**INTRODUCTION**

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with the information in respect of resolutions to be proposed at the AGM for (i) the granting of general mandates to the Directors to issue and repurchase Shares and (ii) the re-election of Directors, and other relevant information regarding the AGM.

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## LETTER FROM THE BOARD

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### GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 27 November 2009, general mandates were given to the Directors to issue and repurchase Shares (collectively referred to as “Existing General Mandates”). The Existing General Mandates will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. Accordingly, new general mandates to issue and to repurchase Shares of not more than 10% of the share capital of the Company in issue (“New General Mandate(s)”) would be proposed to GGL shareholders at the AGM. Details of the proposed New General Mandates are set out in resolution nos. 7, 8 and 9 of the notice of the AGM on pages 11 to 14 of this circular. With reference to the New General Mandates, the Directors wish to state that, as at the date hereof, they have no immediate plans to repurchase any existing Shares or to issue any new Shares pursuant to the relevant mandates.

An explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to be sent to GGL shareholders in connection with the proposed New General Mandate to repurchase Shares up to 10% of the share capital of the Company in issue is set out in Appendix I to this circular. The explanatory statement contains all information reasonably necessary to enable GGL shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the relevant resolution at the AGM.

### RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

In accordance with Bye-Law 99 and Code A.4.2 of the Code of Corporate Governance Practices of the Company, Messrs Ding Wai Chuen, Kwek Leng San and Volker Stoeckel will retire from office by rotation at the AGM and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election. Details of such Directors required to be disclosed under the Listing Rules are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

### RECOMMENDATION

The Directors believe that the granting of the New General Mandates and the re-election of the said Directors are in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Directors recommend GGL shareholders to vote in favour of the relevant resolutions set out in the notice of the AGM on pages 11 to 14 of this circular.

**GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES**

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed that the Directors be given a general and unconditional mandate (the “Repurchase Mandate”) to exercise all the powers of the Company to repurchase on the Stock Exchange the issued and fully paid Shares. Under such mandate, the number of Shares that the Company may repurchase shall not exceed 10% of the share capital of the Company in issue on the date of passing the resolution.

GGL shareholders should note that the Repurchase Mandate covers repurchases made only during the period ending on the earliest of the date of the next annual general meeting of the Company, the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by its Bye-Laws or any applicable laws and the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied.

On the Latest Practicable Date, 329,051,373 Shares were in issue and fully paid. Assuming that there are no changes (from the Latest Practicable Date to the date of the AGM) in the Company’s issued and fully paid share capital, the maximum number of Shares that may be repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate will be 32,905,137.

**DIRECTORS AND CONNECTED PERSONS**

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge and belief having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their associates (as defined under the Listing Rules), has a present intention, in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by GGL shareholders, to sell Shares to the Company on the Stock Exchange.

No persons who are connected persons (who are the directors, chief executive or substantial shareholders of the Company or any of its subsidiaries or their associates (as defined in the Listing Rules)) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company or have undertaken not to sell any of the Shares held by them to the Company, in the event that the Company is authorised to make repurchases of Shares, on the Stock Exchange.

**DIRECTORS’ UNDERTAKING**

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the powers of the Company to make repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and all applicable laws of Bermuda and in accordance with the regulations set out in the Company’s Memorandum of Association and Bye-Laws.

**EFFECT OF THE HONG KONG CODE ON TAKEOVERS AND MERGERS**

If on the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a shareholder’s proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights and may give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Hong Kong Code on Takeovers and Mergers (“Takeovers Code”).

Based on the Company's record as at the Latest Practicable Date, GuoLine Overseas Limited ("GOL") and parties acting in concert with it held a beneficial interest of approximately 71.48% of the issued share capital of the Company. In the event of the Directors exercising in full the powers to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, assuming that no Share is sold by GOL, the shareholding of GOL in the Company would be increased to approximately 79.42%. The Directors are not aware of any general offer obligation which will arise under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchase made under the Repurchase Mandate.

### **PUBLIC FLOAT**

The Directors do not have a present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent, causing the public float of the securities of the Company to fall below 25%.

### **LISTING RULES FOR REPURCHASE OF SHARES**

#### **Shareholders' Approval**

The Listing Rules provide that all securities repurchased on the Stock Exchange by a company with its primary listing on the Stock Exchange must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution, either by way of general mandate or by specific resolution in relation to specific transaction.

#### **Reasons for Repurchase**

The Directors consider that the Repurchase Mandate will provide the Company with the flexibility to make such repurchases when appropriate and beneficial to the Company and its shareholders. Such repurchases may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share.

#### **Source of Funds**

Repurchases must be made from internal resources, borrowings and/or other funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Company's Memorandum of Association and Bye-Laws and the laws of Bermuda. The laws of Bermuda provide that the amount of capital repaid in connection with a share repurchase may only be paid out of either the capital paid up on the relevant Shares, or the funds of the Company that would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or the proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for the purpose. The amount of premium payable on the repurchase may only be paid out of either the funds of the Company that would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the share premium account of the Company.



On the basis of the consolidated financial position of the Company as at 30 June 2010 (being the date to which the latest published audited financial statements of the Company have been made up) and in particular the working capital position and gearing ratio of the Company and the number of Shares in issue, the Directors consider that there will not be a material impact on the working capital or the gearing position of the Company in the event that the proposed repurchases were to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. No repurchase would be made in circumstances that would have a material adverse impact on the working capital of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the latest published audited financial statements) unless the Directors consider that such repurchases were in the best interests of the Company.

