PROPOSED GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE SHARES AND TO BUY-BACK SHARES PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS AND NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM involving (1) the general mandates to allot, issue and deal with additional Shares and to buy-back Shares; and (2) the re-election of retiring Directors.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

GENERAL MANDATES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 6 June 2016, the then Shareholders passed resolutions granting general mandates to the Directors to allot, issue and deal with and buy-back Shares respectively. These general mandates will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. Resolutions will therefore be proposed at the AGM to be held at No. 2-6, Dai King Street, Tai Po Industrial Estate, Tai Po, New Territories, Hong Kong on 6 June 2017 to renew the grant of these general mandates. The relevant resolutions, in summary, are:

- an ordinary resolution to give the Directors an unconditional general mandate to allot, issue and deal with additional Shares (including, inter alia, offers, agreements, options, warrants or similar rights in respect thereof) not exceeding 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the relevant resolution for the period from the close of the AGM until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company (or such earlier period as stated in the resolution) (the "Issue Mandate");
- an ordinary resolution to give the Directors a general and unconditional mandate to exercise all the powers of the Company to buy-back such number of Shares not exceeding 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the relevant resolution for the period from the close of the AGM until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company (or such earlier period as stated in the resolution) (the "Buy-back Mandate"); and
- conditional on the passing of the resolutions to grant the Issue Mandate and the Buy-back Mandate, an ordinary resolution to authorise the Directors to exercise the powers to allot, issue and deal with additional Shares under the Issue Mandate by adding those Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate.

The explanatory statement providing the requisite information regarding the Buy-back Mandate as required to be sent to the Shareholders under the Listing Rules is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

In accordance with Article 86(3) of the Articles of Association, Mr. XIA Bing and Mr. HE Di, being new Directors appointed by the Board, shall retire from office at the AGM and will be eligible for re-election. In accordance with Article 87 of the Articles of Association, Mr. WANG Ji Yan (being executive Director), Mr. SHA Yuejia (being non-executive Director) and Mr. Thaddeus Thomas BECZAK (being independent non-executive Director) shall retire by rotation at the AGM. All of them, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the AGM.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Mr. Thaddeus Thomas BECZAK has served the Board as the independent non-executive Director for more than nine years and his re-election will be subject to a separate resolution to be approved by the Shareholders. Mr. BECZAK has made an annual confirmation of independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. Notwithstanding the length of his tenure, the Board is satisfied that, as well proven by the valuable independent judgment, advice and objective views given by Mr. BECZAK over the years, Mr. BECZAK is of such character, integrity and experience commensurate with the office of independent non-executive Director. The Board is not aware of any circumstance that might influence Mr. BECZAK's independence and considers the re-election of Mr. BECZAK as independent non-executive Director is in the best interest of the Company and Shareholders as a whole.

Particulars of each of the retiring Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

A notice of the AGM is set out on pages 17 to 21 of this circular. At the AGM, in addition to the ordinary businesses of the meeting, resolutions nos. 10 to 12 will be proposed to approve the general mandates for the issue and buy-back of Shares as special businesses.

A form of proxy for the AGM is also enclosed. Whether or not you intend to be present at the AGM, you are requested to complete the form of proxy and return it to the branch share registrar of the Company, Hong Kong Registrars Limited at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong in accordance with the instructions printed thereon not less than 48 hours before the time fixed for the meeting. The completion of a form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting at the meeting in person.

VOTING AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, all votes of the Shareholders at general meeting must be taken by poll. An announcement on the poll results will be published by the Company after the AGM in the manner prescribed under Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

RECOMMENDATION

The Directors are of the opinion that the proposals referred to above are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole and therefore recommend the Shareholders to vote in favour of the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

RESPONSIBILITY OF DIRECTORS

This circular includes particulars given in compliance with the Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility for the accuracy of the information contained in this circular and confirm, having made all reasonable enquiries, that to the best of their knowledge and belief, there are no other facts the omission of which would make any statement contained herein misleading.

This is the explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to be given to all the Shareholders relating to a resolution to be proposed at the AGM authorising the Buy-back Mandate.

1. EXERCISE OF THE BUY-BACK MANDATE

Exercise in full of the Buy-back Mandate, on the basis of 4,993,469,500 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming no further Shares will be issued or buy-back by the Company before the AGM, could result in up to 499,346,950 Shares being repurchased by the Company during the period from the passing of the resolution relating to the Buy-back Mandate up to the earliest of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles of Association or any applicable laws to be held; and (iii) the revocation, variation or renewal of the Buy-back Mandate by ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

2. REASONS FOR BUY-BACKS

Buy-backs of Shares will only be made when the Directors believe that such buy-backs will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Such buy-backs may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or its earnings per Share.

3. FUNDING OF BUY-BACKS

In buying back the Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Articles of Association and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

4. GENERAL

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the latest published audited accounts as contained in the Annual Report 2016) in the event that the Buy-back Mandate is exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Buy-back Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or on the gearing levels, which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

5. DIRECTORS AND CORE CONNECTED PERSONS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best knowledge of the Directors having made all reasonable enquiries, none of the Directors and their close associates has a present intention, in the event that the Buy-back Mandate is approved and exercised, to sell Shares to the Company. No core connected person of the Company (as defined in the Listing Rules) has notified the Company that he has a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or has undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Buy-back Mandate is approved and exercised.

6. UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the Buy-back Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the memorandum of association of the Company, the Articles of Association and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

7. TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of a buy-back of Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (within the meaning under the Takeovers Code), depending on the level of increase in the Shareholder's interests, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Today's Asia which is a substantial shareholder of the Company, was interested in 1,854,000,000 Shares representing approximately 37.13% of the total issued share capital of the Company. Subject to the granting of a waiver from the Executive Director of the Corporate Finance Division of the Securities and Futures Commission, any increase in shareholdings in the Company which is outside the 2% creeper as specified in Rule 26.1 of the Takeovers Code will give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer for the Company under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. In the event that the Directors should exercise in full the power to buy-back Shares under the Buy-back Mandate (if so approved), the shareholdings of Today's Asia in the Company. If so, this may give rise to an obligation on Today's Asia to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. However, the Directors have no present intention to exercise the Buy-back Mandate to such an extent as would result in any takeover obligation.

Assuming that none of the outstanding share options of the Company is exercised and no further issue or allotment of Shares between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of a buy-back, the exercise of the Buy-back Mandate in whole or in part might result in less than 25% of the total issued share capital of the Company being held by the public as required by Rule 8.08 of the Listing Rules. The Directors, however, have no intention to exercise the Buy-back Mandate to an extent as may result in a public shareholding of less than such prescribed minimum percentage.

He is a professor-level senior engineer with over 34 years of experience in the telecommunications industry.

Mr. Thaddeus Thomas BECZAK

Mr. Thaddeus Thomas BECZAK, aged 66, has been appointed as an independent non-executive Director and a member of the audit committee of the Company since 11 March 2005. He is also a member of the nomination, remuneration and risk management committees of the Company. Mr. BECZAK is currently an independent non-executive director of Singapore Exchange Limited (also acted as member of its risk management committee and regulatory conflicts committee), Pacific Online Limited (also acted as member of its audit committee, nomination committee and remuneration committee) and China Minsheng Financial Holding Corporation Limited (also acted as member of its remuneration committee).

Mr. BECZAK is not appointed for a specific term and is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Articles of Association. Mr. BECZAK is entitled to receive from the Company a director's fee at such rate as approved by the Shareholders, currently being HK\$250,000 per annum.
