INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to give you Notice of AGM and the information relating to the proposals for (i) the grant of the Repurchase Mandate; (ii) the grant of the Issue Mandate; (iii) the re-election of Directors; (iv) the election of a new Director; (v) the adoption of the New Share Option Scheme; and (vi) a special resolution to approve the proposed amendments to the Existing Bye-laws and adoption of the New Bye-laws.

GENERAL MANDATES TO REPURCHASE SHARES AND TO ISSUE SHARES

Pursuant to the ordinary resolutions passed at the annual general meeting held on 16 September 2022, general mandates were granted to the Directors to repurchase the Company's Shares and to allot, issue and deal with additional Shares of the Company. Such mandates will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. Therefore, ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the AGM that the Directors be given general and unconditional mandates to exercise all the powers of the Company to (i) repurchase issued Shares in the capital of the Company ("Issued Shares"), the aggregate nominal amount of which does not exceed 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing the resolution, i.e. up to a maximum of 60,449,076 Shares on the basis that the issued share capital of the Company comprised 604,490,763 Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the AGM; and (ii) allot, issue and deal with additional Shares not exceeding the sum of 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing the resolution, i.e. up to a maximum of 120,898,152 Shares on the basis that the issued share capital of the Company comprised 604,490,763 Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the AGM.

The Repurchase Mandate and the Issue Mandate will lapse at (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company (to be held in 2024); or (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Bye-laws of the Company or any applicable law to be held; or (iii) the revocation or variation of the authority given under these mandates by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting, whichever is the earliest.

The Directors have no immediate plans to repurchase any Issued Shares or to issue any new Shares pursuant to the above mandates.

An explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to be sent to Shareholders in connection with the proposed Repurchase Mandate is set out in the Appendix I to this circular and contains all information reasonably necessary to enable Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the resolutions.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

In accordance with Bye-law 86(2) of the Bye-laws, Mr. Lai Man-Pun, who is appointed as Director to fill a causal vacancy on the Board on 1 September 2023 will hold office until the AGM and, being eligible, will offer himself for re-election.

In accordance with Bye-law 87 of the Bye-laws, Dr. Cheung Tsang-Kay, Stan and Mr. Lie-A-Cheong Tai-Chong, David will retire from the Board by rotation at the AGM and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election.

Mr. Lie-A-Cheong Tai-Chong, David has served on the Board for more than nine years. During his term as an independent non-executive director, Mr. Lie-A-Cheong has demonstrated that he has the required character, integrity and experience to perform his duties by providing objective views and independent guidance to the Board. The Board also considers that the long service of Mr. Lie-A-Cheong would not affect his exercise of independent judgement. The Nomination Committee and the Board noted that Mr. Lie-A-Cheong (i) does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, substantial shareholders or controlling shareholders of the Company; (ii) is not involved in any relationships or circumstances which would interfere with the exercise of his independent judgement as an independent nonexecutive Director; and (iii) has been providing objective and independent views to the Company during his tenure of office. Based on the above, the Board believes that Mr. Lie-A-Cheong's long services will neither affect his exercise of independent judgement nor have any impact on his independence in the governance of the Group. Besides, the Nomination Committee of the Company has assessed and reviewed his annual confirmation of independence based on the independence criteria set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and affirmed that Mr. Lie-A-Cheong remains independent. The Nomination Committee and the Board are satisfied with Mr. Lie-A-Cheong's contribution to the Company as he has actively participated in the Board meetings and the Board committee meetings since his appointment as an independent non-executive Director, and has continued to present objective and impartial advice and suggestion to the Board. The Nomination Committee considers Mr. Lie-A-Cheong's skills and experience will continue to provide valuable insights and contribute to the diversity of the Board. As such, the Board considers that the re-election of Mr. Lie-A-Cheong as an independent non-executive director is in the best interest of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

Particulars of the Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM as required to be disclosed by the Listing Rules are set out in the Appendix II to this circular.

ELECTION OF A NEW DIRECTOR

With the recommendation from the Nomination Committee, the Board has resolved to propose the election of Ms. Wong Sau-Ling as an independent non-executive Director at the AGM, subject to and with effect upon the approval by the Shareholders at the AGM.

The recommendation of the proposed election of a new independent non-executive Director was made by the Nomination Committee in accordance with the Nomination Policy and Board Diversity Policy and has considered the Board composition, the candidate's commitments to her respective roles and functions and a range of diversity perspectives, including but not limited to gender, age, experience and background, skills, knowledge and length of service. The Nomination Committee has assessed and reviewed the written confirmation of independence of Ms. Wong pursuant to the independence guidelines set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and is satisfied with Ms. Wong's independence in accordance therewith. The Board considers that the election of Ms. Wong as an independent non-executive Director is in the best interest of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Upon election, Ms. Wong will become the member of the Audit Committee and the Nomination Committee of the Company.

At the AGM, a separate ordinary resolution will be put forward to the Shareholders in relation to the proposed election of Ms. Wong as an independent non-executive Director, for a term commencing from the date of the AGM which approves her appointment, her retirement by rotation at least once every three years and re-election pursuant to the Bye-laws of the Company. Particulars of Ms. Wong are set out in Appendix III to this circular.

ADOPTION OF THE NEW SHARE OPTION SCHEME

The 2013 Share Option Scheme and the New Share Option Scheme

The 2013 Share Option Scheme was adopted by the Company on 16 September 2013 and will expire on 15 September 2023. Unless otherwise cancelled or lapsed in accordance with the 2013 Share Option Scheme, the outstanding share options granted under the 2013 Share Option Scheme would remain exercisable.

In light of the amended Chapter 17 of the Listing Rules which came into effect from 1 January 2023 and in view of the expiry of the 2013 Share Option Scheme, the Board proposes to adopt the New Share Option Scheme. At the AGM, an ordinary resolution numbered 7 will be proposed for the Shareholders to consider, and if thought fit, to approve the adoption of the New Share Option Scheme. The provisions of the New Share Option Scheme will comply with the requirements of the amended Chapter 17 of the Listing Rules.

Save as disclosed above, the Company has no other subsisting share schemes.

Save for the outstanding options entitling the holder to subscribe for 4,000,000 Shares which were granted under the 2013 Share Option Scheme, there were no other outstanding Options entitling the holders thereof to subscribe for Shares under the 2013 Share Option Scheme as at the Latest Practicable Date. The Company does not intend to grant further share options under the 2013 Share Option Scheme.

