SUMMARY OF POWER GENERATION FOR FEBRUARY 2022

This voluntary announcement is made by Beijing Enterprises Clean Energy Group Limited (the "Company", together with its subsidiaries, the "Group") to keep the shareholders and potential investors of the Company informed of the latest business development of the Group.

The board (the "Board") of directors (the "Directors") of the Company announces that, according to the Company's preliminary statistics currently available, the power generation of the Group on a consolidated basis amounted to approximately 322,738 megawatt-hour ("MWh") for February 2022, representing a decrease of approximately 10% compared with the corresponding period of 2021. For the two months ended 28 February 2022 (the "Period"), the aggregate power generation of the Group amounted to approximately 606,011 MWh, representing a decrease of approximately 15.3% compared with the corresponding period of $2021^{(Note)}$.

The operating power generation* of the projects held and/or managed by the Group, the associates and the joint ventures of the Group for February 2022 was approximately 383,693 MWh, representing a decrease of approximately 15% compared with the corresponding period of 2021. For the Period, the aggregate operating power generation of the projects held and/or managed by the Group, the associates and the joint ventures of the Group amounted to approximately 719,504 MWh, representing a decrease of approximately 19.1% compared with the corresponding period of $2021^{(Note)}$.

Note: As at 28 February 2022, the total installed capacity of the photovoltaic power plants and the wind power plants held and/or managed by the Group and in operation reached approximately 3,540 megawatt, representing a slight increase as compared to the corresponding period of last year. For the two months ended 28 February 2021, the solar radiation or the wind resources in the locations where certain of photovoltaic power plant projects and wind power plant projects of the Group was significantly higher than the corresponding periods of the previous years, resulting in a decrease of the aggregate power generation of the Group as at 28 February 2022 compared with the corresponding period of last year.

* The operating power generation included (i) the power generation of the projects held by the Group, the associates and the joint ventures of the Group; and (ii) the power generation of the projects managed by the Group through the provision of entrusted management services.

Among them, details of the power generation of the Group's centralised photovoltaic power plants (including those held by the joint ventures of the Group) and wind power plants are set out as follows:
