# RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS GENERAL MANDATE FOR REPURCHASE OF OWN SHARES AND AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

#### INTRODUCTION

At the ordinary yearly meeting (the "Ordinary Yearly Meeting") of China Motor Bus Company, Limited (the "Company"), the following resolutions will be considered:

(a) to re-elect directors of the Company (the "Directors");

- (b) as a special business to consider and if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as set out in Resolution 4 in the Notice of Ordinary Yearly Meeting as ordinary resolution:
  - a general mandate be granted to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase fully-paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company up to a maximum of 2% of the share capital of the Company in issue (the "Repurchase Mandate").
- (c) as special business to consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution (as set out in Resolution 5 in the Notice of Ordinary Yearly Meeting) as Special Resolution:
  - "THAT the Articles of Association of the Company be and are hereby amended as follows:
  - 1. in the first sentence of the existing Article 96, by replacing the full-stop immediately after the word "vote" with a comma, and adding the following words immediately after the comma:-
    - "unless a poll is required under the Listing Rules or is demanded as referred to in Article 97 of these Articles, in which case voting shall be taken by poll."
  - 2. in the first line of the existing Article 97, by adding the words "is required under the Listing Rules or" immediately before the words "is demanded by", and by adding the words "the chairman of the meeting, or by" immediately after the said words "is demanded by".
  - 3. in the existing Article 98, by adding the words "duly required or" immediately before the word "demanded" in the first line, and by adding the words "required or" immediately before the word "demanded" in the third line and also before the word "demanded" in the fifth line.
  - 4. in the existing Article 99, by adding the words "required or" immediately before the word "demanded" in the first line."

The purpose of this circular is to provide shareholders of the Company with the information necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the above resolutions at the Ordinary Yearly Meeting.

#### **RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS**

In accordance with Article 122 of the Company's Articles of Association, Dr. Henry NGAN, Dr. LIU Lit-mo, Mr. Fritz HELMREICH, Mr. Anthony Grahame STOTT and Mr. TSE Yiu Wah will retire from the Board with effect from the close of the forthcoming Ordinary Yearly Meeting and, being eligible, offer themselves for reelection.

The biographical details of all the directors to be re-elected at the Ordinary Yearly Meeting are provided in Appendix I to this circular. At the Ordinary Yearly Meeting, ordinary resolution will be proposed to approve their re-election.

#### GENERAL MANDATE FOR PURCHASE OF OWN SHARES

This section sets out the Explanatory Statement required to be sent to shareholders under the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities (the "Listing Rules") on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (the "Stock Exchange") in connection with the proposed ordinary resolution numbered 4 set out in the notice dated 21st October, 2009 (the "Notice") convening the forthcoming Ordinary Yearly Meeting. This document also constitutes the memorandum required under section 49BA of the Companies Ordinance (Chapter 32 of the Laws of Hong Kong). Reference in this document to "Shares" means fully-paid ordinary shares of HK\$2.00 each in the capital of the Company.

#### (A) Exercise of the Repurchase Mandate

The Directors believe that the flexibility afforded by the mandate granted to them to repurchase no more than 2% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the Ordinary Yearly Meeting, if the proposed ordinary resolution numbered 4 set out in the Notice is passed, would be beneficial to the Company.

As at 19th October 2009, being the latest practicable date prior to the printing of this Explanatory Statement (the "Latest Practicable Date"), 45,594,656 Shares are in issue. Assuming that the Company does not make any repurchase or issue of Shares during the period up to the date of the Ordinary Yearly Meeting, the Directors would be authorised to repurchase up to 911,893 Shares (being 2% of the share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date) during the period up to the next Ordinary Yearly Meeting in 2010 or the expiration of the period within which the next Ordinary Yearly Meeting of the Company is required by law to be held or the revocation or variation of the Repurchase Mandate by an ordinary resolution of the shareholders in general meeting of the Company, whichever occurs first. If the Company makes any repurchase or issue of Shares during the period up to the date of the Ordinary Yearly Meeting, the number of Shares which may be repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate will be adjusted accordingly.

