GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES, RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS AND NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

INTRODUCTION

The primary purposes of this circular are to provide you with information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM and to give you notice of the AGM. Resolutions to be proposed at the AGM include: (a) ordinary resolutions on the proposed grant of each of the General Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate; and (b) ordinary resolutions relating to the proposed re-election of the Directors.

GRANT OF GENERAL MANDATE, REPURCHASE MANDATE AND EXTENSION MANDATE

At the annual general meeting held on 30 June 2009, the Directors were granted (a) a general unconditional mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares not exceeding 20% of the aggregate

nominal amount of the share capital of the Company then in issue; (b) a general unconditional mandate to repurchase Shares with an aggregate nominal amount not exceeding 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company then in issue; and (c) the power to extend the general mandate mentioned in (a) above by an amount representing the aggregate nominal amount of the Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the mandate to repurchase Shares referred to in (b) above.

On 7 January 2010 and 28 January 2010, the Company entered into the subscription agreements with the subscribers for the subscription of an aggregate 200,000,000 new Shares for an aggregate consideration of HK\$20,600,000 at the subscription price of HK\$0.103 per Share and 165,945,000 new Shares for an aggregate consideration of HK\$17,922,060 at the subscription price of HK\$0.108 per Share respectively. As a result, the Board has fully utilised the general mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares granted at the annual general meeting held on 30 June 2009.

At the extraordinary general meeting held on 26 February 2010, a resolution was passed by the independent Shareholders to grant further general mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to allot, issue and otherwise deal with the Shares up to a maximum of 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue at 26 February 2010. On 25 May 2010, the Board announced that the Company entered into the subscription agreements with the subscribers for the subscription of an aggregate 184,400,000 new Shares for an aggregate consideration of HK\$20,468,400 at the subscription price of HK\$0.111 per Share. The Board estimated the aforesaid subscription will be completed within Jun 2010.

The above general mandates (mentioned in (a), (b) and (c) above) will expire at the conclusion of the AGM. At the AGM, the following resolutions, among other matters, will be proposed:

- (a) to grant the General Mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to allot, issue and otherwise deal with the Shares up to a maximum of 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue on the date of passing of such resolution;
- (b) to grant the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors to enable them to repurchase Shares on the Stock Exchange up to a maximum of 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue on the date of passing of such resolution; and
- (c) to grant the Extension Mandate to the Directors to increase the total number of Shares which may be allotted and issued under the General Mandate by an additional number representing such number of Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate.

The General Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate will expire at the earliest of: (a) the conclusion of the annual general meeting of the Company next following the AGM; (b) the date by which the next annual general meeting is required by the Companies Law or the Articles of Association to be held; or (c) when the authority given to the Directors thereunder is revoked or varied by ordinary resolution(s) of the Shareholders in a general meeting prior to the next annual general meeting of the Company.

The Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plans to allot and issue any new Shares other than such Shares which may fall to be allotted and issued upon the exercise of any options which may be granted under the Share Option Scheme or any scrip dividend scheme which may be approved by the Shareholders.

Under the Listing Rules, the Company is required to give the Shareholders all information which is reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the resolution in respect of the Repurchase Mandate at the AGM. An explanatory statement for such purpose is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

According to Article 108(A) of the Articles of Association, at each annual general meeting, one third of the Directors for the time being, or if their number is not three or a multiple of three, then the number nearest to but not less than one-third, shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director, including those appointed for a specific term, shall be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election. The Company at the general meeting at which a Director retires may fill the vacated office.

According to Article 108(B) of the Articles of Association, the Directors to retire by rotation shall include (so far as necessary to obtain the number required) any Director who wishes to retire and not to offer himself/herself for re-election. Any further Directors so to retire shall be those who have been longest in office since their last re-election or appointment and so that as between persons who became or were last re-elected Directors on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by lot.

The Board currently consists of eight Directors. Pursuant to Article 108(A) of the Articles of Association, Mr. Wong Chau Chi, Mr. Yang Yi, Mr. Chou Tsan-Hsiung and Mr. Wang Wei-Lin will retire at the AGM. Mr. Wong Chau Chi, Mr. Yang Yi, Mr. Chou Tsan-Hsiung and Mr. Wang Wei-Lin will, being eligibles, offer themselves for re-election.