As of the Latest Practicable Date, the Company has not formulated any concrete plan or intention to grant any Options to any Eligible Participants under the New Share Option Scheme in the next 12-month period after obtaining the Shareholders' approval for the adoption of the New Share Option Scheme.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best knowledge of the Directors having made all reasonable enquiries, no Shareholder has any material interest in the proposed adoption of the New Share Option Scheme. As such, no Shareholder is required to abstain from voting on the resolution in relation thereto. As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 604,490,763 Shares. Assuming that there is no change in the issued share capital between the period from the Latest Practicable Date and the Adoption Date, the maximum number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all options to be granted under the New Share Option Scheme and any other share option scheme(s) of the Company and the awards to be granted under any share award scheme(s) of the Company that involve(s) the issuance of new Shares (if any), in aggregate will be 60,449,076 Shares, representing 10% of the Shares in issue as at the Adoption Date.

Conditions precedent of the New Share Option Scheme

The New Share Option Scheme will take effect upon satisfaction of the following conditions:

- i. the passing of an ordinary resolution by the Shareholders in the AGM to approve the adoption of the New Share Option Scheme and to authorise the Board to grant Options to subscribe for Shares thereunder and to allot, issue and deal with Shares pursuant to the exercise of any Options granted under the New Share Option Scheme; and
- ii. the Listing Committee of the Stock Exchange granting approval for the listing of, and permission to deal in, any Shares to be issued pursuant to the exercise of Options granted under the New Share Option Scheme.

An application will be made to the Stock Exchange for the approval for the listing of, and permission to deal in, the Shares to be issued pursuant to the exercise of the Options.

Explanation of the terms of the New Share Option Scheme

A summary of the principal terms of the rules of the New Share Option Scheme is set out in Appendix IV to this circular. The purposes of the New Share Option Scheme are to:

- i. recognise and reward the contribution of certain Eligible Participants to the growth and development of the Group and to give incentives and motivation thereto in order to retain them for the continual operation and development of the Group; and
- ii. to attract suitable personnel for further development of the Group.

Eligible Participants

Eligible Participants include the Employee Participants and Related Entity Participants. In determining the basis of eligibility of each Eligible Participant, the Board would mainly take into account of the experience of the Eligible Participant on the Group's businesses, the length of service of the Eligible Participant with the Group, and the amount of support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions the Eligible Participant has exerted and given towards the success of the Group and/or the amount of potential support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions the Eligible Participant is likely to be able to give or make towards the success of the Group in the future.

i. For Employee Participants, assessing factors include: the individual performance, time commitment, responsibilities or employment conditions according to the prevailing market practice and industry standard, the length of engagement with the Group and the individual contribution or potential contribution to the development and growth of the Group.

ii. For Related Entity Participants, the Board shall take into consideration the degree of involvement in and/or cooperation with the Group, the length of collaborative relationship the Related Entity Participant has established with the Group, the amount of support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions the Related Entity Participant has exerted or given towards the success of the Group, and the amount of potential support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions that the Related Entity Participant is likely to be able to give or make towards the success of the Group in the future.

The Group has a close working relationship with the Related Entity Participants such as the directors and senior management of the Related Entities. The Related Entity Participants' contributions to the Group are material to the Company's success, long-term growth and profitability. Such Related Entity Participants may further add to the Group's expertise or refer new opportunities which may materialise into further business relationships for the Group.

The inclusion of Related Entity Participants under the New Share Option Scheme is therefore consistent with its purpose. The Board is of the view that it would be in the Company's interest to also have the flexibility to grant Options to the Related Entity Participants in recognition of their contribution to the Company.

The Directors (including the independent non-executive Directors) also consider that would be in the interest of the Group to include the Related Entity Participants under the New Share Option Scheme. This is because a sustainable and stable relationship with the Related Entity Participants is essential to the business development of the Group. Granting of Options to the Related Entity Participants would align their interests with the Group's interest and incentivise the Related Entity Participants to provide better services to the Group. The Directors believe that this would create opportunities for the Group and contribute to the success of the Group in the long run. More specifically, the Board (including the independent non-executive Directors) is of the view that the Company and the Related Entity Participants have always had a close working relationship. Despite that Related Entity Participants may not be directly appointed and employed by the members of the Group, such Related Entity Participants are nonetheless valuable human resources to the Group given their close corporate and collaborative relationships, they may be involved in projects or other business engagements relating to or having connections with the Group's business. As such, certain Related Entity Participants have joint involvement in work projects from time to time. Given the mixed workload and allocation of responsibilities, the Company feels that it is important to recognise the contribution or future contribution of such Related Entity Participants by giving them incentive through their participation in the New Share Option Scheme. In particular, for those Related Entities in which the Group has significant interest, their growth and development would contribute to the financial performance of the Group, thereby allowing the Group to share and benefit from the positive results of these companies. It is therefore in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders, and is in line with the objectives of the New Share Option Scheme to include the Related Entity Participants, whom the Company can incentivise with the grant of Options in order to strengthen their loyalty with the Group even though they may not be directly employed by the Group, and to in turn facilitate a higher

degree of collaboration and closer business relationships and ties between the Related Entities and the Group, and hence the Board is of the view that it would be in the Company's interest to also grant Options to those employees in recognition of such contribution to the Company.

Furthermore, the Board will take into account of numerous factors when assessing the eligibility of and contribution (or potential contribution) made or to be made by the Related Entity Participants. As further explained below, the Board also has the discretion to impose different terms and conditions (including but not limited to performance targets and vesting conditions) on Options to be granted to these Eligible Participants, which allows the Board to have greater flexibility to impose appropriate conditions in light of the particular circumstances of each grant, which would then be a more meaningful reward for the Related Entity Participants' contribution or potential contribution. Therefore, the Board (including independent non-executive Directors) consider that the proposed categories of the Related Entity Participants are in line with the Company's business needs and the industry norm since the business natures of these Related Entity Participants are those which may benefit the core business of the Company through a collaborative relationship. The Board also considers that the proposed categories of the Related Entity Participants are desirable and necessary from a commercial perspective and help maintain or enhance the competitiveness of the Group. Through the grant of Options, such Eligible Participants and the Group will have a common goal in the growth and development of the Group's business, and they could participate in the future prospect of the Group and share the additional reward through their sustainable contribution.

