1. INTRODUCTION

The Company's existing general mandates to issue shares and to repurchase shares were approved by the Company in the annual general meeting held on 11 June 2018. Unless otherwise renewed, the existing general mandates to issue shares and to repurchase shares will lapse at the conclusion of the 2019 Annual General Meeting.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

In order to ensure flexibility when it is desirable to allot additional shares or to repurchase shares, the Directors will seek the approval of Shareholders to grant new general mandates to issue shares and to repurchase shares at the 2019 Annual General Meeting.

The purpose of this circular is to, inter alia, provide you with information on the proposed renewal of the general mandates to issue shares and to repurchase shares and on the retiring directors to be re-elected at the 2019 Annual General Meeting, so as to seek your approval of the related ordinary resolutions at the aforesaid meeting.

2. THE ISSUE MANDATE

Two ordinary resolutions, as set out in the notice of the 2019 Annual General Meeting, will be proposed for the following purposes:-

Ordinary resolution no. 5 – to grant to the Directors a general mandate to issue new shares up to a maximum of 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution; and

Ordinary resolution no. 7 – to increase the aggregate nominal amount of share capital of the Company which the Directors may issue under the general mandate if given in the Ordinary Resolution no. 5 by the aggregate nominal amount of share capital of the Company repurchased under the general mandate if given in the ordinary resolution no. 6.

The Company has in issue an aggregate of 230,076,062 Shares of HK\$0.10 each as at the Latest Practicable Date. Subject to the passing of the aforesaid ordinary resolution no. 5 and in accordance with the terms therein, the Company would be allowed to issue additional shares up to the aggregate nominal amount of a maximum of 46,015,212 shares on the basis that no further shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the 2019 Annual General Meeting.

3. THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

The ordinary resolution no. 6 as set out in the notice of the 2019 Annual General Meeting, will be proposed to grant to the Directors a general mandate to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase the Company's fully paid up Shares representing up to a maximum of 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution.

The Listing Rules contain provisions to regulate the repurchase by companies with primary listings on the Stock Exchange of their own securities on the Stock Exchange.

In accordance with the Listing Rules, the appendix to this circular serves as the explanatory statement, to provide you with the requisite information reasonably necessary to enable you to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolutions for granting of the Repurchase Mandate.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

4. INFORMATION OF THE RETIRING DIRECTORS TO BE RE-ELECTED AT THE 2019 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Mr. Chu Weiman (“**Mr. Chu**”), aged 61, was appointed as an executive director of the Company since February 2015. He is also the chief executive officer of trading division of the Company in China. He has held various senior positions in the reputable companies with operations in Hong Kong and China. Mr. Chu was stationed in China during the years between 1994 and 2000 and worked for US based multi-national companies. He was the board director and general manager of Shanghai Westinghouse Control System Company Limited, the managing director of Cutler-Hammer China, a subsidiary of Eaton Corporation.

During the years between 2000 and 2007, Mr. Chu held the position of branch director for Innovation Process and Automation Branch and branch director for Manufacturing Productivity Branch of Hong Kong Productivity Council. He also was the board director of Shenzhen Productivity Consulting Company and the Chairman of Shenzhen-Hong Kong Productivity Foundation. These Companies were the subsidiaries of the Hong Kong Productivity Council.

Mr. Chu has joined Leepport Tools Limited as the managing director since May 2014. Before he joined the Group, he was the Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of Screw and Fastener (HK) Company Limited, an engineering tools distributor in Hong Kong and China.

He also possesses strong relationship with the Hong Kong trade associations and the local government offices of various cities in China. He currently is a General Committee member of The Chinese Manufactures’ Association of Hong Kong.

Mr. Chu is a licensed Professional Engineer of the State of California and a member of the American Chamber of Commerce in Shanghai. He has a bachelor degree in Power Mechanical Engineering from Tsing Hua University, Taiwan; a master of science degree in engineering from University of California, Los Angeles; and a Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Southern California.

Mr. Chu did not hold any directorship in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years preceding his appointment nor has he held any other major appointments and qualifications.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Chu does not hold any position with the Company and its subsidiaries. He does not have relationships with any directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company for the purpose of the Listing Rules. Mr. Chu is interested in 1,000,000 shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Mr. Chu has entered into a service agreement with the Company for a term of 3 years commencing from 1 February 2015 and his appointment will continue thereafter unless and until terminated by either party giving three months' written notice in accordance with his service agreement. As a director of the Company, Mr. Chu is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at annual general meetings in accordance with the Bye-laws of the Company.

Mr. Chu's remuneration is HK\$1,440,000 per annum and a discretionary bonus in accordance with his service agreement which commensurates with his duties and responsibilities as executive director and the prevailing market situation.

Mr. Chan Ching Huen, Stanley ("Mr. Chan"), aged 61, has been appointed as an executive director of the Company since March 2003. He is also the company secretary and the chief financial officer of the Company. Mr. Chan is responsible for overseeing the Group's financial planning and control, and strategic investments.

