# PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS AND PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATES TO REPURCHASE SHARES AND TO ISSUE SHARES AND NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

## 1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders with information in respect of certain resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to be held on 15 June 2020.

## 2. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

In accordance with Article 84(1) of the Articles of Association, Mr. Wang Shiguang and Mr. Ong King Keung shall retire at the Annual General Meeting. In addition, Mr. Tang Andong (who has been appointed as an executive Director by the Board on 31 July 2019), Mr. Zhou, Francis Bingrong (who has been appointed as a non-executive Director by the Board on 19 November 2019), Ms. Lo Wan Man (who has been appointed as an independent non-executive Director by the Board on 29 May 2019) and Mr. Zou Heqiang (who has been appointed as an independent non-executive Director by the Board on 29 May 2019) shall hold office until the Annual General Meeting pursuant to Article 83(3) of the Articles of Association. All of the above retiring Directors, being eligible, will offer themselves for reelection at the Annual General Meeting.

Each of Mr. Ong King Keung, Ms. Lo Wan Man and Mr. Zou Heqiang, an independent non-executive Director, has confirmed his/her independence with reference to the factors set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. The Nomination Committee has reviewed the structure and composition of the Board, the confirmations and disclosures given by the Directors, the qualifications, skills and experience, time commitment and contribution of the retiring Directors with reference to the nomination principles and criteria set out in the Company's Board Diversity Policy and Director Nomination Policy and the Company's corporate strategy, and the independence of all independent non-executive Directors. The Nomination Committee, in particular, assessed Mr. Ong King Keung, Ms. Lo Wan Man and Mr. Zou Heqiang, the independent non-executive Directors who are due to retire at the Annual General Meeting, their individual attributes enhancing the Board's diversity and optimal composition (details as set out in their respective biographies in Appendix I hereto) and recommended to the Board on reelection of all the retiring Directors including the aforesaid independent non-executive Directors. The Company considers that the retiring independent non-executive Directors are independent in accordance with the independence guidelines set out in the Listing Rules and will continue to bring valuable business experience, knowledge and professionalism to the Board for its efficient and effective functioning diversity.

Details of the retiring Directors proposed for re-election at the Annual General Meeting are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

986,619,071 Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date) remains unchanged as at the date of the Annual General Meeting). The Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plan to repurchase any Shares pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate.

An ordinary resolution to extend the Issue Mandate by adding the number of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate will also be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

The following are details of the Directors who will retire and being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

(1) Mr. Tang Andong (唐安東) ("Mr. Tang"), aged 56, was appointed as an executive Director on 31 July 2019.

Mr. Tang has over 30 years of working experience in industrial automation, industrial informatization and energy optimization. He is responsible for leading, undertaking and completing major system integration projects in petrochemical, coal chemical, textile and other fields. Mr. Tang obtained a bachelor's degree in computer science and technology engineering from Tsinghua University.

Mr. Tang has been the chairman of Zhongchao United Energy Technology (Beijing) Co., Ltd. (中超聯合能源科技(北京)有限公司) since 2010 and the chairman of Hongteng Weitong Technology Development Co., Ltd. (鴻騰偉通科技發展有限公司) since 2015. Mr. Tang is one of the beneficial owners of Sailen International IOT Limited ("Sailen IOT"). The Group acquired Green Harmony Limited (翠和有限公司) from Sailen IOT in 2018. Mr. Tang is a director of Hongteng Technology Limited (鴻騰科技有限公司), and the chairman of Beijing Risecomm Communication Technology Company Limited (北京瑞斯康通信技術有限公司) ("Risecomm Beijing Comm") and Beijing Hongteng Weitong Technology Co., Ltd. (北京鴻騰偉通科技有限公司), all of which are the subsidiaries of the Company.

Mr. Tang has entered into a service agreement with the Company for an initial term of three years from 31 July 2019, and the term of the service agreement shall be renewed and extended automatically for successive terms of one year upon expiry of the then current term, until terminated either by Mr. Tang by giving not less than three months' written notice expiring at the end of the initial term of his appointment or any time thereafter to the Company, or by the Company by giving not less than three months' written notice expiring at the first anniversary of the initial term of his appointment or any time thereafter to him. Mr. Tang is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Listing Rules and the Articles of Association. As stated in the service agreement, Mr. Tang is entitled to receive a director's fee of HK\$120,000 per year which is subject to review, and a discretionary bonus which is based on the performance of the Company and of Mr. Tang, determined by the Board or its delegated committee with reference to his duties and responsibilities as well as the prevailing market conditions.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Tang (i) is deemed to be interested in 31,302,500 Shares through Sailen IOT, a corporation of which is owned as to 50% by Mr. Tang, in aggregate representing approximately 3.17% of the total number of issued Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Save as disclosed above, he does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, or substantial or controlling shareholder (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Tang does not hold any position with other members of the Group. He did not hold any directorships in other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years.

(2) Mr. Wang Shiguang (王世光), ("Mr. Wang"), aged 48, is a non-executive Director. He was appointed as a Director in February 2016, and was designated as an executive Director and the chairman of the Board in May 2017. Mr. Wang was reappointed as a non-executive Director at the annual general meeting of the Company held in May 2018 and remains as the chairman of the Board. Mr. Wang was subsequently ceased to be the chairman of the Board and the chairman of the nomination committee with effect from 10 June 2019. He is the spouse of Ms. Chen Junling, the general manager of Risecomm Beijing Comm. Mr. Wang has been the senior vice president of Risecomm Microelectronics (Shenzhen) Co., Ltd., Risecomm (HK) Holding Co. Limited and Risecomm (HK) Technology Co. Limited since April 2015, March 2016 and March 2016, respectively.

Mr. Wang has more than 15 years of experience in electronics and power meter sales and marketing. Prior to joining the Group, Mr. Wang was the chairman of the board and general manager of Beijing Rui Si Kang Electronics Company Limited ("Beijing RSK Electronics"), the Group's previous strategic sales partner, from September 2009 to March 2014 responsible for overall strategic planning and operational management of Beijing RSK Electronics. He acted as the chairman of the board and general manager of Beijing Dragon Electrical Industry and Technology Company Limited (北京龍電基業電氣技術有限公司), a company engaged in, among others, sales of electronics related equipment and components, from May 1999 to September 2009 responsible for overall strategic planning and operational management of the company.

Mr. Wang graduated from Henan University (河南大學) in the PRC with a major in Accounting (correspondence course) in July 1996. Mr. Wang obtained a master's degree in Business Administration (distance learning course) at the Open University of Hong Kong in Hong Kong in June 2016.

Mr. Wang has entered into a letter of appointment with the Company on 25 May 2018 for an initial term of one year renewable automatically for successive term of one year commencing from the next day after the expiry of the current term of his appointment, unless terminated by not less than three months' notice in writing served by either party on the other. Mr. Wang is entitled to receive a director's fee of HK\$120,000 per annum.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Wang is deemed to be interested in 97,527,845 Shares in the Company being held by Ms. Chen Junling, spouse of Mr. Wang, representing approximately 9.89% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Save as

disclosed above, he does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, or substantial or controlling shareholder (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Wang does not hold any position with the other members of the Group. He did not hold any directorships in other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years.

(3) Mr. Zhou, Francis Bingrong (周冰融), ("Mr. Zhou"), aged 35, has been appointed as a non-executive Director with effect from 19 November 2019. Mr. Zhou was an executive director of the Company from 21 August 2018 to 7 January 2019 and was re-designated as a non-executive director of the Company on 8 January 2019. Mr. Zhou subsequently resigned as a non-executive director of the Company on 10 June 2019.

Mr. Zhou was an executive director and the chief executive officer of Madison Holdings Group Limited ("Madison"), a company listed on the GEM board of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 8057) from 7 January 2019 to 3 October 2019 and was an executive director and the deputy chairman of Madison from 17 April 2018 to 24 August 2018. Mr. Zhou was the president of Silk Road Energy Services Group Limited ("Silk Road"), a company listed on the GEM board of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 8250) from 22 January 2018 to 19 December 2018 and was the vice chairman and an executive director of Silk Road from 11 March 2016 to 22 January 2018. In addition, he was the vice chairman and an executive director of Value Convergence Holdings Limited ("Value Convergence"), a company listed on the Main board of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 821), from 22 January 2018 to 16 April 2018. Mr. Zhou also held senior equity research positions with prominent regional and China-based investment banks, such as China International Capital Corporation (Hong Kong) Limited and Daiwa Capital Markets Hong Kong Limited. Mr. Zhou is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Listing Rules and the Articles of Association. As specified in the letter of appointment, Mr. Zhou is entitled to receive a director's fee of HK\$120,000 per annum which is

subject to review by the Board or its delegated committee with reference to his duties and responsibilities as well as the prevailing market conditions. He does not hold other positions with the Company or other members of the Group.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Zhou does not have any interests in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Save as disclosed above, he does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, or substantial or controlling shareholder (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Zhou does not hold any position with the other members of the Group. He did not hold any directorships in other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years.

(4) Mr. Ong King Keung (王競強), ("**Mr. Ong**"), aged 44, was appointed as an independent non-executive Director on 16 May 2017. Mr. Ong is responsible for providing independent judgment and scrutinizing the performance of the Group.

Mr. Ong obtained a bachelor's degree in accountancy from the Hong Kong Polytechnic University and a master's degree in corporate finance from the City University of Hong Kong. He is a member of both the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants. (6) Mr. Zou Heqiang (鄒合強) ("Mr. Zou"), aged 51, has been appointed as the independent non-executive Director on 29 May 2019.

Mr. Zou graduated from Shanghai Medical University in 1991 with major in forensic medicine and obtained a master degree in Law from the Shanghai Academy of Social Sciences in 2005. Mr. Zou holds the qualifications of lawyer and deputy chief physician of general surgery.

After graduating from undergraduate degree, Mr. Zou has been engaged in the clinical work and management of pathology research, general surgery and intensive care, and obtained the title of deputy chief physician of general surgery. He changed to the lawyer industry in 2008 and is currently practicing at Shanghai Yingdong Law Firm, mainly focusing on the medical dispute resolution, system construction in the field of medical safety management and contract disputes. Mr. Zou was appointed as the legal counsel of the Shanghai Jing'an District Health Commission (上海市靜安區衛生健康委員會) and the mediator of the Shanghai Jing'an District Medical Dispute Resolution Committee (上海市靜安區醫患糾紛調解委員會). At the same time, he has been employed as the legal advisor for certain companies and has accumulated extensive experiences in corporate compliance and risk control.

Mr. Zou has entered into an appointment letter with the Company for an initial term of three years commencing from 29 May 2019 unless terminated by either the Company or Mr. Zou giving not less than three months' prior written notice. Mr. Zou is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Listing Rules and the Articles of Association. As stated in the appointment letter, Mr. Zou is entitled to receive a director's fee of HK\$120,000 per annum which is subject to review by the Board or its delegated committee with reference to Mr. Zou's duties and responsibilities as well as the prevailing market conditions. He does not hold other positions with the Company or other members of the Group.

## EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE SHARE REPURCHASE MANDATE

The following is an explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to provide the Shareholders with requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting in relation to the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate.

## 1. SHARE CAPITAL

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution set out in item 4 of the notice of the Annual General Meeting in respect of the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that the existing number of Shares in issue (i.e. a total of 986,619,071 Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date) remains unchanged as at the date of the Annual General Meeting, the Directors would be authorized under the Share Repurchase Mandate to repurchase, during the period in which the Share Repurchase Mandate remains in force, a total of 98,661,907 Shares, representing 10% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of the Annual General Meeting.

## 2. REASONS FOR SHARE REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders.

Repurchase of Shares may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

## 3. FUNDING OF SHARE REPURCHASE

The Company may only apply funds legally available for share repurchase in accordance with its Memorandum and Articles of Association, the laws of the Cayman Islands and/or any other applicable laws, as the case may be.

To the best knowledge of the Company according to the register of substantial shareholders interest kept under section 336 of Part XV of the SFO, as at the Latest Practicable Date, SB Asia Investment Fund II L.P. ("SAIF"), Magical Success Holdings Limited ("Magical Success"), Seashore Fortune Limited ("Seashore Fortune"), Spitzer Fund VI L.P. ("Spitzer") and Software Research Associates, Inc. ("Software Research"), the substantial shareholders of the Company, were beneficially interested in 197,340,537 Shares, 97,527,845 Shares, 93,543,624 Shares, 155,575,000 Shares and 60,000,000 Shares representing approximately 20.00%, 9.89%, 9.48%, 15.77% and 6.08% of the issued share capital of the Company respectively. In the event that the Directors exercise the proposed Share Repurchase Mandate in full, the shareholding of SAIF, Magical Success, Seashore Fortune, Spitzer and Software Research would be increased to approximately 22.22%, 10.98%, 10.53%, 17.52% and 6.76% of the issued share capital of the Company respectively. Accordingly, a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code will not arise as a result of the exercise in full of the Share Repurchase Mandate.

The Directors do not propose to exercise the Share Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, result in the aggregate number of Shares held by the public shareholders falling below the prescribed minimum percentage required by the Stock Exchange.