Pursuant to the Note to Rule 17.03(2) of the Listing Rules, the Company has sought legal advice on the prospectus requirements of the Companies (Winding Up and Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance (Chapter 32 of the Laws of Hong Kong) in relation to the New Share Option Scheme proposed to be adopted and understands that whilst the New Share Option Scheme is not restricted to executives and employees of the Group, the adoption of the New Share Option Scheme and the grant of the Options thereunder would not constitute an offer to public, and the prospectus requirements under the Companies (Winding Up and Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance (Chapter 32 of the Laws of Hong Kong) are not applicable.

Vesting period

The vesting period for Options under the New Share Option Scheme shall not be less than twelve (12) months. To ensure the practicability in fully attaining the purpose of the New Share Option Scheme, the Board and the Remuneration Committee are of the view that (a) there are certain instances where a strict twelve (12)-month vesting requirement would not work or would not be fair to the Option Holder or Selected Participant, such as those set out in paragraphs 7.2 of Appendix IV to this circular; (b) there is a need for the Company to retain flexibility to reward exceptional performers with accelerated vesting or in exceptional circumstances where justified; and (c) the Company should be allowed discretion to formulate

its own talent recruitment and retention strategies in response to changing market conditions and industry competition, and thus should have flexibility to impose vesting conditions such as performance-based vesting instead of time-based vesting depending on individual circumstances.

Hence, the Board and the Remuneration Committee are of the view that the shorter vesting period prescribed in sub-paragraph 7.2 of Appendix IV to this circular is in line with market practice, is appropriate and aligns with the purpose of the New Share Option Scheme.

Performance targets and clawback mechanism

Unless otherwise imposed by the Directors and stated in the relevant offer letter, there is no performance targets required to be achieved by any Option Holder before an Option is capable of being exercised by the Option Holder.

If performance targets are imposed on an Option Holder, the Board may assess such performance targets against common corporate-wide or subsidiary, division, operating unit, line of business, project, geographic or individual key performance indicators, which may include cash flow; earnings; earnings per share; market value added or economic value added; profits; return on assets; return on equity; return on investment; sales; revenue; Share price; total Shareholders return; customer satisfaction metrics; ratings; reviews; and such other goals as the Board may determine from time to time.

In relation to the clawback mechanism of the New Share Option Scheme, all Options granted which are unvested shall automatically lapse under certain circumstances specified in the New Share Option Scheme, such as the Option Holder ceases to be an Eligible Participant by reason of the termination of his employment or engagement on grounds that he has been guilty of misconduct, in breach of material term of employment or engagement contract, has become bankrupt or insolvent, or has been convicted of any criminal offence involving integrity or honesty, etc. For details of the circumstances in which Options which are unvested shall lapse, please refer to the paragraph 12(iii) in Appendix IV to this circular. Unless otherwise imposed by the Directors and stated in the relevant offer letter, and save as disclosed above, there is no clawback mechanism under the New Share Option Scheme for the Company to recover or withhold any remuneration (which may include Options granted to any Option Holder) to any Eligible Participants in the event of serious misconduct, a material misstatement in the Company's financial statements or other circumstances.

If a clawback mechanism is imposed on an Option Holder, the Board will take into account individual circumstances when devising such mechanism such as the role of the Option Holder, the purpose of the grant (for example whether as recognition of past contribution or as incentive to motivate such Option Holder to contribute to the Group in the future on an ongoing basis), whether it would be particularly burdensome and complicated to implement the clawback mechanism, whether there are any tax implications, etc.

The Board believes that it is in the best interests of the Company to retain the flexibility to impose appropriate conditions in light of the particular circumstances of each grant, which would then be a more meaningful reward for the Eligible Participants' contribution or potential contribution. Further, by allowing the Company to grant Options under the New Share Option Scheme at a subscription price which will be determined on a fair basis according to market value of the Shares and to impose such clawback mechanism and/or require the Eligible Participant to achieve such performance targets as may be stipulated in the offer letter on a case by case basis, the Company may be in a better position to retain such Eligible Participants to continue serving the Company whilst at the same time providing these Eligible Participants further incentive in achieving the goals of the Group, and therefore aligns with the purpose of the New Share Option Scheme.

Basis of Determination of the Option Price

Eligible Participants to whom Options may be granted, are entitled to subscribe for the number of Shares at the Option Price as determined on the date of grant. The basis for determining the Option Price is also specified in the rules of the New Share Option Scheme. The Directors consider that such basis will serve to preserve the value of the Company and encourage the Eligible Participants to acquire proprietary interests in the Company.

Value of the Options

The Directors consider that it is not appropriate to state the value of all the Options that can be granted under the New Share Option Scheme as if they had been granted at the Latest Practicable Date, given that various factors (such as the Option Price and other terms and conditions to which an Option may be subject) crucial for valuation cannot be predicted or ascertained and may vary from case to case. The Directors believe that any calculation of the value of the Options as at the Latest Practicable Date based on assumptions would be speculative and not meaningful, and indeed might be misleading to the Shareholders.

Document on display

Copies of the rules of the New Share Option Scheme will be published on the respective websites of the Stock Exchange at www.hkexnews.hk and the Company at www.heraldgroup.com.hk for display for a period of not less than fourteen (14) days before the date of the AGM and the rules of the New Share Option Scheme will be made available for inspection at the AGM.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Board had not made any immediate plan to make grants of Options to any Eligible Participants upon the New Share Option Scheme becoming effective.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE EXISTING BYE-LAWS AND ADOPTION OF THE NEW BYE-LAWS

The Board proposes to amend the Existing Bye-laws and to adopt the New Bye-laws as the bye-laws of the Company in substitution for and to the exclusion of the Existing Bye-laws in order to, amongst others, (i) bring the Existing Bye-laws in line with the amendments made to the Listing Rules (in particular to conform to the Core Shareholder Protection Standards as set out in Appendix 3 to the Listing Rules); (ii) to provide greater flexibility to the Company in relation to the conduct of general meetings by allowing (but not requiring) general meetings to be held in one or more physical locations, as an electronic meeting and/or as a hybrid meeting in addition to as a physical meeting; and (iii) to make certain minor housekeeping amendments to the Existing Bye-laws including making consequential and tidy-up amendments in connection with the proposed amendments as set out above (collectively, the "**Proposed Amendments**").

In view of the number of proposed changes involved, the Board proposes the adoption of the New Bye-laws incorporating and consolidating all the Proposed Amendments set out in Appendix V to this circular. Full particulars of the Proposed Amendments brought about by the proposed adoption of the New Bye-laws (marked-up against the Existing Bye-laws) are set out in Appendix V to this circular. The Proposed Amendments and the proposed adoption of the New Bye-laws are subject to the approval of the Shareholders by way of a special resolution at the AGM and will become effective upon the approval by the Shareholders at the AGM.