As required by the Listing Rules, the following are the particulars of the three Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM:

1. Mr Ding Wai Chuen (“Mr Ding”), aged 50, was re-designated as an Executive Director since September 2009. He was previously an Independent Non-executive Director appointed since 2006. He is an associate member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales and a fellow member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (“HKICPA”). Mr Ding is currently a council member of the HKICPA.

Mr Ding is a non-executive director of Lam Soon (Hong Kong) Limited, a fellow subsidiary of the Company and a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange. Save as disclosed, he had not held any directorship in other public listed companies during the past three years prior to the Latest Practicable Date.

Mr Ding has over 25 years of experience as a professional accountant with international firms of accountants in England and in Hong Kong and with the HKICPA. In 2007, Mr Ding was appointed by the Hong Kong SAR Government as a member of the Financial Reporting Review Panel of the Financial Reporting Council (“FRC”). Since 2002, Mr Ding has been appointed by the PRC Ministry of Finance as a member of the Advisory Group of Foreign Experts for the development of PRC’s Independent Auditing Standards. Since the beginning of 2007, he has been involved, as an advisor to the HKICPA, in the joint projects between the HKICPA and the PRC Ministry of Finance for the comparison of Hong Kong and PRC accounting and auditing standards. Mr Ding is a member of the Railway Objections Hearing Panel.

Mr Ding is not related to any other directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr Ding had a personal interest of 5,000 Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance (“SFO”).

Mr Ding executed a service contract with a wholly owned subsidiary of the Company in 2009. His salary package is based on the terms of such service contract with a fixed salary and discretionary bonus linked to the Group’s performance and his personal achievement, which will be reviewed and approved by the Board Remuneration Committee of the Company. For the financial year ended 30 June 2010, total amount of his salary package was HK\$3,366,849. Mr Ding is not appointed for a specific term but subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the annual general meeting pursuant to the Bye-Laws. Mr Ding will retire and being eligible, will offer himself for re-election at the AGM. The proposed Director’s fee of HK\$52,657 payable to Mr Ding for the financial year ended 30 June 2010 is subject to GGL shareholders’ approval at the AGM.

Save as disclosed above, there are no other matters concerning Mr Ding that need to be brought to the attention of GGL shareholders and there is no other information to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules.

2. Mr Kwek Leng San (“Mr Kwek”), aged 55, is a Non-executive Director since 1990. He graduated from University of London with a Bachelor of Science (Engineering) degree and also holds a Master of Science (Finance) degree from City University, London. He has extensive business experience in various business sectors, including financial services and manufacturing.

Mr Kwek is a director and shareholder of Hong Leong Company (Malaysia) Berhad (“HLCM”), the Company’s ultimate holding company. He is also the President & Chief Executive Officer of Hong Leong Industries Berhad, Executive Chairman of Malaysian Pacific Industries Berhad and Managing Director of Narra Industries Berhad and a director of Hong Leong Bank Berhad, all Malaysian listed subsidiaries of HLCM. Mr Kwek is the Chairman of Southern Steel Berhad, a Malaysian listed associated company of HLCM. He is a director of Hume Industries (Malaysia) Berhad, an indirect subsidiary of HLCM which was privatised in April 2010. Save as disclosed, he had not held any directorship in other listed public companies during the last three years prior to the Latest Practicable Date.

Mr Kwek is a brother of Mr Quek Leng Chan, the Executive Chairman and a controlling shareholder of the Company and Mr Kwek Leng Hai, the President and CEO of the Company. He is also a cousin of Mr Kwek Leng Kee, a deemed substantial shareholder of the Company. Save as aforesaid, he is not related to any other directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr Kwek had a personal interest of 209,120 Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

There is no service contract being executed between Mr Kwek and the Company. Mr Kwek is not appointed for a specific term but subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the annual general meeting pursuant to the Bye-Laws. Mr Kwek will retire and being eligible, will offer himself for re-election at the AGM. The proposed Director’s fee of HK\$220,000 payable to Mr Kwek for the financial year ended 30 June 2010 is subject to GGL shareholders’ approval at the AGM.

Save as disclosed above, there are no other matters concerning Mr Kwek that need to be brought to the attention of GGL shareholders and there is no other information to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules.

3. Mr Volker Stoeckel (“Mr Stoeckel”), aged 65, is an Independent Non-executive Director since 2004 and is a member of Board Audit Committee and the Board Remuneration Committee. He graduated from the University of Munich in economics and also holds a diploma in banking.

Mr Stoeckel is a consultant for major companies in Asia for projects in Europe. He was Chairman and CEO of Metal Cast Zhong Shan Limited during the period from 2007 to 2009. He was also the Chairman and CEO of the German Centre for Industry and Trade in Shanghai until 2006 and was the Senior Executive Vice President and Chief Executive of Asia Pacific of Bayerische Landesbank, Regional Head Office, in Hong Kong until 2004. He had not held any directorship in other listed public companies during the past three years prior to the Last Practicable Date.

He held various senior banking positions in Asia for over 26 years. He also has wide ranging experience in capital markets, corporate finance, project finance, treasury and securities business, and property development of commercial and industrial projects in China.

Mr Stoeckel is not related to any other directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr Stoeckel did not have any interest in Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.