Prior to joining the Group in October 2000, Mr. Chan held various managerial positions in the finance departments of several US based multi-national corporations in Hong Kong. He has over 25 years' experience in auditing, financial and accounting management. Mr. Chan is a fellow member of the Chartered Association of Certified Accountants of the United Kingdom and the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants respectively, and an associate member of the Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators in the United Kingdom. Mr. Chan graduated from the Hong Kong Polytechnic University with a Higher Diploma in Accountancy and he also holds a Master Degree in Business Administration from Brunel University in the United Kingdom.

Except for being a director of the Company, Mr. Chan did not hold any other directorships in the last three years in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas. He is the director of certain subsidiaries of the Group. Pursuant to Mr. Chan's service agreement with the Company, his appointment is for a term of 3 years from 10 July 2003 and would continue thereafter unless and until terminated by either party in accordance with his service agreement. As a director of the Company, Mr. Chan is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at annual general meetings in accordance with the bye-laws of the Company. Mr. Chan's existing remuneration is HK\$1,560,000 per annum. In addition, for each completed year of service, Mr. Chan is entitled to a bonus equal to one month's average salary, and a discretionary bonus as may be decided by the board of directors of the Company in accordance with the terms of his service agreement with the Company. Mr. Chan's remuneration, which is commensurate with his duties and responsibilities held, is approved by the Board with reference to the prevailing market situation for similar appointment.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Chan is interested in 1,156,000 shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO and he does not have relationships with any directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company for the purpose of the Listing Rules and save as disclosed above, he does not have any interests in shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Mr. Fung Wai Hing (“**Mr. Fung**”), aged 66, was appointed as an INED since 29 January 2019. He graduated from the Hong Kong Polytechnic in 1978 with an Associateship Diploma in Production and Industrial Engineering, and is an Awardee of ISE Distinguished Alumni Award 2012, granted by the Hong Kong Polytechnic University. In 1980, Mr. Fung obtained a Master of Science Degree in Industrial Management from the University of Birmingham, U.K., and in 1989, a MBA Degree from the University of Hong Kong. In 2016, he also obtained a Master of Arts degree, in Religious Studies from the Chinese University of Hong Kong. Mr. Fung was an employee of Leeport Machine Tool Company Ltd between 1981 and 1996. He started as a Marketing Executive, and retired as the Area General Manager of the company. In 1997, he joined Lung Kee (Bermuda) Holding Limited, the world largest mold base manufacturer and tool steel distributor, serving as an Executive Director of the company for 16 years. Mr. Fung has been very active in professional and community services. He was elected the President of Institute of Industrial Engineers (HK Chapter) in 1992-93. He served as a member of the Metals Committee of the Industry & Technology Development Council, Industry Department, HK Government, during 1993-97, and as a member of the Technology Committee during 1995-97. He was Secretary General of the Hong Kong Die-casting Association during 2007-08; and later, as Honorary President and Committee Member of the Hong Kong Die-casting & Foundry Association until 2014. He is currently a registered manager (SBM) of the Incorporated Management Committee of two Catholic schools.

Mr. Fung did not hold any directorship in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years preceding his appointment nor has he held any other major appointment and qualifications.

Pursuant to the appointment letter, the appointment of Mr. Fung is for a term of one year and thereafter may be extended for such period as the Company and Mr. Fung may agree. Mr. Fung remuneration is fixed at HK\$150,000 per annum, which commensurates with his duties and responsibilities as INED and the prevailing market situation. As a director, Mr. Fung is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at annual general meetings in accordance with the Bye-laws of the Company.

Mr. Fung had not previously held and is not, until his appointment as INED, holding any position with the Company and/or its subsidiaries. He is independent of the directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company for the purpose of the Listing Rules.

He does not have any interests in shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practice Date.

Mr. Wong Tat Cheong, Frederick (“**Mr. Wong**”), aged 63, was appointed as an INED since 29 January 2019. He is a member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Accountancy (with Honours) from the Hong Kong Polytechnic University and a Master of Public Administration (with Distinction) from the University of Hong Kong. Mr. Wong had extensive accounting and auditing experience in Hong Kong, Mainland China and United Kingdom. Mr. Wong was a former directorate civil servant of the HKSAR Government. He is currently a practicing Certified Public Accountant in Hong Kong.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Mr. Wong did not hold any directorship in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years preceding his appointment nor has he held any other major appointment and qualifications.

Pursuant to the appointment letter, the appointment of Mr. Wong is for a term of one year and thereafter may be extended for such period as the Company and Mr. Wong may agree. Mr. Wong remuneration is fixed at HK\$150,000 per annum, which commensurates with his duties and responsibilities as INED and the prevailing market situation. As a director, Mr. Wong is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at annual general meetings in accordance with the Bye-laws of the Company.

