INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding certain resolutions to be proposed at the AGM to enable you to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against those resolutions.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

At the AGM, resolutions will be proposed for the Shareholders to approve, among other things, (i) the grant of the proposed Issue Mandate; (ii) the grant of the proposed Repurchase Mandate and the extension of the Issue Mandate; and (iii) the re-election of retiring Directors.

1. PROPOSED ISSUE MANDATE AND REPURCHASE MANDATE

At the AGM, the following ordinary resolutions will be proposed:

- (a) to grant the Issue Mandate to the Directors to allot, issue and otherwise deal with new Shares up to 20% of the number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing of the ordinary resolution granting such mandate;
- (b) to grant the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing of the ordinary resolution granting such mandate; and
- (c) to extend the Issue Mandate by an amount representing the number of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to and in accordance with the Repurchase Mandate.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue was 5,008,154,780 Shares. Accordingly, the exercise of the Issue Mandate in full would enable the Company to issue a maximum of 1,001,630,956 new Shares (assuming no Share is issued or repurchased after the Latest Practicable Date and up to the passing of the relevant resolution). The Directors believe that the granting of the Issue Mandate will provide flexibility and discretion to the Directors in the event that the Company becomes desirable to issue new Shares to raise capital to facilitate any expansion plan as the Directors consider appropriate, and it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders to continue to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Directors to repurchase Shares on the market. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and its earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

An explanatory statement, required by the Listing Rules, on the Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix I to this circular. It contains all information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the relevant resolutions.

2. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the executive Directors were Mr. Guo Deying, Mr. Jiang Chao, Mr. Li Bin, Mr. Jia Yueting and Mr. Liu Hong, and the independent non-executive Directors were Dr. Huang Dazhan, Mr. Xie Weixin and Mr. Chan King Chung.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Pursuant to Article 87(1) of the Articles, Mr. Guo Deying, Mr. Jiang Chao, Mr. Li Bin, Mr. Jia Yueting and Mr. Liu Hong shall retire from their respective offices at the AGM, and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election.

Details of the Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

3. PROPOSED REFRESHMENT OF THE SCHEME MANDATE LIMIT

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 23 May 2014, an ordinary resolution was passed by the Shareholders to approve the adoption of the Share Option Scheme and termination of the share option scheme adopted on 21 November 2004.

As at 23 May 2014, being the adoption date of the Share Option Scheme, the maximum number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all options to be granted under the Share Option Scheme was 213,470,900 Shares, being 10% of the Shares in issue on the date when the Share Option Scheme was adopted (the “Scheme Mandate Limit”).

As disclosed in the announcement of the Company dated 13 June 2014, the Company completed an allotment of 213,470,900 Shares pursuant to a bonus issue on the basis of one bonus Share for every existing Share held on the 3 June 2014. The Scheme Mandate Limit was adjusted to 426,941,800 Shares as a result of such bonus issue. Save as the adjustment, the Scheme Mandate Limit has not been refreshed since the adoption of the Share Option Scheme.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, out of the total of 301,696,000 options (representing 6.02% of the issued share capital as at the Latest Practicable Date) granted under the Share Option Scheme, no option was exercised, 282,208,000 options (representing 5.64% of the issued share capital as at the Latest Practicable Date) were outstanding, 19,488,000 options (representing 0.39% of the issued share capital as at the Latest Practicable Date) were cancelled and none of them was lapsed.

Unless the Scheme Mandate Limit is refreshed at the AGM, up to 144,733,800 Shares may be issued pursuant to the grant of further options under the existing Scheme Mandate Limit. It is proposed that subject to the approval of the Shareholders at the AGM and such other requirements prescribed under the Listing Rules, the limit on grant of options under the Share Option Scheme will be increased to the Refreshed Limit and, options previously granted under the Share Option Scheme or any other share option scheme(s) of the Company (including those exercised, outstanding, cancelled or lapsed in accordance with the Share Option Scheme or such other scheme(s) of the Company) will not be counted for the purpose of calculating the limit as refreshed.

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, the Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all outstanding options granted and yet to be exercised under the Share Option Scheme and any other share option scheme(s) of the Company at any time will not exceed 30% of the Shares in issue from time to time. No options shall be granted under any scheme(s) of the Company or any of its subsidiaries if this will result in the 30% limit being exceeded.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were 5,008,154,780 Shares in issue. Assuming that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the date of approving the refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit by the Shareholders, the maximum number of Shares which fall to be issued upon exercise of all options that may be granted by the Company under the Refreshed Limit would be 500,815,478 Shares, representing 10% of the Shares in issue as at the date of the approval of the proposed refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit to the Refreshed Limit by the Shareholders at the AGM. No outstanding share options of the Company will be lapsed as a result of the refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit.

Save for the Share Option Scheme, the Company has no other share option scheme(s) as at the Latest Practicable Date.

The Directors consider that, in order to provide the Company with greater flexibility in granting options to eligible person(s) under the Share Option Scheme, the Board decides to seek the approval of the Shareholders to refresh the Scheme Mandate Limit so that the total number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all options to be granted under the Share Option Scheme and any other scheme(s) of the Company shall not exceed the Refreshed Limit.

Conditions

As required by the Share Option Scheme and the Listing Rules, an ordinary resolution will be proposed at the AGM to approve the Refreshed Limit such that the total number of securities which may be issued upon exercise of all options to be granted under the Share Option Scheme and any other share option scheme(s) of the Company must not exceed the Refreshed Limit.

The adoption of the Refreshed Limit is conditional upon:

- (a) the Shareholders passing an ordinary resolution to approve the Refreshed Limit at the AGM; and
- (b) the Stock Exchange granting the approval of the listing of, and permission to deal in, the new Shares to be issued, pursuant to the exercise of any options that may be granted under the Share Option Scheme under the Refreshed Limit.

Application for Listing

Application will be made to the Stock Exchange for the granting of the approval of the listing of, and permission to deal in, the new Shares which fall to be issued upon the exercise of any options that may be granted pursuant to the Share Option Scheme under the Refreshed Limit.

According to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of the Shareholders at the AGM will be taken by poll except where the chairman, in good faith, decides to allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands and an announcement on the results of the poll will be made after the AGM pursuant to Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

5. ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN

A form of proxy for use by the Shareholders at the AGM is enclosed in this circular. Whether or not you intend to attend and vote at the AGM in person, you are requested to complete and return the enclosed form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and return it to the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong as soon as possible, but in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the AGM or any adjournment thereof. Such form of proxy for use at the AGM is also published on the website of the Stock Exchange at www.hkexnews.hk. Completion and return of the proxy form will not preclude you from subsequently attending and voting at the AGM or any adjourned meeting should you so wish.

6. RECOMMENDATION

The Directors consider that (i) the proposed grant of the Issue Mandate and the extension of the Issue Mandate; (ii) the proposed grant of the Repurchase Mandate; (iii) the proposed re-election of retiring Directors; and (iv) the proposed refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit are in the best interest of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole and accordingly recommend all Shareholders to vote in favour of all resolutions set out in the AGM notice.

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement as required under the Listing Rules, to provide the requisite information to you for consideration of the proposed Repurchase Mandate.

I. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company had 5,008,154,780 Shares in issue or an issued share capital of HK\$50,081,547.8. As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were outstanding share options entitling the holders thereof to subscribe for an aggregate of 434,724,800 Shares respectively.

Subject to the passing of the proposed ordinary resolution approving the proposed Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that none of the outstanding share options is exercised and no further Shares are issued, allotted or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the exercise of the proposed Repurchase Mandate in full would result in up to a maximum of 500,815,478 Shares, representing 10% of the total number of Shares in issue and a share capital of HK\$5,008,154.78, being repurchased by the Company during the period ending on the earlier of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by law or the date upon which the proposed Repurchase Mandate is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders at a general meeting of the Company.

II. REASONS FOR SHARES REPURCHASE

Although the Directors have no present intention of exercising the proposed Repurchase Mandate, they believe that the flexibility afforded by the proposed Repurchase Mandate would be beneficial to the Company and the Shareholders. At any time in the future when the Shares are traded at a discount to their underlying value, the ability of the Company to repurchase the Shares will be beneficial to the Shareholders who retain their investment in the Company as their percentage interest in the assets of the Company would increase in proportion to the number of Shares repurchased by the Company from time to time and thereby resulting in an increase in net assets and/or earnings per share of the Company. Such repurchases will only be made when the Directors believe that such exercises will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

III. FUNDING OF REPURCHASE

The Directors propose that the repurchase of Shares under the proposed Repurchase Mandate would be financed from the Company's internal resources.