# (B) Reasons for Repurchases

Repurchases of Shares will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and its shareholders. Such repurchases may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets and/or earnings per Share.

#### (C) Funding of Repurchases

Repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate will be financed entirely from the Company's available cash flow or working capital facilities. All repurchases will be made out of funds of the Company which are legally permitted to be utilised in this connection in accordance with its memorandum and articles of association and the laws of Hong Kong, including profits otherwise available for distribution.

There may be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in its latest published audited accounts as at 30 June 2009) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

#### (D) Disclosure of Interests

None of the Directors, and to the best of their knowledge, having made all reasonable enquiries, none of their associates, have any present intention, if the Repurchase Mandate is exercised, to sell any Shares to the Company.

No connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company and no connected persons have undertaken not to sell Shares held by them to the Company, if the Repurchase Mandate is authorised or approved.

#### (E) Directors' Undertaking

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Hong Kong.

# (F) Share Repurchases made by the Company

The Company has not repurchased any Shares in the previous six months on the Stock Exchange.

# (G) Takeovers Code Consequences

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares, a shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of the Hong Kong Code on Takeovers and Mergers (the "Code"). As a result, a shareholder, or group of shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of the shareholder's interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Code. As far as the Directors are aware based on the register of interests in shares and short positions maintained by the Company pursuant to section 336 of the Securities and Futures Ordinance (Chapter 571 of the Laws of Hong Kong), as at the Latest Practicable Date, no shareholder of the Company will become obliged to make a mandatory offer in the event the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. The names of the holders of 5% or more interests in the share capital of the Company and their interest in the Shares, together with their percentage interests before and after the exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full, are as follows:

Ngan Kit-ling, Ngan Kit-keung and Dr. Henry Ngan are persons acting in concert as defined in the Code. Their aggregate shareholding as at the Latest Practicable Date is 41.81%. In the event the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full, their aggregate shareholding will become 42.67%. Accordingly, they will neither be obliged to make a mandatory offer nor will the minimum public float requirement of the Company be affected in the event the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full.

#### AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

The Directors also proposed to amend certain Articles in the Articles of Association of the Company in the manner set out in the proposed Special Resolution 5 of the Notice of Ordinary Yearly Meeting.

#### **Explanatory Notes on Special Resolution No. 5**

With effect from 1st January 2009, the Listing Rules have been amended by the Stock Exchange to make voting by poll mandatory on all resolutions at general meetings of listed issuers.

Under the Company's existing Articles of Association, voting at general meetings shall be by a show of hands, unless a poll is demanded by the requisite number of members, or by member or members holding the requisite number of shares in the Company. Also, the chairman of the meeting does not have any power to demand a poll.

In order to ensure compliance with the requirement of the amended Listing Rules, it is proposed:-

- 1. To amend the existing Article 96 to provide that voting shall be taken by poll if required under the Listing Rules or if demanded in accordance with Article 97;
- 2. To amend Article 97 so as to give the chairman of the meeting the right to demand a poll as well; and
- 3. To make certain minor consequential amendments to Articles 98 and 99.

# APPENDIX II PROCEDURES BY WHICH SHAREHOLDERS MAY DEMAND A POLL AT ORDINARY YEARLY MEETING PURSUANT TO THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

Pursuant to Articles 96 and 97 of the Articles of Association of the Company, every question submitted to a general meeting shall be decided in the first instance by a show of hands of the shareholders present in person and entitled to vote, but a poll may be demanded (before a declaration by the chairman that a resolution has been carried or carried by a particular majority or lost or not carried by a particular majority) by:

- (i) at least four shareholders; or
- (ii) a shareholder or shareholders holding or representing by proxy or entitled to vote in respect of at least one-tenth part of the capital represented at the meeting.