Mr. Wong had not previously held and is not, until his appointment as INED, holding any position with the Company and/or its subsidiaries. He is independent of the directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company for the purpose of the Listing Rules.

He does not have any interests in shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practice Date.

Save as disclosed above, the Board is not aware of any other matters or information that need to be brought to the attention of shareholders of the Company or to be disclosed pursuant to Rule 13.51(2) (h) to (v) of the Listing Rules in relation to the proposed re-election of the aforesaid retiring directors.

5. RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the directors of the Company collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

6. ACTION TO BE TAKEN

The notice convening the 2019 Annual General Meeting to be held at 2/F., Victoria Room, Mandarin Oriental, Hong Kong, 5 Connaught Road, Central, Hong Kong on Monday, 17 June 2019 at 10:30 a.m. is set out in this circular.

Pursuant to rules 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, the vote of Shareholders at the 2019 Annual General Meeting will be taken by poll and a scrutineer will be appointed by the Company for vote taking at the 2019 Annual General Meeting. An announcement on the poll vote results will be made by the Company after the 2019 Annual General Meeting in the manner prescribed under Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A form of proxy for the 2019 Annual General Meeting is also enclosed. Whether or not you desire to attend the 2019 Annual General Meeting, you are requested to complete the form of proxy and return the same to the Company's branch share registrar in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited at Level 22, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong in accordance with the instructions printed thereon not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the 2019 Annual General Meeting or any adjournment thereof. Completion and delivery of the form of proxy will not preclude you from subsequently attending and voting at the 2019 Annual General Meeting or any adjournment thereof if you so wish.

7. RECOMMENDATION

The Directors believe that the granting of the Issue Mandate (including the extended mandate stipulated under Ordinary resolution no. 7), the Repurchase Mandate are in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders as a whole. Moreover, for your consideration, adequate information regarding the re-election of the retiring directors at the 2019 Annual General Meeting is contained herein. Meanwhile, the Directors recommend that all Shareholders should vote in favour of the related ordinary resolutions to be proposed at the 2019 Annual General Meeting.

This Appendix I serves an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide requisite information to Shareholders of the Company for their consideration as to whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the 2019 Annual General Meeting for granting the Repurchase Mandate.

This explanatory statement contains all the information required pursuant to rule 10.06 of the Listing Rules which is set out as follows:-

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company has in issue an aggregate of 230,076,062 shares of HK\$0.10 each which are fully paid.

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution no. 6 as set out in the notice of 2019 Annual General Meeting and in accordance with the terms therein, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase fully paid shares up to the aggregate nominal amount of a maximum of 23,007,606 shares on the basis that no further shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the 2019 Annual General Meeting.

REASONS FOR SHARE REPURCHASE

Although the Directors have no present intention of repurchasing any shares of the Company, they believe that the flexibility afforded by the Repurchase Mandate would be beneficial to the Company and its Shareholders. Trading conditions on the Stock Exchange have sometimes been volatile. At any time in the future when Shares are trading at a discount to their underlying value, the ability of the Company to repurchase shares will be beneficial to those Shareholders who retain their investment in the Company since their interests in the assets of the Company would increase in proportion to the number of shares repurchased by the Company and thereby resulting in an increase in net asset value and/or earnings per share of the Company. Such repurchases will only be made when the Directors believe that the repurchases will benefit the Company and its Shareholders as a whole.

FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

The Company is empowered by its memorandum of association and bye-laws to repurchase its shares. In repurchasing shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its memorandum of association and bye-laws and the applicable laws of Bermuda. In repurchasing shares, the Directors will only apply funds out of the capital paid up on the relevant shares or the funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or the proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for the purpose in accordance with Bermuda laws. Regarding the amount of premium (if any) payable on a repurchase, the Directors will only apply funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the share premium account of the Company. The Shares so repurchased will be cancelled but the aggregate amount of authorized share capital will not be reduced.

REPURCHASES MADE BY THE COMPANY

Neither the Company nor any of its subsidiaries has purchased any of the Company's Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the six months immediately preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

POSSIBLE MATERIAL ADVERSE IMPACT

There might be material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts for the year ended 31 December 2018) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate was to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the Company's working capital requirements or the gearing levels. The number of Shares to be repurchased on any occasion and the price and other terms upon which the same are repurchased will be decided by the Directors at the relevant time having regard to the circumstances then pertaining.

DIRECTORS' UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the powers of the Company to make repurchases under the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and laws of Bermuda and in accordance with the regulations set out in the memorandum of association and bye-laws of the Company.

EFFECT OF HONG KONG CODE ON TAKEOVERS AND MERGERS

If as a result of share repurchase by the Company, a substantial shareholder's proportionate interest in voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or group of Shareholders acting in concert, could, depending on the level of increase in the interest of shareholdings, obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.