The legal adviser to the Company as to Hong Kong laws has confirmed that the Proposed Amendments to the Existing Bye-laws as set out in Appendix V to this circular conform with the requirements of the Listing Rules and the legal adviser to the Company as to Bermuda laws has confirmed that the Proposed Amendments do not violate the applicable laws of Bermuda. In addition, the Company also confirms that there is nothing unusual about the Proposed Amendments for a company listed in Hong Kong.

Shareholders are advised that the New Bye-laws are written in English and there is no official Chinese translation in respect thereof. Therefore, the Chinese translation of the New Bye-laws is provided for reference only. In case of any inconsistency, the English version shall prevail.

AGM

The notice convening the AGM is set out on pages 151 to 156 of this circular.

A proxy form for use at the AGM is enclosed with this circular. Whether or not you are able to attend the AGM, you are requested to complete and return the proxy form to the Company's share registrar in Hong Kong, Tricor Tengis Limited, 17/F, Far East Finance Centre, 16 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong in accordance with the instructions printed thereon as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time of the AGM or any

adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the proxy form will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjourned meeting should you so wish and in such event, the proxy form shall be deemed to be revoked.

VOTING BY WAY OF POLL

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll except where the chairman, in good faith, decides to allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted upon by a show of hands. As such, the chairman of the AGM will therefore demand a poll for every resolution put to the vote at the AGM pursuant to Bye-law 66 of the Bye-laws. The Company will announce the results of the poll in the manner prescribed under Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief, the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

RECOMMENDATION

The Directors believe that all the resolutions proposed for consideration are all in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders. Accordingly, the Directors recommend that you vote in favour of all the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT OF THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

This Appendix contains the particulars that are required by the Listing Rules to be included in an explanatory statement to enable the Shareholders to make an informed view on whether to vote for or against the resolution to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were a total of 604,490,763 Shares in issue.

Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the AGM, the Company will be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 60,449,076 Shares, representing 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders to have a general authority from Shareholders to enable them to repurchase Shares in the market. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets and/or its earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and its Shareholders.

3. SOURCE OF FUNDS

Repurchases must be financed out of the funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Bye-laws, the Listing Rules and the laws of Bermuda. A listed company may not repurchase its own securities on the Stock Exchange for a consideration other than cash or for settlement otherwise than in accordance with the trading rules of the Stock Exchange from time to time. Under Bermuda law, the amount of capital repaid in connection with a share repurchase may only be paid out of the capital paid up on the relevant purchased Shares, or out of the funds of the Company otherwise available for dividend or distribution or the proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for the purpose. The amount of premium payable on repurchase may only be paid out of funds of the Company otherwise available for dividend or distribution or out of the share premium account of the Company.

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited financial statements contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2023) in the event that the proposed repurchases were to be carried out in full as permitted by the general mandate to repurchase shares at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital or the gearing level of the Company which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

4. EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of share repurchases by the Company, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increase, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase in the Shareholder's interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 and Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code.

The following table sets out the shareholdings of the Shareholders having an interest in 5% or more of the issued share capital as recorded in the register required to be kept by the Company under Section 336 of the SFO as at the Latest Practicable Date and their shareholdings if the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, on the basis that the issued share capital of the Company remains unchanged up to the date of the AGM.

The Directors have no present intention to exercise the power to repurchase Shares to such extent which will trigger off the mandatory offer requirement under the Takeovers Code or which will result in the number of the Shares held by the public hands being reduced to less than 25%. Mr. Lai is entitled to receive an annual basic salary of HK\$1,820,000 and any discretionary bonus which the Company may decide to pay. Such emoluments are determined with reference to his duties and responsibilities within the Company, the Company's performance and profitability and the prevailing market conditions, subject to review by the Board and the Remuneration Committee from time to time.

2. CHEUNG TSANG-KAY, STAN, PhD, Hon LLD, Hon DBA, JP, aged 79, Executive Director

Dr. Cheung is the founder of a family trust which owned 64,689,760 Shares. Moral Excel Holdings Ltd., being a company which is owned by this trust and is interested in these Shares, and HSBC International Trustee Ltd., the trustee of this trust, are both substantial shareholders of the Company. Ms. Ng Yiu-Chi, Eleanor, the spouse of Dr. Cheung, is deemed substantial shareholder of the Company. Ms. Cheung Yee, Alice and Ms. Chang Kan, Jane, the sisters of Dr. Cheung, are substantial shareholders of the Company. Mr. Tong Shek-King, Denny, the spouse of Ms. Chang Kan, Jane and the brother-in-law of Dr. Cheung, is also a deemed substantial shareholder. Save as disclosed above, Dr. Cheung does not have any relationships with any Directors, senior management or substantial shareholders or controlling shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company. In accordance with the meaning of Part XV of the SFO, as at the Latest Practicable Date, Dr. Cheung was interested in 106,639,893 Shares of the Company. Save as aforesaid, Dr. Cheung has no other interests in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

There is neither any service contract between the Company and Dr. Cheung nor any specified length of service with the Company in respect of his appointment (except the retirement by rotation of Directors under the Bye-laws of the Company). Dr. Cheung is entitled to receive an annual basic salary of HK\$4,095,000 and any discretionary bonus which the Company may decide to pay. Such emoluments are determined with reference to his duties and responsibilities within the Company, the Company's performance and profitability and the prevailing market conditions, subject to review by the Board and the Remuneration Committee from time to time.

There is no information required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements under Rules 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules.