Biographical information of each of proposed to be re-elected at the AGM is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

AGM

Set out on pages 15 to 19 of this circular is a notice convening the AGM at which resolutions will be proposed to approve, among other matters, the following:

- (a) the grant of the General Mandate, Repurchase Mandate and Extension Mandate; and
- (b) the re-election of Directors.

A form of proxy for use at the AGM is enclosed herewith. You are requested to complete and return the accompanying form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon to the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Computershare Hong Kong

Investor Services Limited at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time of the AGM or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjournment thereof should you so wish.

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll. Therefore, all the resolutions put to the vote at the AGM will be taken by way of poll.

After the conclusion of the AGM, an announcement regarding the poll results will be published on the respective website of the Stock Exchange and of the Company in accordance with Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

RECOMMENDATIONS

This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide the Shareholders with all the information reasonably necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to approve the grant of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors.

1. LISTING RULES RELATING TO THE REPURCHASE OF SHARES

The Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listings are on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their securities on the Stock Exchange and any other stock exchange on which securities of the company are listed and such exchange is recognised by the Securities and Futures Commission of Hong Kong subject to certain restrictions. Among such restrictions, the Listing Rules provide that the shares of such company must be fully paid up and all repurchases of shares by such company must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution of shareholders, either by way of a general mandate or by specific approval of a particular transaction.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were a total of 2,680,720,000 Shares in issue.

Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the AGM, the Company will be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 268,072,000 Shares, representing 10% of the aggregate nominal value of the issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date.

3. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases made pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate would be funded out of funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Company's memorandum of association, the Articles of Association, the Companies Law, other applicable laws of the Cayman Islands and the Listing Rules. A listed company may not repurchase its own securities on the Stock Exchange for a consideration other than cash or for settlement otherwise than in accordance with the trading rules of the Stock Exchange. Under the Companies Law, repurchases by the Company may only be made out of the profits of the Company or out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for the purpose, or, if so authorised by the Articles of Association and subject to the provisions of the Companies Law, out of capital. Any premium payable on a redemption or purchase over the par value of the Shares to be purchased must be provided for out of profits of the Company or out of the Company's share premium account, or, if so authorised by the Articles of Association and subject to the provisions of the Companies Law, out of capital.

5. GENERAL

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position as disclosed in the audited financial statement of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2009 in the event that the Repurchase Mandate were to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

7. UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the power of the Company to make repurchases under the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Cayman Islands and in accordance with the regulations set out in the memorandum of association of the Company and the Articles of Association.

8. CONNECTED PERSON

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their associates, have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company under the Repurchase Mandate if the same is approved by the Shareholders.

No connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) has notified the Company that he/she has a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or has undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

9. THE TAKEOVERS CODE AND MINIMUM PUBLIC HOLDING

If on the Company exercising the powers of repurchase pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert (as defined in the Takeovers Code) could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, according to the register kept by the Company pursuant to section 336 of the SFO and so far as is known to, or can be ascertained after reasonable enquiry by the Directors, the following persons were directly or indirectly interested in 5% or more of the issued capital of the Company. Their respective interest as at the Latest Practicable Date is shown under the column "Before purchase" while their respective interest in the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares in accordance with the terms of the ordinary resolutions in relation to the Repurchase Mandate to be proposed at the AGM (and assuming that the issued share capital of the Company remains unchanged up to the date of the AGM) is shown under the column "After purchase".

APPENDIX I EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

To the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors and on the basis of the shareholding of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date as shown above, the Directors are currently not aware of any consequences which will arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any purchase made under the Repurchase Mandate, since none of the persons named in the table above would hold 30% or more of the shareholding of the Company after repurchase.

The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that will result in the number of Shares in hands of public falling below the prescribed minimum percentage of 25%.

10. SHARE PURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company has not repurchased any of the Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the six months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

The biographical details of the Director eligible for re-election at the AGM are set out below:

Executive Director

Mr. WONG Chau Chi ("Mr. Wong"), aged 45, was appointed as an executive Director in May 2007. Mr. Wong is currently the chief executive officer of the Company and the Chairman of the Board (the "Chairman"). Mr. Wong is responsible for the overall business development operation strategy of the Group. Mr. Wong has extensive experience in the financial and business industry for 19 years. Previously, he has worked at Goldman Sachs, Citibank Group, BNP Paribas, McKinsey & Co, and GE in areas such as restructuring, derivatives, advisory, and financial management. Mr. Wong also serves as a director of Chi Capital Holdings Limited, a financial and investment advisory company in Hong Kong specialized in merger and acquisition and private equity. Mr. Wong had not held any position nor directorship in other listed companies in the three years preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

