INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding certain resolutions to be proposed at the AGM to enable you to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against those resolutions.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

At the AGM, resolutions will be proposed for the Shareholders to approve, among other things, (i) the grant of the proposed Issue Mandate; (ii) the grant of the proposed Repurchase Mandate and the extension of the Issue Mandate; and (iii) the re-election of retiring Directors.

1. PROPOSED ISSUE MANDATE AND REPURCHASE MANDATE

At the AGM, the following ordinary resolutions will be proposed:

- (a) to grant the Issue Mandate to the Directors to allot, issue and otherwise deal with new Shares up to 20% of the number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing of the ordinary resolution granting such mandate;
- (b) to grant the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing of the ordinary resolution granting such mandate; and
- (c) to extend the Issue Mandate by an amount representing the number of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to and in accordance with the Repurchase Mandate.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue was 5,033,407,480 Shares. Accordingly, the exercise of the Issue Mandate in full would enable the Company to issue a maximum of 1,006,681,496 new Shares (assuming no Share is issued or repurchased after the Latest Practicable Date and up to the passing of the relevant resolution). The Directors believe that the granting of the Issue Mandate will provide flexibility and discretion to the Directors in the event that the Company becomes desirable to issue new Shares to raise capital to facilitate any expansion plan as the Directors consider appropriate, and it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders to continue to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Directors to repurchase Shares on the market. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and its earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

2. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the executive Directors were Mr. Jiang Chao, Mr. Leung Siu Kee, Mr. Lam Ting Fung Freeman and Mr. Liang Rui, the non-executive Director was Mr. Ng Wai Hung, and the independent non-executive Directors were Dr. Huang Dazhan, Mr. Xie Weixin and Mr. Chan King Chung.

Pursuant to Article 86(3) of the Articles, Mr. Leung Siu Kee, Mr. Lam Ting Fung Freeman, Mr. Liang Rui and Mr. Ng Wai Hung shall retire from their respective offices at the AGM, and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election.

Pursuant to Article 87(1) of the Articles, Dr. Hung Dazhan, Mr. Xie Weixin and Mr. Chan King Chung will retire from their respective offices at the AGM, and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election.

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement as required under the Listing Rules, to provide the requisite information to you for consideration of the proposed Repurchase Mandate.

I. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company had 5,033,407,480 Shares in issue or an issued share capital of HK\$50,334,074.8. As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were outstanding share options entitling the holders thereof to subscribe for an aggregate of 147,046,000 Shares respectively.

Subject to the passing of the proposed ordinary resolution approving the proposed Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that none of the outstanding share options is exercised and no further Shares are issued, allotted or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the exercise of the proposed Repurchase Mandate in full would result in up to a maximum of 503,340,748 Shares, representing 10% of the total number of Shares in issue and a share capital of HK\$5,033,407.48, being repurchased by the Company during the period ending on the earlier of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by law or the date upon which the proposed Repurchase Mandate is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders at a general meeting of the Company.

II. REASONS FOR SHARES REPURCHASE

Although the Directors have no present intention of exercising the proposed Repurchase Mandate, they believe that the flexibility afforded by the proposed Repurchase Mandate would be beneficial to the Company and the Shareholders. At any time in the future when the Shares are traded at a discount to their underlying value, the ability of the Company to repurchase the Shares will be beneficial to the Shareholders who retain their investment in the Company as their percentage interest in the assets of the Company would increase in proportion to the number of Shares repurchased by the Company from time to time and thereby resulting in an increase in net assets and/or earnings per share of the Company. Such repurchases will only be made when the Directors believe that such exercises will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

III. FUNDING OF REPURCHASE

The Directors propose that the repurchase of Shares under the proposed Repurchase Mandate would be financed from the Company's internal resources.

In repurchasing the Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purposes in accordance with the memorandum of association and the Articles and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands. The laws of the Cayman Islands provide that the amount of capital repaid in connection with a share repurchase may only be paid out of the

capital paid up on the relevant shares (subject to the Articles and the laws of the Cayman Islands), profit or the proceeds of a new issue of the shares made for such purpose. It is envisaged that the funds required for any repurchase of Shares would be derived from the capital paid up on the Shares being repurchased and from the distributable profits of the Company.

The exercise of the proposed Repurchase Mandate in full will not have a material adverse impact on the working capital or the gearing level of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in its most recent published audited accounts as at 31 December 2016).

The number of the Shares to be repurchased on any occasion and the price and other terms upon which the same are purchased will be decided by the Directors at the relevant time having regard to the circumstances then pertaining.

IV. SHARE PRICES

Trading in the shares of the Company on Stock Exchange has been suspended with effect from 9 a.m. on 31 March 2017, so there are no highest and lowest prices at which the Shares have been traded on the Stock Exchange during each of the twelve months preceding the Latest Practicable Date. The last price of Shares of the Company on Stock Exchange before suspension was HK\$0.72.

V. DIRECTORS' UNDERTAKING

No core connected person has notified the Company that he/she/it has a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company nor has undertaken not to do so, in the event that the proposed Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

VII. TAKEOVERS CODE

If, as a result of repurchase of the Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code and Rule 6 of the Repurchase Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of the Shareholder's interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.