Save as disclosed above, the Board is not aware of any other matters in relation to the proposed re-election of Dr. Cheung that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

3. LIE-A-CHEONG Tai-Chong, David, SBS, OM, JP, aged 63, Independent Non-executive Director

Mr. Lie-A-Cheong Tai-Chong, David was appointed as an independent non-executive director of the Company on 16 June 2005. Mr. Lie-A-Cheong is the executive chairman of Newpower International (Holdings) Co., Ltd. and China Concept Consulting Ltd. He has been selected as a Member of the National Committee of the 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th and 13th Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference since 1993. Mr. Lie-A-Cheong is currently the Honorary Consul of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region ("HKSAR"), a Chairperson of the Hong Kong-Taiwan Economic and Cultural Co-operation and Promotion Council ("ECCPC"), a Standing Committee Member of the China Overseas Friendship Association and a former General Committee Member of the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce. He is also an independent non-executive director of Harbour Centre Development Limited and formerly an independent non-executive director of Aluminum Corporation of China Limited until June 2021, both being listed on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited. (i) According to a press release of the HKICPA dated 20 December 2019, the HKICPA has taken a regulatory action against another respondent, Ms. Wong (as the engagement quality control reviewer) and a firm of certified public accountants for their failure or neglect to observe, maintain or otherwise apply professional standards issued by the HKICPA for the initial accounting treatment of convertible note of a listed company and its subsidiaries for the years ended 31 March 2014 to 2017. As a result of resolving the complaint, that firm of certified public accountants, another respondent and Ms. Wong were reprimanded, jointly paid the financial penalty of HK\$35,000, and jointly paid the related costs of HK\$62,828 of the disciplinary proceedings.

PARTICULARS OF DIRECTOR PROPOSED TO BE ELECTED

In addition, Ms. Wong was a member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (the "ACCA") at the relevant time. Pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(vi) of ACCA, as Ms. Wong was liable to disciplinary action taken against her by the HKICPA, the Consent Orders Chair of ACCA concluded that Ms. Wong was to be reprimanded, and to pay costs of £1,002 to ACCA in July 2020.

- (ii) According to a press release of the HKICPA dated 18 June 2021, the Disciplinary Committee of the HKICPA reprimanded a firm of certified public accountants, two other respondents and Ms. Wong (as the engagement partner for the 2000 and 2001 audits) on 29 April 2021 for their failure or neglect to observe, maintain or otherwise apply professional standards issued by the HKICPA over twenty years ago for the expression of unqualified audit opinions on the financial statements of a listed company and its subsidiaries for each of the three years ended 31 March 1999 to 2001, and ordered that firm of certified public accountants, two other respondents and Ms. Wong to pay their respective penalties, of which the amount borne by Ms. Wong is HK\$150,000, and costs of the disciplinary proceedings of HK\$215,672 jointly and severally.
- (iii) According to a press release of the HKICPA dated 11 May 2022, the HKICPA has taken a regulatory action against a firm of certified public accountants, another respondent and Ms. Wong (as the engagement quality control reviewer) for their failure or neglect to observe, maintain or otherwise apply professional standards issued by the HKICPA for the misstatement of earnings per share disclosed in the financial statements of a listed company and its subsidiaries for the year ended 31 December 2015. As a result of resolving the complaint, that firm of certified public accountants, another respondent and Ms. Wong were reprimanded, paid their respective financial penalties, of which the amount borne by Ms. Wong is HK\$35,000, and jointly paid the related costs of HK\$142,905.07.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Board and the Nomination Committee of the Company are of the opinion that Ms. Wong is suitable to act as a Director under Rules 3.08 and 3.09 of the Listing Rules for the Company as the incidents set forth in the above did not involve any dishonesty, deliberate misconduct or concealment, or the receipt of inappropriate benefits or any ethical issues against Ms. Wong.

Save as disclosed above, there is no information required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements under Rules 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules, and the Board is not aware of any other matters in relation to the proposed election of Ms. Wong that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

SUMMARY OF THE PRINCIPAL TERMS OF THE RULES OF THE NEW SHARE OPTION SCHEME

The following is a summary of the principal terms of the rules of the New Share Option Scheme. It does not form part of, nor is it intended to be part of the rules of the New Share Option Scheme and it should not be taken as affecting the interpretation of the rules of the New Share Option Scheme. The Directors reserve the right at any time prior to the AGM to make such amendments to the New Share Option Scheme as they may consider necessary or appropriate provided that such amendments do not conflict, in any material aspects, with the summary in this Appendix IV.

1. PURPOSE OF THE NEW SHARE OPTION SCHEME

The purpose of the New Share Option Scheme is to recognise and reward the contribution of certain Eligible Participants to the growth and development of the Group and to give incentives and motivation thereto in order to retain them for the continual operation and development of the Group and to attract suitable personnel for further development of the Group.

2. ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS OF THE NEW SHARE OPTION SCHEME AND THE BASIS OF DETERMINING ELIGIBILITY

Eligible Participants are the Employee Participants and Related Entity Participants.

In determining the basis of eligibility of each Eligible Participant, the Board would mainly take into account of the experience of the Eligible Participant on the Group's business, the length of service of the Eligible Participant with the Group and the amount of support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions the Eligible Participant has exerted and given towards the success of the Group and/or the amount of potential support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions the Eligible Participant is likely to be able to give or make towards the success of the Group in the future.

For Employee Participants, assessing factors include: the individual performance, time commitment, responsibilities or employment conditions according to the prevailing market practice and industry standard, the length of engagement with the Group and the individual contribution or potential contribution to the development and growth of the Group.

For Related Entity Participants, the Board shall take into consideration the degree of involvement in and/or cooperation with the Group, the length of collaborative relationship the Related Entity Participant has established with the Group, the amount of support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions the Related Entity Participant has exerted or given towards the success of the Group, and the amount of potential support, assistance, guidance, advice, efforts and contributions that the Related Entity Participant is likely to be able to give or make towards the success of the Group in the future.

3. MAXIMUM NUMBER OF SHARES AVAILABLE FOR SUBSCRIPTION

- The total number of Shares which may be issued upon the exercise of all Options to be granted under the New Share Option Scheme and all options and awards to be granted under any other share option scheme(s) and share award scheme(s) of the Company (the "Other Schemes") shall not in aggregate exceed 60,449,076, representing 10% of the Shares in issue on the Adoption Date (the "Scheme Mandate Limit") unless the Company obtains an approval from the Shareholders pursuant to sub-paragraph 3.2 below. Options or awards lapsed in accordance with the terms of the New Share Option Scheme or Other Schemes shall not be counted for the purposes of calculating whether the Scheme Mandate Limit has been exceeded. If the Company conducts a share consolidation or subdivision after the Scheme Mandate Limit has been approved in general meeting, the maximum number of Shares that may be issued in respect of all Options to be granted under the New Share Option Scheme and options and awards to be granted under all Other Schemes under the Scheme Mandate Limit as a percentage of the total number of issued Shares at the date immediately before and after such consolidation or subdivision shall be the same, rounded to the nearest whole share.
- 3.2 The Company may seek approval of its Shareholders in the general meeting for refreshing the Scheme Mandate Limit set out in paragraphs 3.1 above under the New Share Option Scheme after three years from the date of approval by the Shareholders for the adoption of the New Share Option Scheme or the last refreshment. Any refreshment within any three-year period must be approved by Shareholders subject to that:
 - (i) any controlling Shareholders and their associates (or if there is no controlling Shareholder, Directors (excluding independent non-executive directors) and the chief executive of the Company and their respective associates) must abstain from voting in favour of the relevant resolution at the general meeting; and
 - (ii) the Company must comply with the requirements under Rules 13.39(6), 13.39(7), 13.40, 13.41 and 13.42 of the Listing Rules.
- 3.3 The requirements under paragraphs 3.2(i) and 3.2(ii) above do not apply if the refreshment is made immediately after an issue of securities by the Company to the Shareholders on a pro rata basis as set out in Rule 13.36(2)(a) of the Listing Rules such that the unused part of the Scheme Mandate Limit (as a percentage of the total number of Shares in issue) upon refreshment is the same as the unused part of the Scheme Mandate Limit immediately before the issue of securities, rounded to the nearest whole Share.