In repurchasing the Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purposes in accordance with the memorandum of association and the Articles and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands. The laws of the Cayman Islands provide that the amount of capital repaid in connection with a share repurchase may only be paid out of the

capital paid up on the relevant shares (subject to the Articles and the laws of the Cayman Islands), profit or the proceeds of a new issue of the shares made for such purpose. It is envisaged that the funds required for any repurchase of Shares would be derived from the capital paid up on the Shares being repurchased and from the distributable profits of the Company.

The exercise of the proposed Repurchase Mandate in full will not have a material adverse impact on the working capital or the gearing level of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in its most recent published audited accounts as at 31 December 2015).

The number of the Shares to be repurchased on any occasion and the price and other terms upon which the same are purchased will be decided by the Directors at the relevant time having regard to the circumstances then pertaining.

IV. SHARE PRICES

V. DIRECTORS' UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the proposed Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Articles, the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

VI. DIRECTORS, THEIR CLOSE ASSOCIATES AND CORE CONNECTED PERSONS

None of the Directors or, to the best of their knowledge and belief having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their close respective associates has any present intention, in the event that the proposed Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders, to sell any Shares or other securities to the Company. No core connected person has notified the Company that he/she/it has a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company nor has undertaken not to do so, in the event that the proposed Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

VII. TAKEOVERS CODE

If, as a result of repurchase of the Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code and Rule 6 of the Repurchase Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of the Shareholder's interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

The Barrie Bay Trust is a discretionary trust set up by Mr. Guo and Ms. Yang and the discretionary objects of which include the children of Mr. Guo and Ms. Yang. Data Dreamland and Barrie Bay are interested in the same 1,014,256,870 Shares. Each of Mr. Guo and Ms. Yang is taken to be interested in the 1,014,256,870 Shares held by Data Dreamland as each of them is a settlor of the Barrie Bay Unit Trust and by virtue of the interests of their children under the Barrie Bay Unit Trust. In addition, as Mr. Guo is also taken to be interested in the 483,000 Shares held by Wintech Consultants Limited as he is one out of the three directors of Wintech Consultants Limited and the other two directors were accustomed to act in accordance with Mr. Guo's direction. Accordingly, Data Dreamland, Barrie Bay and Mr. Guo are interested in an aggregate of 1,014,739,870 Shares, representing approximately 20.26% of the issued share capital of the Company. In the event that the Directors should exercise the proposed Repurchase Mandate in full to repurchase Shares, the aggregate shareholding of Data Dreamland, Barrie Bay, HSBC Trustee and Mr. Guo will be increased to approximately 22.51% of the issued share capital of the Company which would not give rise to an obligation on them to make mandatory offers under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. The Directors are not aware of any consequences which will arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchases to be made under the proposed Repurchase Mandate.

Assuming that there is no further issue of the Shares between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of repurchase, the exercise of the proposed Repurchase Mandate in full will not result in less than 25% of the issued share capital of the Company being held by the public as required by Rule 8.08 of the Listing Rules.

VIII. SHARES REPURCHASED BY THE COMPANY

The Company did not repurchase any of its Shares whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise in the six months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

MR. GUO Deying

Mr. Guo, aged 51, is the chairman and chief executive officer of the Group. He is responsible for the Group's overall management and the strategic development. Mr. Guo has been the chairman, the legal representative and the general manager of the Group since its establishment in 1993. Mr. Guo has about 20 years of experience in wireless communication industry. Mr. Guo was certified as an engineer by Shenzhen City Engineering Technical Central Examination Board (深圳市工程技術中評委) in December 1991. He holds a master's degree in engineering from Shanghai Jiao Tong University (上海交通大學). Mr. Guo was appointed as a guest professor by Xidian University (西安電子科技大學) for its computer network and information security department in November 2003. In October 2004, Mr. Guo was accredited as Outstanding Entrepreneur of Private-owned Technology Companies in the PRC (中國優秀民營科技企業家) by China National Industrial and Commercial Association (中華全國工商業聯合會) and China Private-owned Technology Industrialists Association (中國民營科技實業家協會).
