INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to: (i) the re-election of two Directors who shall retire from office by rotation at the AGM; and (ii) the proposed Issue Mandate and the proposed Repurchase Mandate. The notice of AGM is also set out on pages 13 to 16 of this circular.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Pursuant to Bye-Law 84, at each annual general meeting of the Company, one-third of the relevant number of Directors (or, if their number is not a multiple of three, the number nearest to but not greater than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation in each year. As such, Messrs. Ho Kam Hung and Tam Kong, Lawrence shall retire from office by rotation and, being eligible, have offered themselves for re-election at the AGM. Subject to the Shareholders' approval at the AGM, Messrs. Ho Kam Hung and Tam Kong, Lawrence will retain as Executive Director and independent non-executive Director respectively.

At the AGM, separate ordinary resolutions will be proposed for re-election of Messrs. Ho Kam Hung and Tam Kong, Lawrence as Directors.

Details of the two Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

Mr. Tam Kong, Lawrence, has served as an independent non-executive Director on the Board for more than nine years since December 2005, and hence his independence is subject to review pursuant to Code A.4.3 of Appendix 14 to the Listing Rules. Mr. Tam has met the independence guidelines as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules from time to time and has provided to the Company his annual confirmation of independence in respect of the year ended 31 December 2017 pursuant thereto. During his years of service with the Company as independent non-executive Director, Mr. Tam has contributions to the Board by providing independent views, enquiries and advices to the Company in relation to its business, operations, future development and strategy. The Board considers that Mr. Tam has the character, integrity, ability and experience to continue to fulfill his role as required effectively. There is no evidence that Mr. Tam's over nine years of service with the Company would have any impact on his independence which, on the contrary, is a valuable asset to the Company, The Board thus recommends and offers Mr. Tam for re-election as a Director at the AGM. Details of Mr. Tam's particulars are stated in Appendix I to this circular.

RENEWAL OF GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

An ordinary resolution will be proposed at the AGM to give the Directors a general and unconditional mandate to allot, issue and deal with new Shares with an aggregate nominal amount not exceeding 20% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the resolution until the earlier of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company following the passing of the resolution; and (ii) the date on which the ordinary resolution is revoked or varied by the Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company.

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 26 May 2017, the Directors were granted a general mandate to allot, issue and deal with new Shares up to 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of such meeting. As at the date of the aforesaid annual general meeting, 605,616,520 Shares were in issue and accordingly, a maximum of 121,123,304 Shares could be issued under the previous general mandate. Pursuant to the disclosure requirements stipulated by the Listing Rules, details of particulars of the Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out below:

Executive Director

Ho Kam Hung, aged 62, has been appointed as the Managing Director of the Company since October 1997 and is the sole executive director on the board of the Company. He is also members of the Nomination Committee and the Remuneration Committee of the Company. Mr. Ho has over 20 years' experience in property investment and development, manufacturing and multinational trading and investments in Mainland China and Hong Kong. Mr. Ho has been enthusiastic in community services in Mainland China and is currently the Standing Committee of Guangdong Federation of Industry & Commerce (廣東省工商業聯合會(總商會)), as well as the vice presidents of Guangdong International Overseas Chinese Chamber of Commerce (廣東國際華商會) and Guangdong Chamber of Foreign Investors (廣東外商公會).

Mr. Ho did not hold any directorship in any other listed companies in the last three years. As at the Latest Practicable Date, he is the beneficial owner of Morcambe Corporation which holds 10,800,000 Shares, and is interested in 33 $\frac{1}{3}$ % interest in EC Fair Limited which holds 87,120,000 Shares, and is also interested in approximately 31.6% interest in High Rank Enterprises Limited which holds 12,680,000 Shares. Mr. Ho is a brother of Mr. Ho Pak Hung and Mr. Ho Tsam Hung, the substantial shareholders of the Company.

There was no service contract entered into between the Company and Mr. Ho in the past years. Mr. Ho received a director's fees of HK\$2,400,000 per annum for the year ended 31 December 2017. Subject to the shareholders' approval at the AGM, the Remuneration Committee proposed the base fees payable to Mr. Ho for 2018 will be remained as HK\$2,400,000 per annum.

Save for the matters disclosed above, there is no information that is required to be disclosed pursuant to Rules 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules, and there are no other matters that need to be brought to the Shareholders' attention regarding his election.

Independent Non-Executive Director

Tam Kong, Lawrence, aged 73, is an independent non-executive Director. He is also members of the Audit Committee and Nomination Committee of the Company, and the Chairman of the Remuneration Committee of the Company. Mr. Tam is a seasoned banking and finance professional. He is a member of The Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators, the United Kingdom, and holds a Post Graduate Diploma in Management Studies from the University of Hong Kong and completed the Pacific Rim Bankers Program at the University of Washington, Seattle, the United States of America.

Mr. Tam did not hold any directorships in any other listed companies in the last three years. He does not have any relationship with any substantial shareholder, director or senior management of the Company or any of its subsidiaries. As at the Latest Practicable Date, he does not have any interest in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

The term of office of Mr. Tam has been renewed for a term of one year up to 14 December 2018 subject to earlier determination or retirement by rotation and re-election at the AGM in accordance with the provisions of the Bye-Laws. There was no service contract entered into between the Company and Mr. Tam in the past years. At present, Mr. Tam is entitled to receive a fee of HK\$165,600 per annum, with reference to his experience, qualifications and duties to the Company.

Save for the matters disclosed above, there is no information that is required to be disclosed pursuant to Rules 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules, and there are no other matters that need to be brought to the Shareholders' attention regarding his election.

This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide further information in relation to the Repurchase Mandate for your consideration.

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were 605,616,520 Shares in issue.

On the assumption that there will be no variation in the issued Shares prior to the date of the AGM, the Company would be allowed to repurchase up to a maximum of 60,561,652 Shares.

REASONS FOR THE REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that it is in the interests of the Company and its Shareholders to have general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Directors to repurchase Shares on the Stock Exchange. Such repurchase may, depending on marketing conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share of the Company and/or its earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchase will benefit the Company and its Shareholders as a whole.

FUNDING OF THE REPURCHASE

It is proposed that the repurchase of Shares under the Repurchase Mandate would be financed from available cash flow or working capital facilities of the Company and its subsidiaries. In repurchasing the Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its memorandum, Bye-Laws and the laws of Bermuda. - (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; or
- (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Memorandum and Bye-Laws of the Company or any applicable law of Bermuda to be held; or
- (iii) the revocation or variation of the authority given under this resolution by an ordinary resolution of the shareholders of the Company in general meeting.
