 2008, Mr. TING is currently entitled to an annual salary of HK\$3,000,000 (subject to annual review by the remuneration committee of the Board and any annual increment shall not be more than 15% of the annual salary for the immediately preceding year). In addition, Mr. TING may also be entitled to a management bonus of such amount by reference to the audited consolidated net profits of the Group after taxation and minority interests but before extra ordinary items (the "Net Profits") in respect of each complete financial year of the Company during which his appointment hereunder subsists, provided that the aggregate amount of the management bonus payable to all members of the Board (other than the independent non-executive Directors of the Company) in respect of any financial year of the Group shall not exceed 4% of the Net Profits for the relevant financial year.

The Company's policies concerning remuneration of the Directors are as follows:

- (i) the amount of remuneration is determined by the remuneration committee of the Board on the basis of the relevant Director's experience, responsibility, workload and the time devoted to the Group;

Mr. TING graduated from Zhejiang Sci-Tech University (浙江理工大學), formerly known as Zhejiang Institute of Silk Textiles (浙江絲綢工學院), in 1987 and has over 20 years of experience in the operations of garment export.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. TING did not hold any directorship in the last three years in public companies, the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas.

Length of Service

The renewed term of service of Mr. TING is 3 years commencing from 18 November 2008. The term of office of Mr. TING shall continue after the expiration of the initial term until at least 6 months' prior written notice or payment of 6 months' salary in lieu of such notice by either Mr. TING or the Company to terminate the same.

Mr. TING is the younger brother of Mr. TING Man Yi, the Chairman of the Group, Mr. DING Jianer, an executive Director, and Ms. DING Yinger, the general manager (finance) of the Group in China. Mr. TING holds the entire issued share capital in In Holdings Limited which holds 40.5% of the issued share capital of Longerview Investments Limited. Longerview Investments Limited holds 71.09% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. TING has no relationship with any directors, senior management or substantial shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) or controlling shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Interests in Shares

So far as the Directors are aware as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. TING, through In Holdings Limited and Longerview Investments Limited, was interested in 1,490,000,000 Shares and is the ultimate controlling shareholder (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Directors' emoluments

Under the renewed service contract entered into between Mr. TING and the Company on 18 November 2008, Mr. TING is currently entitled to an annual salary of HK\$3,000,000 (subject to annual review by the remuneration committee of the Board and any annual increment shall not be more than 15% of the annual salary for the immediately preceding year). Dr. CHENG is a certified public accountant practicing in Hong Kong with over 30 years of experience in auditing and business advisory as well as financial management. Dr. CHENG was the chief executive officer and group financial controller of NWS Holdings Limited ("NWSH"), the shares of which are listed on the Stock Exchange. Prior to joining the NWSH, he was a senior manager of an international accounting firm. Dr. Cheng is now the senior partner of Leslie Cheng & Co. as well as an independent non-executive director and chairman of audit committee

of each of Nine Dragons Paper (Holdings) Limited, Tianjin Port Development Holdings Limited and Fortune Sun (China) Holdings Limited, all being companies listed on the Stock Exchange, and the chief executive officer of L&E Consultants Limited. Dr. CHENG is currently a non-executive director of Wai Kee Holdings Limited and Build King Holdings Limited, which are companies listed on the Stock Exchange.

Save as disclosed above, Dr. CHENG did not hold any directorship in the last three years in public companies, the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas.

Length of Service

Dr. CHENG entered into a letter of appointment with the Company pursuant to which he was appointed as an independent non-executive director for a term of 3 years commencing from 18 November 2008. During the term of appointment either Dr. CHENG or the Company may terminate the term of appointment by giving the other at least 3 months' written notice by Dr. CHENG to terminate the same. The Company may at any time by summary notice in writing terminate the same if Dr. CHENG commits any breach of any of his material obligations and/or undertakings under the letter of appointment or commits an act of bankruptcy or commits any act which would under any applicable laws, permit the Company to terminate his appointment.

Relationships

Dr. CHENG has no relationship with any directors, senior management or substantial shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) or controlling shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Interests in Shares

So far as the Directors are aware as at the Latest Practicable Date, Dr. CHENG was interested in the underlying 1,000,000 Shares resulting from the options granted to him by the Company pursuant to the share option scheme of the Company adopted on 18 November 2005. Dr. CHENG was also interested in 200,000 Shares of the Company.

Under the renewed letter of appointment entered into between Dr. CHENG and the Company on 13 November 2008, Dr. CHENG is currently entitled to director's fees in the sum of HK\$20,000 per month or such higher sum as the remuneration committee of the Company may from time to time decide.