Mr. Wong has entered into a service agreement with the Company on 24 April 2007 for an initial fixed term of one year commencing from 1 May 2007 renewable automatically for successive terms of one year (or such other period as may be agreed) each commencing from the day next after the expiry of the then current term of his appointment until terminated by not less than three months' notice in writing served by either party expiring at the end of the current term or at any time thereafter. Mr. Wong is entitled to a remuneration of HK\$110,000 per month as executive Director, chief executive officer and chairman of the Company and he may be also entitled to a discretionary management bonus under the service agreement at sole discretion of the Board. The remunerations of Mr. Wong have been determined with reference to the responsibilities and duties assumed by him.

Pursuant to Part XV of the SFO, Mr. Wong was deemed to be interested in 110,487,500 Shares, representing approximately 4.12% of the total issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date. These Shares are registered under the name of Chi Capital Holdings Limited, a company wholly owned by Mr. Wong. In addition, the Company granted to Mr. Wong the Options which shall entitle Mr. Wong to subscribe for 26,750,000 Shares (representing approximately 1.00% of the total number of the issued share capital of the Company) under the Share Option Scheme. 10,000,000 Options shall be exercisable by Mr. Wong at any time during the period from 5 November 2009 to 4 November 2012 and 16,750,000 Options shall be exercisable by Mr. Wong at any time during the period from 23 February 2010 to 22 February 2013. Except for the above, Mr. Wong was not interested in any Shares, within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Mr. Wong does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company as defined in the Listing Rules.

Save as disclosed above, there is no information which is required to be disclosed under the Rules 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters relating to the re-election of Mr. Wong that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Non-executive Directors

Mr. YANG Yi ("Mr. Yang"), aged 46, was appointed as a non-executive Director in February 2007. Mr. Yang first graduated from the Beijing University with a Bachelor Degree of Art in

International Politics in 1987 and was awarded a scholar of Japanese Education Ministry by the Tokyo University in the same year. In 1991, Mr. Yang was awarded a master degree of Art in Law & Diplomacy by Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, jointly administrated by Tufts University and Harvard University. Mr. Yang has about 22 years of experience in finance and human resources management. The major appointments and positions previously assumed by Mr. Yang include a financial analyst at the fixed income division of J.P. Morgan Securities (Tokyo), the vice president of the human capital management of Goldman Sachs LLP (New York), the principal of executive search in the financial industry of Korn/Ferry International (Hong Kong) and a managing director of A.T. Kearney Management Consultancy (Hong Kong). At present, Mr. Yang is the director and founder of G Bridge Limited, Hong Kong based human resources advisory firm. Mr. Yang had not held any position nor directorship in other listed companies in the three years preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

A letter of appointment has been entered into between the Company and Mr. Yang in respect of his appointment as a non-executive Director. Mr. Yang shall hold office as a non-executive Director for a term of one year commencing on 1 February 2007 and shall be renewable automatically for successive term of one year each commencing from the next day after the expiry of the then current term of his appointment until terminated by not less than months' notice in writing served by either Mr. Yang or the Company expiring at the end of the current term or at any time thereafter. Remuneration of Mr. Yang will be determined by the Board with reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company granted to Mr. Yang the Options which shall entitle Mr. Yang to subscribe for 20,000,000 Shares (representing approximately 0.75% of the total number of the issued share capital of the Company) under the Share Option Scheme. 15,000,000 Options shall be exercisable by Mr. Yang at any time during the period from 5 November 2009 to 4 November 2012 and 5,000,000 Options shall be exercisable by Mr. Yang at any time during the period from 24 November 2009 to 23 November 2010. Except for the above, Mr. Yang was not interested in any Shares, within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Mr. Yang does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company as defined in the Listing Rules.

Save as disclosed above, there is no information which is required to be disclosed under the Rules 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters relating to the re-election of Mr. Yang that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Mr. CHOU Tsan-Hsiung ("Mr. Chou"), aged 67, was appointed as an independent non-executive Director in June 2005 and was subsequently re-designated as a non-executive Director in September 2005. Mr. Chou graduated with a bachelor degree in Laws from the National Chengchi University and is a member of Taipei Bar Association. Mr. Chou is currently a practicing lawyer in the Best Truth Law Firm in Taiwan. Mr. Chou previously worked in the Legal Affairs Office of the Central Trust of China.