SUMMARY OF THE PRINCIPAL TERMS OF THE RULES OF THE NEW SHARE OPTION SCHEME

- 3.4 The total number of Shares which may be issued in respect of all Options to be granted under the New Share Option Scheme (in aggregate with any other options and awards to be granted under any Other Schemes that involve(s) the issuance of new Shares) under the Scheme Mandate Limit as refreshed shall not exceed 10% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of approval of the refreshed Scheme Mandate Limit. The Company shall send to the Shareholders a circular containing all such information as may be required under the Listing Rules.
- 3.5 The Company may seek separate approval by its Shareholders in its general meeting for granting Options beyond the Scheme Mandate Limit provided that the Options in excess of the Scheme Mandate Limit are granted only to Eligible Participants specifically identified by the Company before such approval is sought. In such a case, the Company shall send to the Shareholders a circular containing the name of each specified Eligible Participant who may be granted such Options, the number and terms of the Options to be granted to each Eligible Participant, and the purpose of granting Options to the specified Eligible Participants with an explanation as to how the terms of the Options serve such purpose and all such information as may be required under the Listing Rules. The number and terms of Options to be granted to such Eligible Participants must be fixed before approval by the Shareholders. In respect of any Options to be granted, the date of Board meeting for proposing such grant should be taken as the date of grant of such Options ("Date of Grant") for the purpose of calculating the Subscription Price.

4. MAXIMUM ENTITLEMENT OF SHARES OF EACH ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANT

Subject to paragraph 21 below, the total number of Shares issued and to be issued upon exercise of the options and awards granted to each Eligible Participant or grantee (including exercised and outstanding options but excluding any options and awards lapsed in accordance with the terms of such schemes) in any twelve (12)-month period up to the Date of Grant shall not exceed 1% of the Shares in issue at the Date of Grant (the "Individual Limit"). Where it is proposed that any offer is to be made to an Eligible Participant (or where appropriate, an existing grantee) which would result in the Shares issued and to be issued upon exercise of all options and awards granted and to be granted to such person (including exercised, cancelled and outstanding options and awards) in the twelve (12)-month period up to and including the relevant Date of Grant to exceed his, her or its Individual Limit, such offer and any acceptance thereof must be conditional upon approval by the Shareholders in the general meeting with such Eligible Participant (or where appropriate, an existing grantee) and his, her or its associates abstaining from voting. The Company must send a circular to the Shareholders disclosing the identity of the Eligible Participant or grantee, the number and terms of options to be granted (and options previously granted) to such Eligible Participant and the information required under the Listing Rules. The number and terms (including the subscription price) of options to be granted to such Eligible Participant must be fixed before the date on which approval of the Shareholders is sought and the date of the Board meeting for proposing such further grant should be taken as the Date of Grant for the purpose of calculating the Subscription Price.

5. ACCEPTANCE OF OPTION

Offers to grant an Option shall be open for acceptance in writing. Such acceptance must be received by the Board within a period of 10 business days inclusive of, and from, the Date of Grant provided that no such offer shall be open for acceptance after the expiry of the period of the New Share Option Scheme or after the New Share Option Scheme has been terminated or by a person who ceases to be an Eligible Participant after such offer has been made. An offer shall be deemed to have been accepted on the date when the duplicate comprising acceptance of the offer is duly signed by the Eligible Participant with the number of Shares in respect of which the offer is accepted clearly stated therein together with a remittance in favour of the Company of HK\$1.00 per Option by way of consideration for the grant thereof. Such consideration shall not be refundable.

Upon an offer of the grant of Options being accepted or deemed to have been accepted, each Option Holder gives the Company an unfettered right to publish an announcement relating to the terms of the offer in accordance with the Listing Rules.

6. PERIOD WITHIN WHICH THE OPTION MAY BE EXERCISED

Save as provided in paragraphs 7, 9 to 12 below, Options for the time being outstanding may be exercised in whole or in part at any time during the Option Period. In order for the exercise of an Option to be effective, the Board must, prior to the expiry of the Option Period, have received: (i) a written notice from the Option Holder exercising the Option, signed by or on behalf of the Option Holder and specifying the number of Shares in respect of which the Option is being exercised; and (ii) payment in full of the Subscription Price. Notwithstanding anything in provisions under the New Share Option Scheme to the contrary, the Option Period shall not be extended and, on the expiry of the Option Period, all rights in respect of an Option for the time being outstanding shall terminate, except in so far as there has been an effective exercise of that Option prior thereto and the Company has not discharged all its obligations under the New Share Option Scheme in relation to such exercise.

7. VESTING PERIOD OF OPTION

- 7.1 Save for the circumstances prescribed in sub-paragraph 7.2 below, an Option must be held by the Option Holder for at least 12 months before the Option can be exercised.
- 7.2 A shorter vesting period may be granted to Employee Participants at the discretion of the Board or a committee or any other authorised agent(s) as deemed appropriate at the sole discretion of the Board in any of the following circumstances:
 - (i) grants of "make-whole" Options to new Employee Participants to replace the share awards or options they forfeited when leaving the previous employer;
 - (ii) grants to an Employee Participant whose employment is terminated due to death or disability or occurrence of any out-of-control event;

- (iii) grants which are subject to the fulfilment of performance targets pursuant to paragraph 20 below (in lieu of time-based vesting criteria);
- (iv) grants the timing of which is determined by administrative or compliance requirements not connected with the performance of the relevant Employee Participant or Related Entity Participant, in which case the exercise date may be adjusted to take account of the time from which the Option would have been granted if not for such administrative or compliance requirements;
- (v) grants with a mixed or accelerated vesting schedule such as where the Options may vest evenly over a period of 12 months; and
- (vi) grants with a total vesting and holding period of more than twelve (12) months.

8. OPTION PRICE

The Option Price (subject to adjustments in accordance with paragraph 15 below) shall be determined on the Date of Grant at the absolute discretion of the Directors as an amount per Share which shall be at least the highest of (a) the closing price of the Shares as stated in the Stock Exchange's daily quotations sheet on the Date of Grant, which must be a trading day; (b) the average of the closing prices of the Shares as stated in the Stock Exchange's daily quotations sheets for the five (5) trading days immediately preceding the Date of Grant; and (c) the nominal value of the Shares on the Date of Grant, provided that the Option Price shall be subject to adjustment in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 15 below.

9. RIGHTS ON WINDING UP

In the event of the voluntary winding-up of the Company during the Option Period, each Option Holder shall be entitled, at any time not later than three (3) days prior to the proposed winding up resolution being duly passed, by notice in writing to the Company to exercise his outstanding vested Options, and shall accordingly be entitled, in respect of the Shares falling to be allotted and issued upon the exercise of his or her Option, to participate in the distribution of the assets of the Company available in liquidation pari passu with the Shares in issue on the date prior to the date of the passing of the winding up resolution. Subject thereto, all Options then outstanding shall lapse and determine on the commencement of the winding-up.

10. RIGHTS ON A GENERAL OFFER

If, in consequence of any general or partial offer made to all the Shareholders (other than the offeror and/or any person controlled by the offeror and/or any person acting in association or connection with the offeror), the Company shall use all reasonable endeavours to procure that such offer is extended to all the Option Holders on the same terms. If such offer becomes or is declared unconditional, any outstanding but unvested Options shall vest immediately, and each Option Holder shall be entitled to exercise his or her Option (to the extent not already exercised) at any time before the close of such offer (or any revised offer).

11. RIGHTS ON A COMPROMISE OR ARRANGEMENT

If a compromise or an arrangement between the Company and its members or creditors is proposed for the purposes of or in connection with a scheme of reconstruction of the Company or its amalgamation with any other company or companies, the Company shall give notice thereof to all Option Holders on the same date as it gives notice of the meeting to its Shareholders or creditors to consider such a scheme or arrangement, and any outstanding but unvested Options shall be treated as having vested immediately and thereupon any Option Holder (or his personal representatives) may at any time thereafter (but before such time as shall be notified by the Company) exercise his or her Option in whole or in part, and the Company shall in any event no later than three (3) days prior to the date of the proposed meeting, register such number of fully paid Shares which fall to be issued on exercise of such Option in the name of the Option Holder.

12. RIGHTS ON CEASING EMPLOYMENT, DEATH/DISABILITY OR DISMISSAL AND CLAWBACK MECHANISM

- (i) In the event of the Option Holder ceases to be an Eligible Participant because the Related Entity (to which the Eligible Participant is employed, holds directorship in or is a consultant therewith) ceases to be a Related Entity, then he may exercise all his outstanding Options within twelve (12) months after he so ceases and any such Options not so exercised shall lapse and determine at the end of the said period of twelve (12) months;
- (ii) In the event the Option Holder ceases to be an Eligible Participant by reason of death before exercising the Option in full and none of the events which would be a ground for termination of the Option Holder's employment, directorship, office, appointment or engagement under sub-paragraph (iii) below arises prior to his or her death, the legal personal representative(s) of the Option Holder shall be entitled within a period of twelve (12) months from the date of death, to exercise the Option up to the entitlement of such Option Holder as at the date of death in whole or in part (to the extent which has become exercisable and not already exercised);

- (iii) In the event that the date on which the Option Holder ceases to be an Eligible Participant by reason of the termination of his employment, directorship, office, appointment or engagement on the grounds that he has been guilty of misconduct, or has been in breach of material term of the relevant employment contract, service contract, agency contract or engagement contract (as the case may be), or appears either to be unable to pay or have no reasonable prospect to be able to pay debts within the meaning of any applicable legislation in relation to bankruptcy or insolvency, or has become bankrupt or insolvent, or has been served a petition for bankruptcy or winding up, or has made any arrangements or composition with his creditors generally, or has been convicted of any criminal offence involving his integrity or honesty or (if so determined by the Board or the board of directors of the relevant company, as the case may be) on any other ground on which an employer, or an engaging party would be entitled to terminate his employment, directorship, office, appointment or engagement at common law or pursuant to any applicable laws or under the Option Holder's employment, service, agency or engagement contract (as the case may be) with the relevant company (as the case may be) or the employment, directorship, office, appointment or engagement of the Option Holder is terminated by the relevant company pursuant to the contract thereof without notice, and a resolution of the board of directors of the relevant member of the Group (as the case may be) to the effect that the employment, directorship, office, appointment or engagement of an Option Holder has or has not been terminated on one or more of the grounds specified in this sub-paragraph shall be conclusive and binding, then all his outstanding Options shall lapse and determine on the date he so ceases:
- (iv) In the event that the Option Holder ceases to be an Eligible Participant by reason of his retirement in accordance with his contract of employment or service, any outstanding Option(s) may be exercised during the Option Period subject to the criteria and conditions set out in the option letter; and
- (v) For any reason other than as described in sub-paragraphs (i) to (iv) above, then all Options of his which are exercisable at the date he ceases to be an Eligible Participant may be exercised to the extent then exercisable within three (3) months of the date he so ceases and unless so exercised shall then lapse and determine;

Provided always that in each case the Directors in their absolute discretion may decide that such Options or any part thereof shall not so lapse or determine subject to such conditions or limitations as they may decide.

Save pursuant to paragraph 12(iii) and unless otherwise imposed by the Directors and stated in the relevant Offer Letter, there is no clawback mechanism under the New Share Option Scheme for the Company to recover or withhold any remuneration (which may include Options granted to any Option Holder) to any Eligible Participants in the event of serious misconduct, a material misstatement in the Company's financial statements or other circumstances.

13. DURATION OF THE NEW SHARE OPTION SCHEME

The New Share Option Scheme will remain in force for a period of 10 years commencing on the Effective Date ("Scheme Period").

