Transport International Holdings Limited Won Gold in 2011 Best Corporate Governance Disclosure Awards

Transport International Holdings Limited (TIH)'s 2010 Annual Report won the Gold Award in the Non-Hang Seng Index (Large Market Capitalisation) category of the 2011 Best Corporate Governance Disclosure Awards organised by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

The Best Corporate Governance Disclosure Awards were established by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants in 2000. The Awards aim at acknowledging companies and organisations that exemplify the best corporate governance standards in Hong Kong, as reflected in their annual reports, as well as raising awareness of the benefits of greater transparency and accountability to stakeholders. The Awards are Hong Kong's most prestigious awards for corporate governance. This year, more than 230 annual reports were reviewed.