14. LAPSE OF OPTION

An Option shall lapse automatically and not be exercisable (to the extent not already exercised) on the earliest of:-

- 14.1 the expiry of the Option Period;
- 14.2 the expiry of any of the periods referred to in paragraphs 9, 10 (unless otherwise determined by the Directors), 11 and 12 above;
- 14.3 the date on which the Option Holder commits a breach of paragraph 18 below, if the Directors shall exercise the Company's right to cancel any outstanding Option or part thereof granted;
- 14.4 the date on which the Option is cancelled by the Directors as provided in paragraph 16 below.

The Company shall owe no liability to an Option Holder for the lapse of any Option under this paragraph 14.

15. ADJUSTMENT

In the event of any alteration in the capital structure of the Company which may arise during the Scheme Period from any issue of shares in or other securities of the Company by way of reduction, subdivision or consolidation of the share capital of the Company or any capitalisation issue or rights issue, the (i) Option Price and/or (ii) the number of shares subject to options granted under the New Share Option Scheme shall be adjusted accordingly.

In the event of any alteration in the capital structure of the Company which may arise during the Scheme Period from any issue of shares in or other securities of the Company by way of consolidation or subdivision of the share capital of the Company after the Scheme Mandate Limit has been approved in general meeting, the maximum number of Shares that may be issued in respect of all Options to be granted under all the schemes of the Company under the Scheme Mandate Limit as a percentage of the total number of issued Shares at the date immediately before and after such consolidation or subdivision shall be the same, rounded to the nearest whole Share.

In addition, in respect of any adjustments under this paragraph 15, other than any made on a capitalisation issue, the auditors or independent financial adviser of the Company must confirm to the Directors in writing that the adjustments satisfy the requirements of the relevant provision of the Listing Rules.

16. CANCELLATION OF OPTIONS GRANTED

Options granted and accepted but not exercised may not be cancelled without the consent of the relevant Option Holder thereof and any new Options (or any other options) issued in replacement of Options cancelled may only be issued under the New Share Option Scheme (or the Other Schemes) with available Scheme Mandate Limit approved by the Shareholders as mentioned in paragraph 3 above. The Options cancelled will be regarded as utilised for the purpose of calculating the Scheme Mandate Limit.

17. TERMINATION OF THE NEW SHARE OPTION SCHEME

The Company by resolution in general meeting may at any time terminate the operation of the New Share Option Scheme before the expiry of the Scheme Period and in such event, no further offer to grant an Option shall be made but in all other respects the provisions of the New Share Option Scheme shall remain in force. Upon such termination, details of the Options granted (including options exercised or outstanding) and (if applicable) Options that become void or non-exercisable as a result of the termination under the New Share Option Scheme are required under the Listing Rules to be disclosed in the circular to the Shareholders seeking their approval of the first new scheme established thereunder or refreshment of any scheme mandate limit under any existing Other Scheme after such termination. All Options granted and accepted prior to such termination shall continue to be valid and exercisable in accordance with their terms and the terms of the New Share Option Scheme, and accordingly no relevant disclosure in relation to Options that become void or non-exercisable as a result of the termination will be included in the circular to the Shareholders as such disclosure is not applicable.

18. TRANSFERABILITY OF OPTIONS

An Option shall be personal to the Option Holder and shall not be transferable and no Option Holder shall in any way sell, transfer, charge, mortgage, encumber or create any interest in favour of any third party over or in relation to any Option, unless a waiver is granted by the Stock Exchange. Any breach of the foregoing shall entitle the Company to cancel any outstanding Option or part thereof granted to such Option Holder.

19. ALTERATION OF THE NEW SHARE OPTION SCHEME

19.1 Except with the prior sanction of the Shareholders in the general meeting, no alteration shall be made to the New Share Option Scheme altering to the advantage of the Option Holders (present or future) any of the provisions of the New Share Option Scheme as to the definitions of "Eligible Participant", "Option Period" and "Scheme Period" in sub-paragraph 1.1 of the New Share Option Scheme, the terms and conditions of the New Share Option Scheme which are of a material nature and all such other matters set out in Rule 17.03 of the Listing Rules.

SUMMARY OF THE PRINCIPAL TERMS OF THE RULES OF THE NEW SHARE OPTION SCHEME

- 19.2 No amendments to the New Share Option Scheme shall be made which would have the effect of abrogating or altering adversely any of the subsisting rights of the Option Holders except with such consent on their part as would be required under the provisions of the Bye-laws for the time being of the Company as if the Options constituted a separate class of share capital and as if such provisions applied mutatis mutandis thereto.
- 19.3 Change to the terms of the Options granted to an Eligible Participant must be approved by the Board, the Remuneration Committee, the independent non-executive Directors and/or Shareholders (as the case may be) if the initial grant of the Options was approved by the Board, the Remuneration Committee, the independent non-executive Directors and/or the Shareholders (as the case may be). This requirement does not apply where the alterations take effect automatically under the existing terms of the New Share Option Scheme.
- 19.4 An amendment of a material nature to the New Share Option Scheme may not be made by the Directors, without the prior approval of Shareholders in the general meeting.
- 19.5 The amended terms of the New Share Option Scheme or the Options must still comply with the relevant requirements of the Listing Rules.
- 19.6 Any change to the authority of the Directors or scheme administrators in relation to alter the terms of the New Share Option Scheme must be approved by the Shareholders in the general meeting.

20. PERFORMANCE TARGETS

The Board may decide, either generally or in any particular case, to treat a proxy appointment as valid notwithstanding that the appointment or any of the information required under these Bye-laws has not been received in accordance with the requirements of these Bye-laws. Subject to aforesaid, if the proxy appointment and any of the information required under these Bye-laws is not received in the manner set out in these Bye-laws, the appointee shall not be entitled to vote in respect of the shares in question.
- 82. A vote given in accordance with the terms of an 79. instrument of proxy shall be notwithstanding the previous death or insanity of the principal, or revocation of the instrument of proxy or of the authority under which it was executed, provided that no intimation in writing of such death, insanity or revocation shall have been received by the Company at the Office or the Registration Office (or such other place as may be specified for the delivery of instruments of proxy in the notice convening the meeting or other document sent therewith) two (2) hours at least before the commencement of the meeting or adjourned meeting, or the taking of the pollpostponed meeting, at which the instrument of proxy is used.
- 83. Anything which under these Bye-laws a 80. Member may do by proxy he may likewise do by his duly appointed attorney and the provisions of these Bye-laws relating to proxies and instruments appointing proxies shall apply mutatis mutandis in relation to any such attorney and the instrument under which such attorney is appointed.
